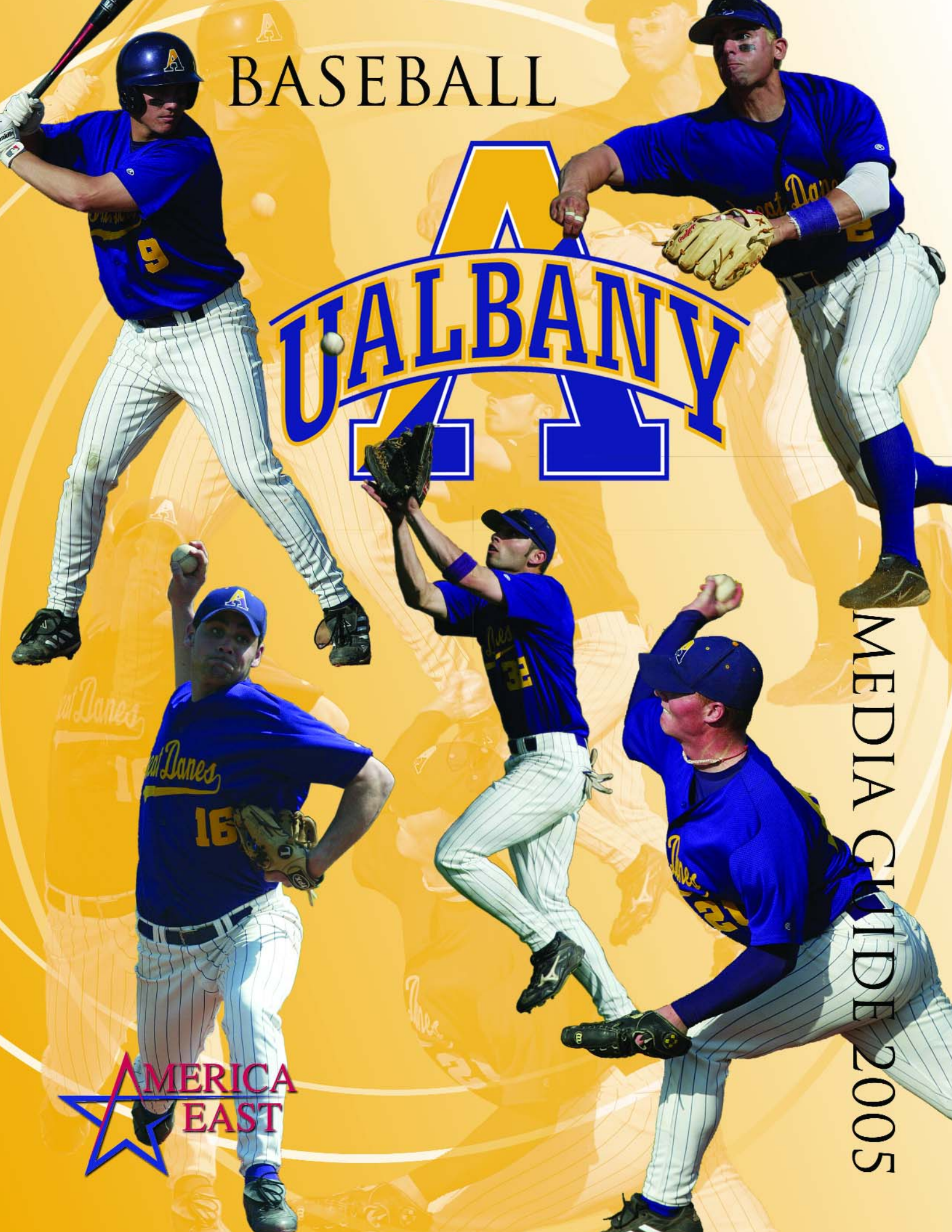

DIRECTIONS TO UALBANY ATHLETIC COMPLEX

From the north: Take the Northway (I-87) south to Exit 1E onto I-90 East (Albany/Boston), then Exit 2 (Washington Ave.) which leads right into UAlbany.

