
GARY JONES AND GEIR GUDMUNDSEN AMONG NINE UALBANY PLAYERS ON FOOTBALL GAZETTE PRESEASON NCAA I-AA MID-MAJOR TEAM

Albany, N.Y. – University at Albany tailback **Gary Jones** (Ravena-Coeymans-Selkirk) and offensive tackle **Geir Gudmundsen** lead a group of nine players who have been chosen to the Football Gazette I-AA Mid-Major Preseason All-America Football Team. Jones and Gudmundsen are first-team selections.

Jones, a 5-foot-10, 220-pound running back, rushed for a school-record 1,509 yards, scored 23 touchdowns and accounted for 1,949 all-purpose yards as a junior. Jones, a Walter Payton Award candidate, established nine school records and two conference marks last year. He was named to the Associated Press Division I-AA All-America team. Gudmundsen, a 6-foot-6, 315-pound left tackle, blocked for an offense that ranked seventh nationally in rushing at 252.3 yards per game, plus led the Northeast Conference in scoring and total offense. Both players were previously named to The Sports Network preseason All-America squad.

Seven UAlbany players were picked to the Football Gazette second team. Right tackle **Mike Laroche** (Queensbury), fullback **Jon George** (Burnt Hills-Ballston Lake), flanker **Matt Crudo** (LaSalle Institute) and center **Brandon Shaw** represent the offense. Defensive end **John Bolt** (Watervliet), defensive tackle **David Parks** and roverback **Kurt Campbell** helped the Great Danes rank fifth among Division I-AA teams in rushing defense at 92.8 yards per game.

Albany, the defending NEC and ECAC champion, are slated to open preseason camp on August 14. The Great Danes begin their 11-game schedule on Saturday, September 6 against Northeastern, last year's Atlantic-10 Conference co-champion.

Albany's Bove, Stony Brook's Payne Named America East Top Scholar-Athletes

BOSTON- University at Albany senior Emil Bove and Stony Brook University senior Jenny Payne were named the 2002-03 America East Men's and Women's Scholar-Athletes of the Year it was announced today by Chris Monasch, Commissioner of America East. Bove, a co-captain on the America East Champion men's lacrosse team, was also the Men's Scholar-Athlete of the Year last season and is the first repeat selection since the program was instituted in 1996-97.

A committee of athletics administrators and NCAA Faculty Athletics Representatives chose the honorees from the Scholar-Athletes of each of the 21 championship sports offered by America East. Those 21 were selected from the nearly 3,700 student-athletes who competed at America East institutions last year.

Bove, who recently graduated with a perfect 4.0 cumulative grade-point average as a public policy and economics major, was one of 29 men chosen from all the spring sports in NCAA Division I, II and III to receive an NCAA postgraduate scholarship. The Seneca Falls, N.Y. native was also a Verizon Academic All-America choice and was awarded the ECAC Merit Medal as Albany's top senior male student-athlete. He also received the University at Albany's Outstanding Senior Award, the Chancellor's Award for Student Excellence, and the Athletes Leadership Award. A defender, Bove was an all-championship selection after leading the Great Danes to the 2003 America East Championship and the program's first appearance in the NCAA Division I Men's Lacrosse Championship.

Payne, the 2002 America East Cross Country Champion after finishing with the sixth-best time in conference history, recently graduated with a 3.85 grade-point average as a biology major. She earned All-America honors at the NCAA Division I Women's Cross Country Championship after finishing 23rd in that event. The Cary, N.C. native was one of 29 women chosen from all the fall sports in NCAA Division I, II and III to receive an NCAA postgraduate scholarship. She was also a Verizon Academic All-America selection last season and was named Stony Brook University's Female Athlete of the Year in each of the past two years. Like Bove, she was cited for a Chancellor's Award for Student Excellence.





Johnson, a 5-foot-8 guard from Chicago, Ill., averaged 13 points, two steals and nearly two assists a game for Olive Harvey College in Chicago. Johnson, who will have two years of eligibility remaining, averaged 18 points, three steals and six rebounds her freshman year in addition to being named to the New Mexico Junior Basketball Classic all-tournament team.

"Stacy Johnson will be an offensive power for us next season," stated Patterson, who is getting ready for her second year at the helm. "She is a phenomenal scorer who has a passion for the game. Stacy brings great leadership and experience with her from her two years spent at a junior college."

Johnson was an all-sectional and all-city performer at Von-Steuben High School in Chicago, where she averaged 22 points a game as a senior. She was named her team's most valuable player and invited to play in the Northwest All-Star game.

UAlbany has added four players to the roster since last fall. **Tanya James**, a 5-foot-7 guard from Toronto, Ontario signed during the spring, while **Lyndsay Clark**, a 6-foot-2 forward/center from Dixfield, Maine, and **Nicole Scipione**, a 5-foot-11 guard from State College, Pa., committed in the fall.

