Resolved that the informal appointment of the Rev Joseph Alden D.D. L.L.D. also referred to is hereby confirmed, and that his salary shall be twenty one hundred dollars with the dwelling house provided in the school building for the Principal and necessary fuel and gas.

Dr Alden submitted a second course of study and organization of the several departments of the school, which having been read and discussed was adopted and ordered to be printed under the direction of the chairman in such form as he shall deem proper.

Dr Alden also submitted a paper in regard to the desirable sum of better provision for the boarding of the female pupils, which was laid on the table for future consideration.

It was ordered that the title of Principal of the Normal School be changed to that of President.

The committee then adjourned.