From the south: Take the Thruway (I-87) north to Exit 24. After the tollbooths, go onto I-90 East towards Boston to Exit 2 (Washington Ave.) which leads right into UAlbany.

From the east: Take I-90 west (towards Buffalo) to Exit 2 (Fuller Road). Turn left onto Fuller Road then next left at Washington Ave. UAlbany will be on your right.

From the west: Take the Thruway (I-90) east to Exit 24. After the tollbooths, go onto I-90 east towards Boston to Exit 2 (Washington Ave.) which leads right into UAlbany.

From all directions: Upon entering campus, follow University Drive (heading south/bearing right) one mile to Recreation and Convocation Center parking lot.

HEAD COACH JON MUELLER



Jon Mueller begins his sixth season as the head coach of the UAlbany baseball program. His teams own a 111-132-1 record since moving to the NCAA Division I level in 2000.

Last season, Mueller led his team to a program-best 37-14, including a 14-7 conference record. The Great Danes finished tied for second in the America East at the end of the regular season and made the trip to the conference tournament for the first time. Mueller's efforts earned him America East Conference Coach of the Year accolades.

Mueller also coached the 2004 America East player of the year, first baseman Dan Schoonmaker. Schoonmaker, who was an All-America East second-team selection in 2003, was one of only two players on the UAlbany squad to start all 51 games. He led the team in hits (73) and RBI (51) and was tied for the team lead in home runs with 10. Schoonmaker was also named to the ECAC second team and was a collegebaseballinsider.com honorable mention All-American.

In addition, shortstop Joe Lamb and infielder Derek DeGrazio earned All-America East first-team honors, while relief pitcher Shawn Ryan joined DeGrazio on the American Baseball Coaches Association All-Northeast Region First Team. DeGrazio was also named to the ECAC second-team and Ryan, who was third in the country in saves, was named a collegebaseballinsider.com honorable mention All-American.

In his tenure, Mueller has coached a steadily improving Great Danes team. In 2004, the UAlbany team produced a program best 42 home runs and 324 RBI, up from 34 and 246, respectively, in the previous year. Last season marked the third straight season the Great Danes won 20 or more games.

Mueller also coached his third draft pick in four years in 2004. Starting pitcher Adam Kroft, who had an 8-3 record as a senior with a 4.08 ERA, was chosen in the 30th round by the San Diego Padres. Kroft followed Mike Grasso in 2002 (11th round, Atlanta Braves) and Steve Checksfield in 2001 (26th round, Houston Astros) into the major leagues. Checksfield was the first UAlbany player since 1974 to be drafted into the majors. Mueller also coached four other players, Michael Oliva, Jason Trufant, Steve Emmerthal and Kirt Zimniewicz, who signed free agent professional contracts.

After leading the Great Danes to a 19-24-1 record in his first campaign, Mueller was instrumental in moving all of the program's conference games to Heritage Park, a minor league park in Colonie, N.Y., for the 2002 season. Mueller also mentored Oliva, UAlbany's all-time hits leader, for two seasons. Oliva ended his career as a Great Dane with 229 hits.

A volunteer baseball assistant at UAlbany prior to his current appointment, Mueller played on the minor league professional level from 1994-2000 with the Albany-Colonie Diamond Dogs, Adirondack Lumberjacks and Marshall (Minn.) Mallards.

A 6-foot-5, 245-pound infielder and designated hitter, Mueller had a career .280 batting average with 74 home runs and 318 RBI. The Stillwater, N.Y. native achieved many honors, including being named the 2000 Northern League All-Star Game MVP. Mueller also played on the 1999 Northern League Championship team and the 1997 Northeast League Championship team.

Mueller was the junior varsity coach at the College of St. Rose in 1993-94 and has been a teacher/instructor at Mechanicville City Schools, Saratoga BOCES and Duanesburg School District. He earned a bachelor's degree in sociology from Eckerd College (Fla.) in 1992 and has a master's degree in secondary education from St. Rose. He and his wife, Patricia, are the proud parents of Marley (1).

