## **GOLDMAN LEADS UALBANY VOLLEYBALL TO SWEEP IN AMERICA EAST OPENER**

Albany, N.Y. – **Shelby Goldman** smacked 14 kills to lead three players in double-figure kills as UAlbany defeated Stony Brook, 3-0, in the America East Conference opener for both teams on Friday night at University Gymnasium. The Great Danes, who won their second straight conference opener, extended their unbeaten streak to seven matches.

Goldman, who tallied seven kills in the opening game, finished with a match-high .393 hitting percentage. **Ashley Hunter** finished with 12 kills and a .321 hitting percentage. **Ashlee Reed** rounded out the Great Danes in twin figures with 10 kills and six digs.

**Blair Buchanan** registered 40 assists, eight digs and five kills. **Ashley DeNeal** paced UAlbany (13-2, AE 1-0) offensively with 13 digs, while **Eileen Nicole Rodriguez** added 11 and **Kristin Fiorillo** finished with a career-high 10.

**Morgan Sweany**, a three-time America East player of the week honoree this season, paced Stony Brook (6-9, AE 0-1) with 11 kills and five digs. **Noelle Bay** chipped in with seven kills and six digs, while **Kate Ruskowski** recorded 29 assists and five digs.

# RAY SCORES GOAL, ADDS ASSIST, IN MEN'S SOCCER 3-3 TIE AGAINST MARIST

Albany, N.Y. – UAlbany's **Trevor Elmo** scored with 4:22 remaining in regulation, but Marist senior Bobby Van Dyke tied the game 2:02 later, as the two teams played to a 3-3 doubleovertime tie on Wednesday afternoon at Varsity Field. The Great Danes are unbeaten in their last seven matches at home.

Senior **Kyle Nunes** started the scoring for the Red Foxes to give them an early 1-0 lead. UAlbany freshman Brad Ray evened the match three minutes into the second half on his second tally of the season. Marist regained the lead on a goal by senior Keith Detelj, the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference Preseason Player of the Year, at the 61:19 mark of the second half. Freshman Alex Ruhe-Lischke evened the match just five minutes later on his first career goal. Elmo's and Van Dyke's goals sent the game into overtime, where it ended in a 3-3 deadlock.

Ray, who also added an assist, is second on the team this season with three goals and eight points. Junior captain Stephan Hall had his team-leading fourth assist of the season. He leads UAlbany with 13 points. Freshman goalkeeper Steward Ceus had eight saves for the Great Danes, while sophomore **Daniel Owen** had six stops in net for the Red Foxes (1-5-1).



# UNIVERSITY AT ALBANY ENSHRINES FIVE INTO ATHLETIC HALL OF FAME

Albany, N.Y. – Four former athletes and a university administrator will be enshrined into the University at Albany Athletic Hall of Fame on Friday, October 7 at the 22nd annual HOF Dinner and Induction Ceremony. A reception for the Athletic Hall of Fame inductees begins at 6:00 p.m., with the dinner and ceremony to follow in the Recreation and Convocation Center (RACC) on campus. The induction ceremony is part of Homecoming and Family Weekend, which also includes Saturday's football game at University Field with Northeast Conference-rival Stony Brook at 4:00 p.m. A men's soccer match with Boston University and a women's field hockey contest with New Hampshire both begin at 1:00 p.m.

The new inductees and their sports: **Dan Gmelin** '98, football; **Rafaela Nikas** '98, lacrosse & volleyball; **Joe Rajczak** '80, football; and **Joe Savino** '98, football. **Dr. Richard Hall**, a distinguished professor of sociology and the school's NCAA faculty representative, is being inducted as an honorary member.

With this year's class, there are 108 former athletes, coaches, and administrators who have been inducted into the University at Albany's Athletic Hall of Fame.

Dan Gmelin (1994-97) -- One of the top wide receivers and punt returners in school history, Gmelin helped lead the Great Danes to the 1997 Eastern Football Conference championship and a single-season mark for victories with an 11-1 record.

