## EXPLANATION AND SCORING AND BOUT TERMINOLOGY

Championship bouts are eight minutes long, divided into three periods -- first period 2 minutes, second and third periods 3 minutes. In tournaments, overtime consists of three 1 minute periods. Consolation bouts consist of three 2 minute periods.

The first period of each bout will start from a standing position. Second and third periods begin on the mat in the referee's position, contestants alternating in the positions of advantage each period.

A FALL is decided when either wrestler has held his opponent's shoulders to the mat for one second. This terminates the match.

A DECISION is awarded to the contestant who scores the greater number of points in a bout where no fall occurs. If there is a tie the contestants shall wrestle three extra periods of one minute each (consolation matches included), starting the first of these periods on the feet and conducting the entire overtime as in the regular match. In the event of a tie after completion of the overtime periods, a jury of two judges and the referee shall select the winner by ballot.

### MATCH SCORING POINT SYSTEM

TAKEDOWNS - Taking opponent to mat with advantage ..... 2 points  
ESCAPE - Defensive wrestler attaining a neutral position ..... 1 points  
REVERSAL - Defensive wrestler comes from underneath and gains control of his opponent ..... 2 points  
PREDICAMENT - When both shoulders of the defensive wrestler are held within four inches of the mat or less for one full second or when one shoulder of the defensive wrestler is touching the mat, and the other shoulder is held at an angle of 45 degrees or less with the mat ..... 2 points  
NEAR FALL - A near fall is when the criteria for a predicament has been met uninterrupted for five seconds ..... 3 points

TIME ADVANTAGE - The offensive wrestler who has control in an advantage position over his opponent is gaining time-advantage. A timekeeper assigned to each wrestler records his accumulated time-advantage throughout the whole match or a multiple timer may be permitted to record the time-advantage. At the end of the match the referee subtracts the lesser time-advantages from the greater. If the contestant with the greater time advantage has less than one minute of net time-advantage, no point is awarded. If he has one full minute or more of net time-advantage, he is awarded one point by the referee. The contestant with the lesser time-advantage receives no points even though he accumulates several minutes of time in the advantage position.

FORFEIT - A forfeit is received by a wrestler when his opponent for any reason fails to appear for the match. In order to receive a forfeit, a wrestler must be dressed and appear on the mat.

DEFAULT - A default is awarded in a match when one of the wrestlers is unable to continue wrestling due to an injury.

DISQUALIFICATION - Disqualification is a situation in which a contestant is banned from further participation in accordance with prescribed penalties.