COACHING STAFF

Assistant Coach Mark Lavenia

Mark Lavenia enters his fifth season as an assistant coach at UAlbany, working directly with the Great Danes pitching staff.

Last season, UAlbany's hurlers had a combined ERA of 4.58 and struck out 367 batters. Lavenia coached Steve Emmerthal to his third straight appearance on the All-America East Conference team after leading the league in wins with eight and finishing third in strikeouts with 72. Lavenia also coached America East pitcher of the week Nick Murphy, major league draft pick Adam Kroft and nationally-ranked saves leader Shawn Ryan.

Lavenia, who pitched in the Northern League with both the Albany-Colonie Diamond Dogs and the Quebec City Capitales, has played on the minor league level since 1993. He served as the pitching coach at Columbia-Greene Community College four seasons ago. A first-team All-Section II pitcher for Shaker High School (N.Y.), Lavenia was a member of both NAIA and Division II World Series teams at the University of South Carolina-Aiken. He was also drafted by the Chicago Cubs and played in the Atlanta Braves' organization. Lavenia, who earned his degree in business administration from Empire State College in 2004, is married to the former Ryann Piatt, sister of Cleveland Indians outfielder Adam Piatt.



Assistant Coach Garrett Baron

Garrett Baron begins his second season as an assistant coach with the Great Danes.

Working primarily with the infielders, Baron helped raise the team's fielding percentage more than 20 points, finishing the 2004 season ranked second in the America East, after a sixth-place ranking in 2003.

Baron, a native of East Greenbush, N.Y., graduated from Columbia High School in 1997, where he was a three-sport letterwinner and an all-state second baseman for the Blue Devils.

Upon graduation, Baron attended Columbia-Greene Community College in Hudson, N.Y., where he was selected as an all-conference player in consecutive years. Baron then transferred to Ithaca College, where he helped lead the Bombers to back-to-back Empire 8 Championships, starting at both third and first base.

Baron earned a bachelor's degree in health and exercise science from Ithaca in May 2002 and a master's degree in sport and exercise science in 2003. He spent two seasons as an assistant coach for the Bombers and worked two summers as a head coach in the New York Collegiate Baseball League. In the summer of 2004, Baron will make the jump to the Coastal Plains League as the head coach of the Spartanburg Stingers in Spartanburg, South Carolina.



Assistant Coach Matt Quatraro

Matt Quatraro enters his second year as a member of Jon Mueller's coaching staff.

Quatraro came to UAlbany after spending seven years in the Tampa Bay Devil Rays organization. In 2002, he was the catcher for the Durham Bulls, Tampa's Triple-A farm team. His best season came in 2001 when he played for Orlando, as he hit .325 with six home runs and 35 RBI. Quatraro also had a career-high 88 hits and 24 doubles.

Originally an eighth-round pick in the 1996 amateur draft, Quatraro earned the Devil Rays' Community Service Award in 2002 for his work with children at the UNC hospital. He also delivered toys to the kids from Wool E. Bull's Toy Drive.

Quatraro, a 1996 graduate of Old Dominion University, and his wife, Christine, reside in the Capital Region.

AMERICA EAST CONFERENCE

The Tradition

America East Conference enters its 17th year of all-sports championship competition with a reputation as one of the most comprehensive NCAA Division I conferences. With a geographic footprint extending from the Mid-Atlantic to the Northeast regions, America East remains committed to broad-based, competitive Division I athletics programs, complementing the academic integrity of the 10 member institutions. University at Albany, Binghamton University, Boston University, University of Hartford, University of Maine, University of Maryland, Baltimore County (UMBC), University of New Hampshire, Northeastern University, Stony Brook University, and University of Vermont each offers a unique blend of academic and athletic tradition. America East also has an associate membership with Quinnipiac University in the sport of men's lacrosse.

