The President Dr. Alden,

The President made a statement of the condition
of the school and its prospects for the next term.
The attendance of pupils during the term about
to close has been very large and the seating
capacity of the study room.

With the approval of the members of the com-
mittee Miss Grace McParnell had been employ-
ed as an assistant at a compensation of two hun-
dred dollars for the term. This was by reason of
the large number of scholars and of the
illness of Miss Alden and of Miss McClelland.
The same was approved, and also the payment
of the salaries of Miss Alden & Miss McClel-
land. Dr. Alden was opinion that the services
of Miss Parnell would not be required during
the next term which was also agreed to.

On the recommendation of the President,
Mr. W. S. Jones who had for several years
been a teacher of Mathematics, was appointed

"Adjunct Professor of Mathematics,"

and Mr. J. S. St. John who has for more
than a year been teacher of the Natural Sci-
ences, was appointed "Professor of the Natural
Sciences." Mr. C. W. Allen who has for many
years been Superintendent of the Model School,
was appointed "Professor of School Economy."

The draft of the Annual Report to the Super-
intendent of Public Instruction & the Report of
Finance was submitted for approval.