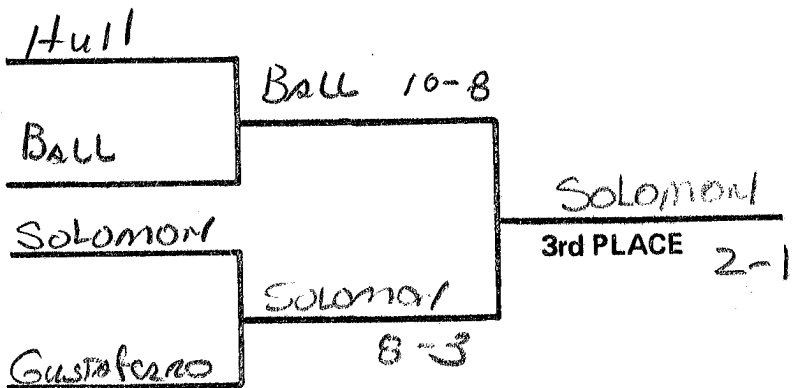
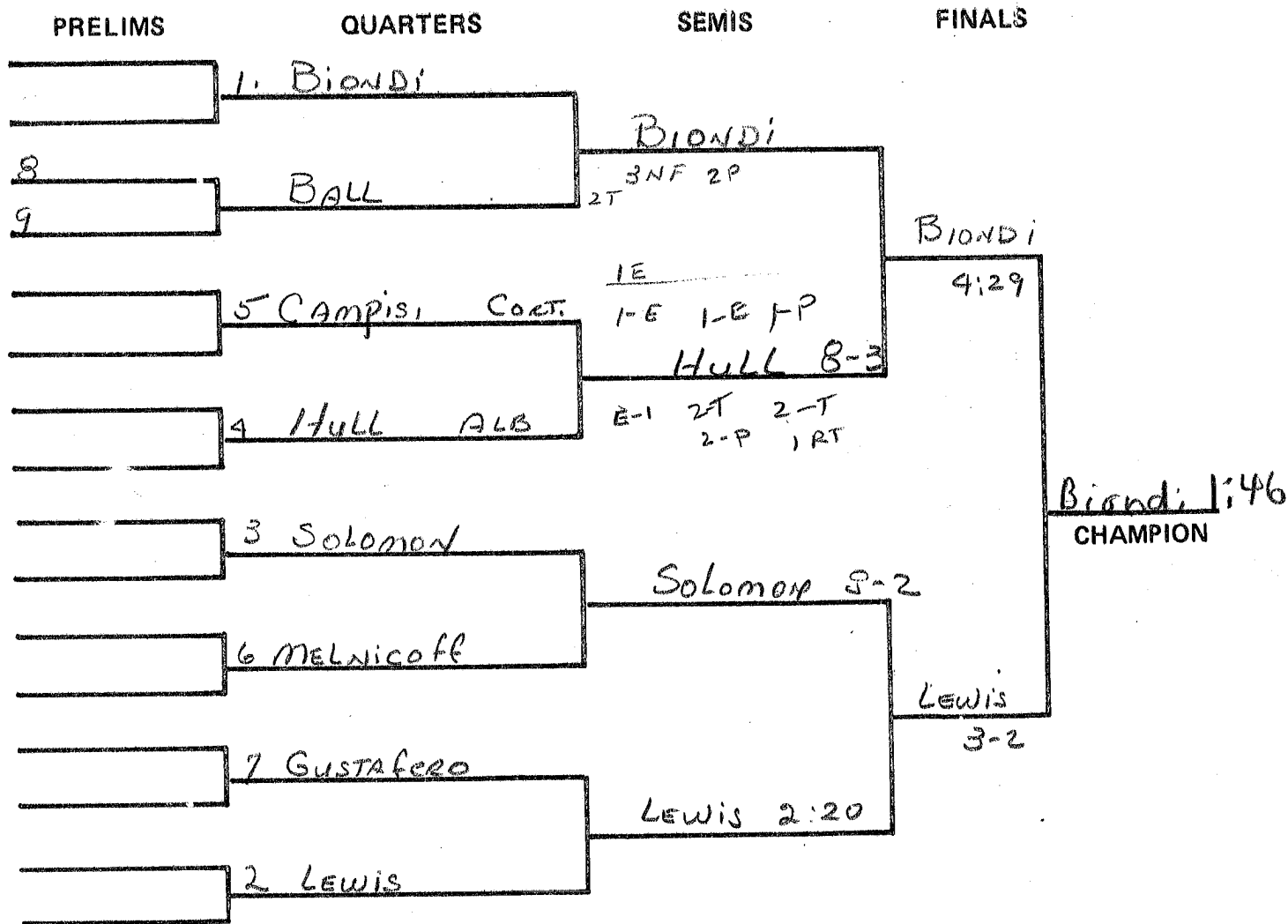
In the National Collegiate championships six places are awarded. The defeated wrestlers in the consolation semifinals shall wrestle off for the fifth and sixth places.

The loser in the final match automatically win second place.

Wrestlers must wrestle at all times. Penalties are awarded by the referee under the point system for stalling, illegal holds and technical violations.

GENERAL INFORMATION AND MAINTENANCE GUIDE LINES FOR SECTION II WRESTLING  
TOURNAMENT ON MARCH 4, 1972.

1. Friday, March 3rd., bring down one set of mats to the main hall-  
way from the wrestling room plus an extra strip for safety. Saturday,  
March 4th., at 9 a.m., move the mats into the main gym. Line up the mats  
as each section is moved into the gym.

2. Remove circular mat from the storage area to the gym (same as  
above).

3. Make sure the mats are properly aligned on the floor (see the  
diagram).

4. Gold color should be up on both mats.

5. Mop and remove old tape residue. Tape mats together.

6. Number the mats as shown on the diagram with tape, using Roman  
Numerals.

7. Set up the table and four chairs for each mat. (See diagram)  
Panel Board for each mat and microphone for center table.

8. Set up chairs at each corner of both mats.

9. Set up control standards and ropes.

10. Place the green runners for floor traffic control.

11. Set up the two scoreboards. Try to hide the wires and extension  
cords as much as possible.

12. Place plastic bucket and kleenex by each mat.

13. Roll out the bleachers from "C" gym.

14. Put down warmup mats on east side of the gym. Two 5 X 10's for  
each side.

15. Roll out "A" gym bleachers.
16. Set up ticket drops and turnstiles as for basketball games.
17. Turn off the elevator. Close doors to other stations in the gymnasium.

