FPC Earns Bizarre Sweep Over UAlbany

Wilson, Smith Lead the Way For Ravens' Fourth Straight Win

RINDGE, NH (Apr. 30, 1997) - Junior Henry Wilson (Gilsum, NH/Monadnock Regional) went 4-for-7 with three runs batted in and six runs scored while junior Jim Smith also hit 4-for-7 with six runs and four RBI to lead the Franklin Pierce College baseball team in a bizarre sweep over the University of Albany Wednesday, 17-16 and 9-4, in a New England Collegiate Conference (NECC) doubleheader.

In the opener, sophomore Marc Mott cracked a double to score junior Jon Cipollina in the bottom of the 11th inning to clinch the victory. The Ravens led 13-11 entering the ninth inning when Albany erupted for five runs. Freshman Mike Oliva's double scored freshman Chris Robilotti to cut the lead to 13-12. Freshman Jon Jacobsen belted a two-run single to give the Great Danes a 14-13 edge. Senior Jamie Lent then roped a two-run triple to grab a 16-13 lead.

Cipollina opened the bottom of the ninth inning with a single and advanced to second on an error. Smith then betted a single as did Mott to put runners on first and second. Senior Brett Jasinsky grounded into a fielder's choice, but advanced to second on a throwing error, while Smith scored. The Ravens knotted the score 16-16 when senior Anthony Jardim's single scored freshman Ryan Scanlon, who was pinch-running for Jasinski.

Lent led the way for the Danes, batting 6-for-7 and totaling four runs, two RBI, a double and a triple. Oliva went 3-for-6 with four RBI and two doubles.

In the nightcap, Albany erased a 9-4 deficit and exploded for eight runs in the top half of the seventh inning. As the Danes led 12-4 with two outs, the umpires halted the game due to darkness, nullifying the inning and giving the Ravens a 9-4 victory.

Wilson and Smith again led the way for the Ravens (5-7 in the NECC, 9-18 overall), who won their fourth straight game. Wilson went 2-for-3 with an RBI-double while Smith hit 1-for-2 with two RBI, two runs and a double. Sophomore Jed Pellerin (Charlestown, NH/Fall Mountain) batted 2-for-4 and scored two runs. Sophomore pitcher Shane Mitchell earned the win to improve to 4-1 on the year.

Lent paced Albany with two RBI while batting 2-for-2. Junior Dan Gallagher went 2-for-3 with two doubles and two RBI as Albany slipped to 6-10 in the NECC and 15-16 overall.

The Ravens visit Sacred Heart Friday for a doubleheader at 1 p.m. and close the season Saturday at home against Stony Brook (1 p.m.).

Albany, N.Y. -- Ellakisha Williamson (Albany H.S.) won three events and set two meet records as Albany defended its women's title at the seventh annual Albany Invitational on Saturday afternoon at University Field. The Great Danes also captured their fourth consecutive men's championship.

Williamson, a sophomore, provisionally qualified for the NCAA Division II championships, and eclipsed a meet record which had stood for 12 years with a time of 24.65 seconds in the 200-meter dash. She also won the 100-hurdles in a meet-record 14.25, and the 100-dash in 12.06. In addition, Williamson anchored Albany's 400-relay, which was clocked in 48.10 to break another meet standard and qualify for NCAAs.

The Great Danes were first in the team standings with 282 points, while Binghamton was second with 149.

Xiomara Davila Diaz, who also ran on the 400-relay, turned in an NCAA-qualifying performance at 400 meters. She ran a provisional mark of 56.50, which established another Albany Invitational record.

Local women who won individual titles on Saturday include Janna Johnston (Shenendehowa) in the heptathlon, Erica Viger (Granville Central) in the 400-hurdles, and Andrea Viger (Granville Central) in the 1,500.

Albany's Jackie Knapp Named NECC Player of the Week

Lowell, Mass. -- University at Albany's Jackie Knapp (Schenectady H.S.) has been selected as the New England Collegiate Conference Player of the Week in softball (Mar. 24-30). Freshman pitcher Jessica Hansen was also named as the conference's Rookie of the Week.

Knapp, a sophomore shortstop, batted .409 in eight games, and totaled three home runs, 12 runs scored and 16 RBIs. She went 5-for-7 with three homers and nine RBIs in a doubleheader with Massachusetts Institute of Technology in Cocoa Beach, Fla.

Knapp, the Big 10 MVP as a scholastic senior, leads the NECC in RBIs with a 1.88 average per game, and is second in home runs (0.33 per game).

Hansen had a 1-1 record in two starts last week, and recorded a 0.78 earned run average. She fired a five-inning no-hitter against La Roche College. Hansen had three strikeouts and two walks in the 8-0 victory.

Albany has a 7-2 record on the season, and is tentatively scheduled for a home-opening twinbill against Queens on Friday at 3:00 p.m.
