Lazarus Bloedel, & appreciating as they do, in the highest degree, his eminent services as a most devoted friend of Popular Education, & an active & efficient member of this Board, sympathize most deeply with his bereaved friends & the community at large, in this afflictive dispensation of Providence.

**Resolved**

That in testimony of their respect for the character & services of the deceased, they will attend his funeral, & that a copy of these resolutions be transmitted to his widow, entered upon the records of the Committee, & published in the city papers.
