\*Students in the B.A./M.S. Information Science program complete a minor in information science with the following requirements: CSI 101 or 201 or ITM 215; IST 523; IST 601, IST 602, and two additional IST courses at 500 level or above. B.A./M.S. or B.S./M.S. students then complete their M.S. degree with thirty credits of graduate level work in additional core, concentration and elective courses as advised.