Gmelin earned first-team Division II non-scholarship All-America recognition by Football Gazette and was named first-team All-ECAC-North and first-team All-EFC as a senior. He established single-season records for receptions (57), receiving yardage (1,070) and TD catches (10). He also set marks at the time for all-purpose yards (1,705), points scored (72), touchdowns (12) and punt return yards (368). Gmelin, who ranked seventh among the NCAA Division II leaders in punt returns at 15.3 yards per attempt, had three 200-yard all-purpose games in that season. He hauled in 11 passes for 215 yards against Southern Connecticut State in the EFC's Atlantic Division title game, and followed with nine receptions for 160 yards and one TD in the league championship victory at American International.

In 1996, Gmelin was a Football Gazette first-team All-American as a punt returner, while earning honorable mention status as a receiver. He was fourth nationally in punt returns with a 15.3 average, and caught 46 passes for 720 yards and three touchdowns. Gmelin accounted for 1,032 all-purpose yards. His top performance came against Pace, when he had 11 receptions for 181 yards.

Gmelin, who made 32 consecutive starts over his last three seasons, went on to sign an NFL free-agent contract with the San Diego Chargers and the Saskatchewan Roughriders of the Canadian Football League. He is among the school's all-time leaders in receptions (136) and receiving yards (2,243), and is on the career lists in touchdown receptions (17) and all-purpose yards (3,185).

A native of Bedford Hills, N.Y., Gmelin earned his B.S. in economics with a minor in business administration. He currently serves as Senior Underwriter for Professional Indemnity Agency, Inc., a premier provider of specialized insurance products. Gmelin and his wife, Raquel, were married last year.

Rafaela Nikas (1994-98) -- A two-time lacrosse All-American and an all-conference standout in volleyball, Nikas is one of the top women's athletes in UAlbany sports history. She was voted the school's 1997-98 Female Athlete of the Year.

A native of Bay Shore, N.Y., Nikas was selected first-team Division II All-American by both Brine/IWLCA and the U.S. Women's Lacrosse Association (USWLA). As a senior midfielder she established a school single-season record with 52 goals, plus added 10 assists to tie another standard with 62 points. Nikas led the Great Danes to the ECAC Division II championship final for the second time in three years with an 11-4 record. She finished her career among the school's all-time leaders with 97 goals, 35 assists, 132 points and 324 ground balls.

An outside hitter in volleyball, Nikas was a member of the 1997 All-New England Collegiate Conference second team. She averaged 3.70 kills per game and was second nationally in digs (5.55 pg). Nikas captained UAlbany to a 20-11 record and an ECAC Division II tournament appearance. She is the program's all-time leader in digs with 1,607, plus is third in career kills (1,281) and seventh in career kill average (3.54 pg). In 1996, she made the All-NECC first team, when she averaged 3.69 kills and was among the national leaders in dig average (4.54 pg).

Nikas earned her undergraduate degree in English with a dual minor in communication and women's studies. She is presently both an English teacher and head women's volleyball and lacrosse coach at Valley Stream South High School in Long Island. Nikas earned her M.A. in secondary education and English from Long Island University-C.W. Post, and was an assistant coach on the school's 2001 NCAA Division II national champion women's lacrosse team.

Joe Rajczak (1976-79) -- An outside linebacker and defensive back in the late 1970s, Rajczak was the first UAlbany football player to earn All-America honors and was a member of the 1977 NCAA Division III playoff team.

Rajczak earned four varsity letters from 1976-79 as a defender in the team's 4-4 alignment. He was named to the Division III All-America second team as selected by the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA) and received ECAC Upstate New York All-Star recognition as a senior. Rajczak was also voted the Albany Times Union Player of the Year, as the best college football player in the Capital Region, and the Capital and Player of the Year. One of his top performances came against Brooklyn College, when he finished with 10 tackles, two pass deflections and one interception in a 56-0 victory. He led the team in tackles and assists for the season.

