

Dear Mrs. Taylor:

How thoughtful of you to have sent to me the inscribed copy of the Report of the Joint Legislative Committee on Preservation and Restoration of Historic Sites 1958-59. I have read it with a great deal of interest and wish to congratulate you on it.

It seems to me that under your aegis this Committee is doing a fine job of catching up with the undoubted advances of the last several decades in the field of historic preservation. I should think that in due course you may well be able to have New York State face up to its full responsibility in this regard. I trust that your work will go on and that you will continue to be a goad and a gadfly.

I was particularly taken with Marvin Rapp's suggestion for a Thruway Touraide, a brilliant application of a device which is now being used successfully in some museums throughout the land. A concomitant thought occurred to me as I read this section and the following section on Historic Highway Maps." Earlier you had discussed historic markers and rightly, I think, had concluded that in their present form they are almost worthless except as reminders to the local citizenry, who in due course pass them without even seeing them. I wonder if it might not be possible to get the gasoline and oil companies and the restaurants on the Thruway to consider the possibility of erecting large markers at some point on their lands. My own concept of this is conditioned by what I have come to believe to be the finest markers in the United States -- those in the State of Montana. They are large "billboards" -- executed in good taste, however -- which appear on all major highways throughout the state. What is most significant about them, however, is the deft handling of historical subject matter. They were composed, I believe, by a Robert Fletcher, who treated history with wit and humor and great feeling. I am sure that you could obtain copies of his texts simply by writing to the Governor of Montana.

10/15/59 Mrs. Taylor I note you have begun a study of historic zoning. As Director of the National Trust for Historic Preservation until 1956 I undertook to collect a good deal of information on this subject. The National Trust has continued this work and I suggest that if you haven't already done so you write to Mrs. Helen Duprey Bullock, Historian, The National Trust for Historic Preservation, 2000 K Street N.W., Washington 6, D. 