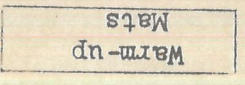
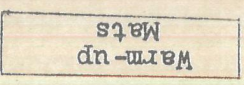
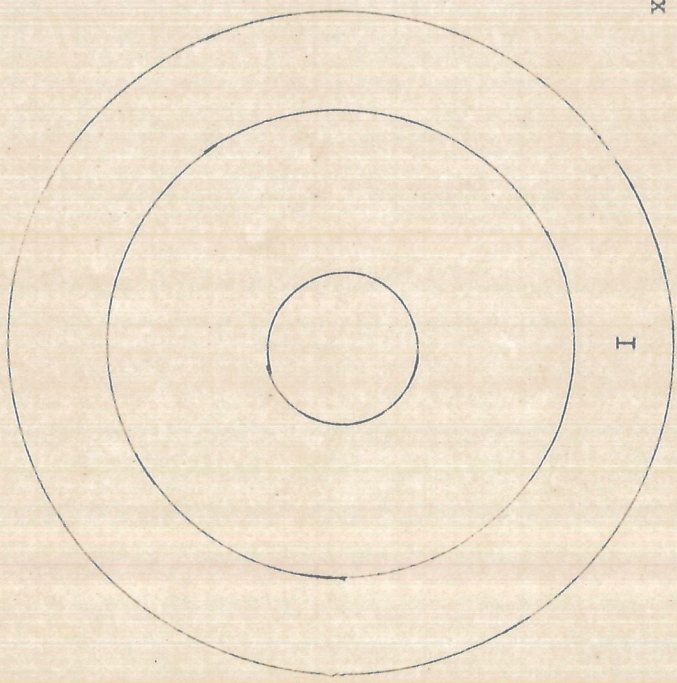
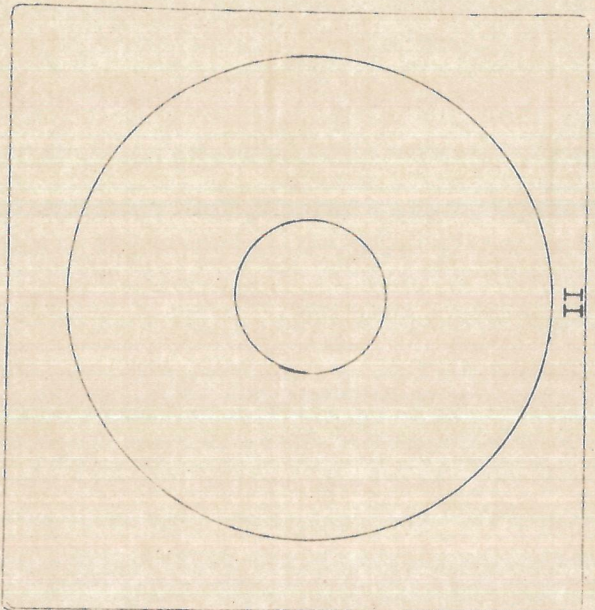
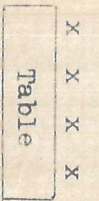
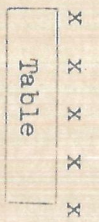
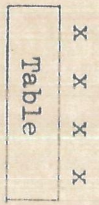
1. After the semi-final bouts, remove mat # II. Roll and tie.

Brothers Phil and Larry Mims of Utica will represent State University at Albany in the NCAA College Division Wrestling Championships this weekend at Oswego. Competition is scheduled Friday and Saturday at the State University College athletic facilities.

Phil, a junior co-captain who posted an 11-2 record in the 158 pound weight class this season, will drop down to 150 lbs. for the NCAA's. Larry, a sophomore, had the team's best record, 12-1-1 at 142 lbs. He will go at 134 in the tourney, providing an ankle injury suffered in last weekend's SUNY Conference Championships has healed. Both Phil and Larry are graduates of Utica Free Academy, where they competed in wrestling and track.

Albany finished a "disappointing seventh," according to coach Joe Garcia, in the conference meet. The highest place achieved by an Albany wrestler was fourth, reached by Phil Mims, 158; Tom Horn (Latham), 167; and Doug Bauer (Hammondsport), 177. Larry Mims had to default in his first match when he hurt his ankle. Brockport easily outpointed the nine-team field for the team title.

Besides Larry Mims, leading records on the 1971-72 Albany squad were attained by Tom Hull (Albany), 10-2 at 118 lbs.; Larry Frederick (Ilion) 9-6 at 134; Jeff Albrecht (Endwell), 7-2 at 150; Phil Mims, 11-2 at 158; and Bauer, 8-6 at 177.

The Great Danes finished their regular season at 5-5-1, thus posting back-to-back .500 or better records for the first time in 10 years. They were 9-2 last winter.

Jeff suffered a broken leg in intramural football this past fall, and was forced to miss the first three matches of the wrestling season. However, he is now back in the regular lineup, and has almost regained the form which enabled him to post a personal record of 9-3 last year.

Thus far this year he possesses an individual record of 7-2.

The little sophomore is a 1970 graduate of Albany Academy, where he participated in wrestling, cross country, and track. Tom is the son of Mr. Louis Hull, 82 Central Avenue, Rensselaer.

Larry Mims is a member of the State University of New York at Albany's varsity wrestling team.