Rajczak, who was a member of the UAlbany lacrosse team in 1978, has coached in the Capital Region over the last two decades. He served as Scotia-Glenville High School's women's lacrosse head coach from 1989-99, and as head wrestling coach from 1989-91. Rajczak's lacrosse teams won seven sectional titles, made two regional appearances, and reached the '98 state semifinals. He began his football coaching career as a Troy High assistant in 1981, and eventually would serve as both offensive and defensive coordinator at Scotia-Glenville.

Rajczak, who hails from Niagara Falls, N.Y., and his wife, Terri, have three children, Jenn, Krissy and Joey. His daughter, Jenn, finished her UAlbany lacrosse career in 2004, while Krissy will be a junior midfielder on this year's team. He currently is the principal at Cohoes (N.Y.) High School, and is an Executive Board Member of the Empire State Supervisors and Administrators Association, plus president of the Colonial Council.

Joe Savino (1994-97) -- UAlbany's all-time leading passer led the Great Danes to the 1997 Eastern Football Conference championship and a school-record 11-1 campaign. He was chosen as the school's 1997-98 Male Athlete of the Year.

A native of Norwood, N.J., Savino was a first-team Football Gazette Division II non-scholarship All-America quarterback. He was voted the ECAC-North Player of the Year and was the EFC's most valuable player after setting single-season records with 2,377 passing yards and 22 touchdowns. Savino, who also rushed for 10 TDs as a senior, threw for a single-game record 398 yards in the conference's Atlantic Division title game against Southern Connecticut State, and was the EFC championship MVP with 314 passing yards in a 27-20 victory over American International.

Savino, who ranked nationally among the NCAA leaders in passing efficiency (156.4 rating) and total offense (229.3 yards per game), was both an ECAC-North and EFC first-team selection. He received the ECAC-North and EFC offensive player of the week award three times and made the ECAC Honor Roll on four occasions. The 5-foot-9 signal-caller established 25 school records during his career, including most passing yards (7,015), touchdown passes (56) and most yards gained in total offense (7,660).

In 1996, Savino was named to the ECAC Intercollegiate Football Conference Division II All-Star Team, when he passed for 1,494 yards and 11 touchdowns, plus added 194 yards on the ground. He was chosen the 1994 ECAC Division III Upstate New York Rookie of the Year as a freshman. As the top-rated quarterback in the region, Savino threw for 1,742 yards and 12 touchdowns while completing 51.4 percent of his attempts.

Savino earned his undergraduate degree in accounting with a minor in business administration. He presently serves as Director of Finance for TMP Worldwide Advertising and Communications, a global HR communications business and HR solutions provider. Savino, a certified public accountant in the state of New York, married his wife, Tara, earlier this month.

**Dr. Richard Hall (honorary)** -- Dr. Richard Hall, a distinguished service professor of sociology, is being inducted into UAlbany's Athletic Hall of Fame as an honorary member. Dr. Hall has served as the University's NCAA Faculty Representative and as Chair of the Intercollegiate Athletic Advisory Board (IAAB) since 1989.

Dr. Hall was a key figure in the elevation of UAlbany's intercollegiate athletics program to its current NCAA Division I status in September 1999. Under his supervision, the IAAB recommended the athletic program's upgrade to Division I in January 1997. Eventually the move was supported by the University Senate's Educational Policy Council and then approved by the entire University Senate, a group comprised of faculty, staff and students.

The University successfully completed the NCAA's second cycle of Division I athletics certification in August 2003 with Dr. Hall acting as a guiding force. In March 1995, he helped develop the school's intercollegiate athletics model that made a commitment to gender equity while maintaining fiscal responsibility.

Dr. Hall also served on the University Athletic Policy and Planning Board from 1984-89, the Commission on University Athletics, and the America East Conference Board of Directors and Executive Committee.

## **UALBANY'S COLIN DISCH CHOSEN NEC DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK**

Somerset, N.J. – University at Albany's **Colin Disch** has been selected the Northeast Conference Defensive Player of the Week in football, as announced by the league office on Monday afternoon.

Disch, a sophomore inside linebacker, posted a career-high 18 tackles, including five for a loss, and added two sacks for minus-9 yards and one forced fumble in his team's 14-13 NEC loss to Central Connecticut State on Sept. 24.