Athletic Success

America East's proven record of success in its sports will enable the conference to earn admission to 12 NCAA Championships in 2004-05. Student-athletes in the sports of baseball, men's basketball, women's basketball, field hockey, men's lacrosse, women's lacrosse, men's soccer, women's soccer, softball, men's tennis, women's tennis, and volleyball receive access to NCAA Championships via the conference's automatic qualifiers. Individual champions at the America East Outdoor Track and Field Championship will receive bids to that NCAA Championship. In addition, several America East athletes in sports such as men's and women's cross country, men's and women's indoor track and field, men's and women's golf, and men's and women's swimming and diving will compete in those NCAA Championships. Overall, America East sponsors championships in 22 sports.

Academic Accolades

America East institutions saw nine of their student-athletes earn Academic All-America honors in 2003-04 alone. This total ranked fifth-highest among all Division I-AA and I-AAA conferences. Included in the group were first-team selections Lana Khvalina of the UMBC women's tennis team, who was named for the second-straight year, and Alon Lubezky of the Hartford men's soccer team, the school's career goal scoring leader. America East annually recognizes its student-athletes' success in the classroom. All varsity team members who compile a grade-point average between 3.0 and 3.49 during their playing season receive conference recognition by being named to the Academic Honor Roll. Those outstanding student-athletes who compile a grade-point average of 3.5 or higher are named to the Commissioner's Honor Roll. Nearly 1,700 student-athletes received honor roll recognition in 2003-04 with America East's 3,500 student-athletes averaging a 2.97 grade-point average. Additionally, the conference annually determines the top scholar-athlete in each of its championship sports. The scholar-athlete must maintain a minimum 3.2 cumulative grade-point average and be a starter or prominent reserve on the team for the duration of the playing season. From the pool of 22 outstanding scholar-athletes, one male and one female America East student-athlete are further honored as the conference's Scholar-Athletes of the Year.

The University at Albany today is an internationally recognized public research university with a broad mission of undergraduate and graduate education, and research. More than 17,000 students are enrolled in nine schools and colleges offering 176 undergraduate, master's and doctoral degree programs.

Outstanding faculty, an innovative curriculum, award-winning advisors and student-centered services create a distinctive learning environment that nurtures student success. After graduation, more than two-thirds of undergraduates go on for advanced degrees, and acceptances to law and medical schools are well above the national average. UAlbany has more than 128,000 living alumni, including: Catherine Bertini, B.A.'71, under-secretary-general for management, United Nations; Marcia Brown, B.A.'40, three-time Caldecott Award-winning children's book author; Tom Clarke, B.A.'73, president of new business ventures, Nike, Inc.; and SOBE beverages founder Norm Snyder, B.S.'83.

UAlbany programs in sociology, public administration and policy, criminal justice, clinical psychology, reading, accounting, social welfare and atmospheric sciences have earned national renown for excellence. More recently, the University has been building new strengths in such areas as nanotechnology, life sciences, and public informatics and information systems. The latest rankings of graduate programs by *U.S. News and World Report* place seven programs in the top 25 in the nation.

Undergraduates choose from 53 majors in the arts and sciences, business and accounting, public policy, criminal justice, information science, pre-law and pre-health; approximately 30 percent of undergraduates participate in research with faculty. Innovative degree programs with an international focus and more than 300 study-abroad programs prepare students for the global economy. Extensive internship opportunities offer real-world experience in New York's capital and the surrounding region.

Both the UAlbany campus and the region are bustling with extracurricular opportunities. Students participate in more than 150 student clubs, honor societies, and other campus-related groups, and choose from a busy calendar of campus events, including spirited Division I athletic competition in 19 sports and a rich array of cultural activities.

The University is just a short drive from spectacular natural and recreational centers in New York, Massachusetts, and Vermont. With 13 colleges in the Capital Region, it's easy to see why Albany is also a "great college town."

UAlbany, working with governmental and business partners, plays a vital role in the economic development of the Capital Region and New York State. The University is a major international center for research and development in the fields of nanosciences and nanoengineering.

An economic impact study in 2004 estimated UAlbany's economic impact as \$1.119 billion annually in New York State - \$1.005 billion of that in the Capital Region.

The Campaign for the University at Albany was publicly launched in April 2003 to help provide necessary private support for achieving UAlbany's goals.