Thus far in this, his first season of intercollegiate wrestling, Larry has been extremely strong at 142 pounds. He has an individual record of 9-1-1, including half a dozen pins, and is certainly the best new addition to Coach Joe Garcia's Great Danes.

Joe Garcia, Albany's wrestling coach, asked me to send you some data on the team for the SUNYAC Championships you will be hosting. The enclosed information may be incorporated in the program I understand you are preparing.

At this date, Albany's dual record is 4-3-1. The Great Danes have defeated Plattsburgh (45-8), Marist (39-9), Williams (42-12), and RPI (46-3). Losses have been to Fairleigh Dickinson--Teaneck (33-18), C.W. Post (29-13), and Binghamton (24-15). The tie was with the University of Rochester (16-16), which broke a 10-match Albany winning streak that included the last nine of the previous season.

Remaining matches are against Union and Amherst, February 12; Oneonta, February 16; and New Paltz, February 23. This is Mr. Garcia's 17th year as coach of wrestling, a sport he organized at the university in 1955. Last season's 9-2 record was the best in Albany history.

Top individual wrestlers this year are Tom Hull, 7-2 at 118 pounds, including the fastest pin of the year, 20 seconds against RPI; Larry Frederick, 8-3 with six pins at 134 pounds; Larry Mims, 9-1-1 with six pins at 142 pounds; co-captain Jeff Albrecht, 5-1 at 150 pounds, after recovering from a pre-season broken leg; co-captain Phil Mims, 9-2 at 158 pounds; and Doug Bauer, 7-4 at 177 pounds.

ALBANY TAKES 14-4 MARK ON THE ROAD

The State University at Albany basketball team, unbeaten in 11 home games this season, but only 3-4 on the road, must travel to Utica Wednesday and Cortland Saturday this week. The Great Danes are 14-4 after defeating Hamilton, 83-70, and Siena, 72-56, last week to run their two-year home court winning streak to 18 games.

Bob Rossi (Schenectady) scored a career-high 21 points to lead the victory over the Indians and even the series against Albany's arch-rivals for the first time at 14-14. The Danes, who have won nine of the last 11 meetings, shot 51% from the field and didn't allow Siena a double-figure scorer. The game ended with 1:23 remaining, when a fight broke out in the stands and threatened to spill over onto the court. No players were involved.

Captain John Quattrocchi (Fort Edward) led the way with 19 points against Hamilton and Rossi added 17, as Albany pulled away from a two-point halftime advantage with a 12-0 spurt at the outset of the second half.

The Danes, ranked fourth in this week's New York State Sportswriters Association poll, are battling for a berth in the NCAA East Regional College Division Tournament. The SUNY Conference champion will gain an automatic bid, but Brockport (7-0 in the league) appears to have that spot wrapped up, assuming the eligibility of its star, Norman Bounds, is settled favorably. Albany 6-2 in SUNYAC play, is hoping for an at-large invitation.

Quattrocchi continues to lead the team in scoring (16.1), assists (7.1), and free throw accuracy (84.2%). Byron Miller (Gloversville) is the rebound leader

(123) and is the only other double figure scorer at 12.9. Quattrocchi needs just 10 points to become the ninth man to score 300 points at Albany in two or more seasons. The team's nationally-ranked defensive average has dipped to 63.8.

#### UTICA

The Pioneers have their best team in several years, boasting an 8-5 record after Saturday's 93-83 win over Hobart. Coach Joe Rosado has four men averaging double figures, led by 6-2 senior Doug Knapp at 17.7. Others are 6-4 junior Dave Owen, 16.4; 6-0 senior Arnie Westervelt, 14.3; and 6-0 junior Marty Shiel, 10.3. The fifth starter is 6-6 senior Gary Sniezyk, second leading rebounder behind Owen's 11 per game.

Albany holds a 30-14 edge in the series, which started in 1947-48. The Great Danes won last year's encounter in Albany, 84-62, and haven't lost to the Pioneers in 19 games dating back to 1959-60. The game will be played in Utica's recently-opened physical education building.

#### CORTLAND

Cortland lost to Geneseo Saturday, 80-74, leaving the Red Dragons with a 4-9 mark, including 2-4 in SUNYAC play. Coach Al Stockholm's club is dangerous, however, as evidenced by a close 81-75 loss to Ithaca (a 20-point victor over Albany). The return of veteran guard Bob Antin, who joined the team at mid-season, has strengthened the Dragons.

Leading Cortland scorer is 6-4 sophomore John Jackson, averaging 17 points a game. Six-two senior Dave Pitonzo is next at 14. Other starters are Antin, 5-7 Mike Marsallo, and 6-4 Dwight Rees. Albany beat Cortland last year at home, 78-63, and leads the 47-year old series, 9-7. Two years ago at Cortland, the Dragons upset the Danes in overtime, 72-70.