Disch's tackle total is the most by any UAlbany player against an NEC opponent, and tied the program's single-game Division I-AA standard. Josh Bazan also had 18 tackles versus Drake in 2000.

A native of North Plainfield, N.J., Disch is second among the NCAA Division I-AA leaders in tackles at 13.67 per game. He has recorded double-figure tackles in 13 of 14 games as a collegian.

#### UALBANY'S BLAIR BUCHANAN NAMED AMERICA EAST SETTER OF THE WEEK

Boston, Mass. – University at Albany's **Blair Buchanan** has been named the America East Conference Setter of the Week in women's volleyball, as announced by the conference office on Monday afternoon. The junior setter has won the award three out of four weeks this season and nine times during her career.

An AVCA honorable mention All-American last season, Buchanan averaged 11.00 assists, 2.22 digs and 1.22 kills per game en route to earning all-tournament honors at the Fairfield Invitational on Sept. 24-25. She registered her fourth double-double of the season with 33 assists and 10 digs to go along with five kills in a 3-0 victory over Long Island.

Buchanan ranks first among America East leaders with 11.83 assists per game. She is also sixth in the conference with a .289 hitting percentage. Buchanan is second on Great Danes with an average of 2.33 digs.

UAlbany (12-2) opens America East Conference play at home against Stony Brook on Friday at 7 p.m.



#### CENTRAL CONN. STATE HOLDS OFF UALBANY IN NEC OPENER

New Britain, Conn. – Reserve quarterback **Aubrey Norris** ran for one touchdown and passed for another, as Central Connecticut State held off UAlbany, 14-13, in the Northeast Conference opener for both teams on Saturday afternoon at Arute Field.

Central Connecticut State (2-2, NEC 1-0) reversed a 7-0 deficit in the second quarter with a pair of touchdowns. Norris, a freshman, scored on the second play of the period, when he rolled left, picked up two blocks, and dove inside the pylon, on an 8-yard run.

The Blue Devils, who shared last year's NEC championship, then capitalized on UAlbany receiver **Irani DeAraujo**'s fumble at his own 30-yard line. Five plays later, Norris threw a 5-yard scoring pass to **Josh Roth** for the go-ahead touchdown. Roth finished off the third-and-three situation by diving headfirst into the corner of the end zone for a 14-7 lead.

After a scoreless third quarter in which both defenses dominated, UAlbany (0-3, 0-1) put together a short drive that stalled out at the CCSU 19. Freshman **Eric Althardt** then missed a 38-yard field goal following a low snap from center.

The Great Danes were back in business on the next series. Linebacker **Colin Disch**, who totaled a career-high 18 tackles with 2 sacks, hit starting quarterback **Tim Sheard** from behind and **Will Boone** recovered the fumble at the CCSU 17.

UAlbany stayed on the ground for the next seven plays, with fullback **Dan Beigel** scoring his second touchdown of the game on a one-yard run over right guard. However, the Great Danes still trailed, 14-13, when Althardt's extra-point attempt missed to the right.

The Great Danes defense, who limited Central Connecticut State to 46 second-half yards, forced another three-and-out to give their team another chance. Quarterback **Daniel Bocanegra**, a redshirt freshman who completed 16 of 31 passes for 122 yards, moved his club past midfield. But the drive ended when he failed to connect on a fourth-and-two pass with 48 seconds remaining.

"We struggled on offense but played pretty good defense," said CCSU coach **Tom Masella**, who led the program to an 8-2 record last year. "We had a bead on what they were trying to do. When you are up one score, it does a lot for you and allows you to be more aggressive."

Beigel gave UAlbany a 7-0 lead in the opening quarter when he capped a 12-play, 80-yard, march with a 4-yard touchdown reception. Beigel, a sophomore fullback, finished with 12 carries for 30 yards on the ground.

"Our defense played well enough to win," said UAlbany coach **Bob Ford**, whose team is off to an 0-3 start for the second consecutive year. "We made more than our share of mistakes on

offense and some in the kicking game. They had a lot of success in the bunch formation early in the game, before we made the necessary corrections."

