The Athletic Council shall consist of seven voting members and exofficio members as herein-after described. The voting members are two named by the President of the College from the faculty, each to serve a term of two years, the member older in point of service acting as Chairman of the Council and retiring from office in the odd calendar years; and five students; two each from the Senior and Junior classes and one from the Sophomore class, to be elected by the members of each class. The exofficio members are the Coach of Athletics and the manager of the sport or sports for the current season.

## II

The exofficio members have the right of debate but do not have the right to vote.

## III

Upon his appointment and at the first meeting of each scholastic year thereafter the Chairman shall nominate an official Secretary to the Athletic Council whose duty it will be to keep a complete record of all official discussions and votes of the Council meetings, regular and special. The Secretary to the Athletic Council shall not have the right to vote nor the privilege of debate.

## IV

The Athletic Council shall have regular monthly meetings from October to June inclusive.

## V

The meetings of the Athletic Council are open to any member of the student body, faculty or alumni of New York State College for Teachers but only those who are members of the Council may debate.

## VI

All communications to the Council by any person, persons, or organization must be made in writing and deposited with the Secretary to the Council. Such communication will be read by the Secretary at the next meeting of the council after presentation and will be debated at the next meeting after a formal reading.

## VII

All official decisions of the Athletic Council shall be made by a majority of those present, providing at least four voting members are in attendance.

## VIII

The Athletic Council shall have full, final and complete supervisi on of athletics for men.
IX

The Athletic Council shall instruct the manager of any sport as to the teams to be scheduled and such instruction shall be final.

The Athletic Council shall have comple te control over athletic expenditures and may at any time call for an audit of all expenditures and income of any nature whatsoever.

## XI

The Athletic Council shall have full power to increase or contract the athletic program when it is for the best interests of the Student Association to do so.

The Athletic Council shall elect managers for the several sports from names submitted by the Coach of that Sport. Such election shall be final and such a manager can not be removed from office except for đishonesty, poor sportsmanship or general incompetency proven before a Court consisting of the voting members of the Council presided over by the Chairman.

## XIII

The Athletic Council shall make suitable awards for meritorious service in inter-collegiate competition. Such awards shall be made to individuals recommended by the coach.

## XIV

The Athletic Council shall determine all awards that are to be made.

## XV

The Athletic Counsil shall advise the Coach in matters pertaining to elegibility of players and regarding general athletic policies. The Coach shall hqve full authority in methods, style of play, player selection and assignment.

## XVI

The Athletic Council can not question the recommendations for award made by the Coach. The vote on such awards is to be made without debate.

## XVII

Questions of athletic policy which may arise when the Athletic Council is not in session shall be decided by the Coach, who will, if possible, consult the Chairman of the Council before making a deci sion.

## XVIII

After acting in the name of the Athletic Council the Coach so acting will make a memorandum of such action at once and forward such correspondence to the Secretary to the Council who will draft it into a report to be presented at the next regular meeting of the Council.

## XIX

If the Coach of any sport, the manager of any sport, the Chairman of the Athletic Council or any other person acting for the Council in critical moments shall make decisions unwelcome to the Council, the Council will at once draft a formal resolution of censure which will be forwarded to the President of the Student Association for a public reading and will be published in the State College News.

## XX

The Coach of a Team may summon a special meeting of the Athletic Council to decide particular crises but to consider no other problems.

## XXI

The omission to mention special exigencies of an athletic nature does not mean that the The Athletic Council does not have full and complete control.

## XXII

All regulations of the Athletic Council made in conformity with this Constitution are perpetual unless formally withdrawn by the Council in regular meeting and by regular vote according to the Constitution. After such withdrawal the Secretary will correct the record.

I. Paculty: Three, including the Physical Director for Men, appointed annualiy in September by President of the College.

Full privilege of supervision, debate and vote.
II. Alumni: Two, one of whom shall also be a member of the Faculty and shall be treasurer of the Athletic Association. Appointed annually in September by the President of the College. (Mr. Hidley recommended as Treasurer 1916) Full privilege of supervision, debate and vote.
III. Undergraduates: Three, elected annually in September by the whole student body, one from each of the three upper classes. Full privilege of debate and vote. Managers of the college athletic teams may be present at Advisory Board meetings only to present business connected with the sepomt they manage; they have no vote. They shall render to the Board a financial seport following each contest. The manager must trurn over to the Treasurer all money after each gane.
B. Dutles of the Athletic Advisory Board.

The Boand shall have full charge of the athletic affairs of the college, shall determine schedule, direct managers who act only under their supervision, confirm the election of managers by the student body - non confimmation demands another electionmanage finance through the Treasurer, select coaches, determine questions of amateur status, interpret scholarship requirements. In all matters in which the Athletic Advisory Board is concerned there resides an ultimate appeal to the Faculty Council.
