S.S.D. also referred to is hereby confirmed, and that his salary shall be twenty one hundred dollars with the dwelling house provided in the school building for the Principal and necessary fuel and gas.

Dr Alden submitted a revised course of study and organization of the normal department of the school, which having been read and discussed was adopted and ordered to be printed under the direction of the chairman in such form as he shall deem proper.

Dr Alden also submitted a paper in regard to the desirability of better provision for the housing of the female pupils, which was laid on the table for future consideration.

It was ordered that the title of Principal of the Normal School be changed to that of President.

The committee then adjourned.