CCSU's Norris completed all seven of his pass attempts for 58 yards, while Sheard hit on three-of-seven for 58 through the air. **Nigel Monge** and **Brian Sullivan** had 12 and 10 tackles, respectively, for a defense that allowed 235 total yards.





## **UALBANY MEN'S LACROSSE WILL PLAY IN TWO FALL TOURNAMENTS**

Albany, N.Y. – The University at Albany men's lacrosse team will participate in two tournaments during the month of October in preparation for the 2006 season. The Great Danes will travel to the Price Modern "Lacrosse of Leukemia" Fall Invitational on Saturday, Oct. 1 and Syracuse University's "Pumpkin Stickout" on Sunday, Oct. 16.

The "Lacrosse for Leukemia" Tournament will feature the 2006 U.S. Men's National Team. UAlbany coach Scott Marr is a national team assistant and a member of John Desko's staff. Desko, who has guided Syracuse to three national championships, is serving as USA's head coach at the 2006 World Championship in Canada. The Great Danes will face St. John's at 10:00 a.m. and Loyola, Md. at 12 noon. The tournament features a 12-team field and will be held at St. Paul's School near Baltimore, Maryland.

Syracuse's Pumpkin Stickout brings together college lacrosse programs from all three NCAA divisions. UAlbany meets 2005 Division II national semifinalist Le Moyne at 12:30 p.m., before battling Nazareth and Cortland, a pair NCAA Division III teams last spring. The tournament will be held at the Lampe Athletics Complex near Manley Field House.

UAlbany earned its third consecutive NCAA Division I Tournament appearance in 2005 after winning the America East Conference championship. The Great Danes, who have put together three straight 10-win campaigns, return three of the top four scorers from a squad that ranked sixth nationally at 11.63 goals per game. Merrick Thomson, a first-team All-America East attacker, led the nation in goals (54) and was second in points (74). Frank Resetarits, who had 29 goals and 21 assists, and Chris Martocchia, who added 35 goals and 11 assists, are also 40-plus point producers.

## ASHLEE REED NAMED AMERICA EAST VOLLEYBALL CO-PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Boston, Mass. – University at Albany's Ashlee Reed has been named the America East Conference Co-Player of the Week in women's volleyball, as announced by the conference office on Monday afternoon. Reed shared the award with Stony Brook's Morgan Sweany.

Reed was named the MVP of Virginia's Jefferson Cup Tournament last weekend as UAlbany (9-2) posted three victories against Liberty, Appalachian State, and Virginia. The senior middle hitter averaged 2.58 kills, 1.67 digs, 0.67 blocks and 3.33 points per game. She also hit for a .410 percentage.

Reed smacked a season-high 14 kills against Appalachian State and recorded her first double-double of the season with 11 kills and 16 digs to go along with five blocks in the championship match against host Virginia. She helped the Great Danes post 11 team blocks in two of three matches, which is the highest single-game total in the program's Division I history.

Reed, a native of Round Rock, Texas, also registered her 900th career dig last weekend and moved to seventh on the school's career charts with 913. She is second among conference leaders with a .326 hitting percentage.

The Great Danes return to action on Sept. 23-24 when they play in the Fairfield Invitational.

#### FOOTBALL MEETS CENTRAL CONNECTICUT STATE ON FOX SPORTS NEW YORK

New Britain, Conn. – UAlbany will play its Northeast Conference opener against Central Connecticut State, the league's defending co-champion, on Saturday, Sept. 24 at 1:00 p.m. The contest will be televised by Fox Sports New York (Time Warner Cable - Channel 26). Paul Dottino and former New York Giants quarterback Scott Brunner will provide the play-byplay coverage.

Central Connecticut State posted its first winning campaign since 1988 with an 8-2 record last season, including a 6-1 mark in conference play to share the title with Monmouth. UAlbany opened its 2005 schedule with two nationally-ranked opponents in Hofstra (No. 17) and Massachusetts (No. 23).

## COBBS LEADS NO. 25 MASSACHUSETTS TO 40-0 VICTORY OVER UALBANY

AMHERST, MASS. – **R.J. Cobbs** ran for two touchdowns and No. 25 Massachusetts registered an NCAA Division I-AA with three safeties en route to a 40-0 victory over UAlbany on Saturday evening before 10,177 fans at McGuirk Alumni Stadium.

UMass (2-1) scored on its opening possession with a seven-play, 64-yard drive. Quarterback **Liam Coen** fired a 22-yard strike to **J.J. Moore** against a blitzing defense to set up **Steve Baylark's** one-yard touchdown run over right guard. Baylark, a Walter Payton Award candidate, finished with 77 yards on 18 carries.

In the second quarter, Coen, who connected on 14-of-20 attempts for 213 yards, helped his team move out to a 14-0 lead. Coen, on third-and-goal, hit **Rasheed Rancher** on a crossing route for an eight-yard touchdown pass.

UMass posted a 16-0 halftime advantage with the first of three consecutive safeties. UAlbany quarterback **Daniel Bocanegra** was sacked in the end zone by nose tackle **John Hatchell**.

The Minutemen added 10 points in the third quarter due to UAlbany breakdowns on special teams. A pair of punt snaps went over **Marc Pallozzi's** head for safeties. Another poor snap led to a two-yard scoring run by Cobbs, who rushed 14 times for 73 yards.

"We played fairly hard, but obviously had problems in the kicking game," said UAlbany coach Bob Ford, whose team lost to its second straight Atlantic 10 Conference opponent. "Their two backs are as good as we have ever faced. They have a pretty decent young quarterback and a defense that comes at you in several ways with sheer team speed and different looks."

In the final quarter, UMass used its ground attack to score two touchdowns. Cobbs reached paydirt on a four-yard run, before reserve tailback **Justin Montgomery** scored on a one-yard run. UMass showed nearly a 50-50 balance with 440 total yards.

Meanwhile, the UAlbany defense kept this game close for nearly three quarters behind the play of inside linebacker **Colin Disch**, who had 14 tackles and cornerback **Kamar Elliott** (9 tackles, 1 pass breakup). However, UMass' defense limited the Great Dane offense to 31 total yards, including minus-37 yards rushing. It was the lowest total on the ground by a UMass opponent in 42 years.

#### UNIVERSITY AT ALBANY WILL PARTICIPATE IN ESPN BRACKET BUSTER SATURDAY

Albany, N.Y. -- The University at Albany men's basketball team has been invited to participate in the ESPN Bracket Buster Saturday series on Feb. 18, 2006. The Great Danes are among 100 teams representing 18 conferences in the event. UAlbany is joined by defending America East Conference champion Vermont in the field.

Now in its fourth year, Bracket Buster Saturday is an ESPN television property that provides potential NCAA Tournament-caliber teams the opportunity to meet in a one-day, 50-game event. The format involves "wild-card" pairings for the pool of participating teams, with half of the Bracket Buster Saturday teams pre-designated as "home" and the remaining half as "road" teams. In an effort to provide an even greater showcase for these type of programs, the event has expanded its pool of teams each year (18 in 2003, 46 in 2004 and 64 in 2005) to produce a better cross section of squads. The actual pairings take place three weeks in advance of the event, and those match-ups are determined on the basis of regular-season play.

A total of 11 games will be televised, including six games on ESPN or ESPN2, and five games on ESPNU -- ESPN's new collegiate network that was launched on March 4, 2005. ESPN, in consultation with the conference commissioners, will make pairing decisions for the 11 televised games on Sunday, Jan. 29. Pairing decisions for the remaining 39 contests will be announced on Thursday, Feb. 2.

"We are extremely excited to have two of our members be selected to this year's Bracket Buster pool," America East Commissioner Patrick Nero said. "Having the chance to get national exposure through ESPN's various networks is a tremendous opportunity for both Albany and Vermont as well as America East."

UAlbany will be among the America East preseason favorites with the starting backcourt tandem of Jamar Wilson and Lucious Jordan both returning. Wilson and Jordan, a pair of second-team all-conference selections, averaged 16.9 and 14.8 points, respectively. Levi Levine, who accounted for 10.4 points and 6.0 rebounds per game, and Kirsten Zoellner, a 7-foot-1 center, were also in last year's starting lineup. Jon lati, the 2004 America East Rookie of the Year, is back after missing most of last season with a shoulder injury. Brent Wilson (6'8") and Brian Lillis (6'5") are coming off solid freshman campaigns.

"UAlbany's participation in ESPN's Bracket Buster is an example of how much the basketball program has grown over the last four years," said UAlbany coach Will Brown, whose team finished 13-15 last year, an eight-win improvement from the previous season. "We continue to gain national respect with this announcement. It's a tremendous honor for a young program."

Another important component for Bracket Buster Saturday participants is future scheduling. Each team that participates in the event agrees to enter into a home-and-home series with its to-be-named opponent. The return game is made in November or December of the following season. This contest allows for completion of the two-game series contract and is not part of the Bracket Buster Saturday in that second year.

UAlbany's 2005-06 schedule already includes the 2K Sports College Hoops Classic benefiting Coaches vs. Cancer on Nov. 9-10. The Great Danes are in the Gainesville Regional with Florida, Oakland and St. Peter's. UAlbany's non-conference slate is also highlighted by a trip to the west coast to face both San Diego State (Nov. 26) and UCLA (Nov. 29). Other opponents include crosstown-rival Siena (Dec. 3), Cleveland State, Harvard, Brown and Cornell.



Albany, N.Y. – **Anton Clarkson** threw two touchdown passes and **Terry Crenshaw** rushed for 121 yards and one score, as Hofstra posted a 36-7 victory over Albany on Saturday evening in the season opener for both teams before 6,212 fans at University Field.

Albany reached the end zone on its first possession with a 10-play, 51-yard drive. Redshirt freshman quarterback Daniel Bocanegra completed a pair of third-down passes to keep the sequence alive, before tailback **Kenny Williams** scored on a 2-yard run over the left side.

Hofstra regrouped when Crenshaw scored on a 36-yard dash down the left sideline before the point-after try was missed. Clarkson, who connected on 24 of 33 attempts for 291 yards, then fired a 44-yard touchdown strike to Marques Colston, who eluded a defender atseven-yard line on his way to paydirt. Clarkson then hooked up with Colston on a two-point pass for a 14-7 lead midway through the second quarter.

The Pride, who are No. 24 in this week's Division I-AA national rankings, then pulled away with a 17-point third period. Rob Zarrilli booted a 34-yard field goal to cap a 12-play march. Following an 11-yard punt by Albany's Marc Pallozzi, Hofstra would build a 24-7 advantage as Clarkson fired a 31-yard touchdown pass to Colston, who worked his way free on a post pattern. Colston, a 6-foot-4, 230-pound senior who missed all of last season with an injury, finished with six receptions for 118 yards.

Outside linebacker Chris Sebald added to the third-quarter blitz, when he picked off Albany quarterback Brett Hall's pass in the right flat and returned it 29 yards for a touchdown and a 31-7 lead.

"Offensively we could have scored more points, but we self-destructed with penalities," said Hofstra coach Joe Gardi, whose team is expected to challenge in the Atlantic 10 Conference this season. "Our defense deserves credit for make adjustments in the second half. Albany really hurt us with the blitz game, and that's something we did work enough on in the preseason."

Bocanegra completed 10 of 16 passes for 90 yards, while Hall connected on 6-of-12 for 50 yards. Each Albany signal-caller was intercepted once, as the Great Danes were limited to 206 total yards. Junior tailback Marcus Allen was the top rusher with 11 carries for 45 yards.

"We had a good start but could not keep it up for four quarters," explained Bocanegra, the first Albany quarterback to start his first game as a collegian since Joe Savino in 1994. "We're a young team that made some mistakes and missed a few assignments. A loss is a loss no matter how you get it, but we really beat ourselves."







The Great Danes return to action on Sunday, Sept. 4 when they visit American University at 1:00.