McElroy Named President of America East Executive Committee, Scarano Added as Member At-Large

BOSTON— Dr. Lee A. McElroy, Jr., Director of Athletics and Recreation at the University at Albany, has been named president of the America East Conference Executive Committee for the 2003-04 academic year. McElroy, who served as Vice President during 2002-03, replaces Gary Strickler, Athletic Director at Boston University, whose term as president ended at the conclusion of the conference's annual meeting in Burlington, Vt. July 1-3. The executive committee also announced that Martin Scarano, Director of Athletics at University of New Hampshire, has been chosen as the member at large to the committee.

The five-member executive committee also includes Dr. Joel Thirer, Director of Health, Physical Education, Recreation and Athletics at Binghamton University and Vice President of the committee, Strickler, as past president, and Dr. Richard Hall, the NCAA Faculty Athletics Representative at Albany.

The America East Executive Committee has the supervision and responsibility of all affairs of the conference not handled by the full board of directors and oversees most business operations, including the annual audit. It also serves as an advisory board to the commissioner.

McElroy, as president, will be the Executive Officer of America East. He will preside over all conference meetings and have the authority, upon formal action by the board of directors, to execute any and all legal instruments given on behalf of the conference. He has the power to call meetings of the board of directors and will make a full and complete report of the work of the conference and the actions of the board of directors at the annual meeting of the conference.

McElroy, who has more than 30 years of experience in athletic and educational administrations, began his fourth year as Albany's Director of Athletics and Recreation on July 6. He was previously the Director of Athletics at American University for four years. McElroy has gained national prominence for his roles with numerous professional organizations and NCAA Committees. He is currently serving a three-year term on the Division I Management Council as one of four at-large representatives from Division I-AA or I-AAA. The 49-member council adopts operating bylaws and rules to govern Division I and develops and manages the Division I budget.

"I am excited about this opportunity to serve as the President of America East," said McElroy. "With the recent conference championship expansion and the addition of UMBC to the membership it is an exciting time for the conference. The future of America East, plus the many challenges we face on the field and in the classroom will continue to be discussed. I know the administrators, coaches and student-athletes at all 10 America East schools will be up to the task ahead."

Thirer, who has served at Binghamton since 1989, will perform the duties of president in the absence of McElroy or in the event of his inability or refusal to act. Thirer also holds an adjunct appointment as a professor in the Psychology Department at Binghamton.

Scarano, who was elected by a vote of the 2002-03 executive committee, begins his fourth year as Director of Athletics at New Hampshire on July 17. He previously was Director of Athletics at Colorado College from 1996-2000.

Strickler has served as Athletic Director at Boston University since 1989 and began his tenure at Boston University in the School of Management in 1969.

Hall, a Distinguished Service Professor in Albany's Sociology Department, is in the second year of a two-year term as the Faculty Athletics Representative to the committee.

America East will consist of 10 institutions in 2003-04: Albany, Binghamton, Boston University, University of Hartford, University of Maine, University of Maryland, Baltimore County (UMBC); New Hampshire, Northeastern University, Stony Brook University and University of Vermont. Quinnipiac University is an associate member in men's lacrosse.

EMIL BOVE, THERESA MASSE & ALISSA GIBBS HONORED AS AMERICA EAST SCHOLAR-ATHLETES FOR THE SECOND CONSECUTIVE YEAR

Albany, N.Y. – University at Albany's **Emil Bove**, **Theresa Masse** and **Alissa Gibbs** have been recognized as America East Conference Scholar-Athletes in their respective sports, as announced today by Commissioner Chris Monasch. Bove (men's lacrosse), Masse (women's lacrosse) and Gibbs (volleyball) were each named for the second consecutive year.

Bove was recently awarded a NCAA postgraduate scholarship and named to the Verizon Academic All-America Men's At-Large national first team, as selected by CoSIDA (College Sports Information Directors of America). A Phi Beta Kappa student, Bove was awarded an ECAC Merit Medal as the school's top senior male student-athlete with a 4.00 cumulative grade point average in public policy and economics. Bove, as a senior defenseman, led the Great Danes to the 2003 America East Conference men's lacrosse championship and the program's first-ever NCAA tournament appearance. He led a defensive unit that allowed 9.75 goals per game, and was a member of the America East all-tournament team.

Masse, who has a 3.69 GPA in psychology, was voted to the Academic All-District I Women's At-Large second team. She earned first-team All-America East honors as a women's lacrosse defender, and ranked among the conference leaders in ground balls at 2.94 per game. She plans to pursue a master's degree in elementary education.

A two-time Verizon District I all-academic selection, Gibbs posted a 3.55 GPA in computer science. She was chosen first-team All-America East Conference as an outside hitter in volleyball for the second straight year. Gibbs finished her career second in kills (1,376) and fourth in digs (992) on the school's all-time lists. She shared the University's top senior female student-athlete award with Masse.

A committee of athletics administrators and NCAA Faculty Athletics Representatives chose the honorees from the nearly 3,700 student-athletes who competed at America East institutions during the 2002-03 academic year. Each honoree was a starter or prominent reserve on his or her team and has a minimum cumulative grade point average of 3.20.

UALBANY'S EMIL BOVE RECEIVES NCAA POSTGRADUATE SCHOLARSHIP

Indianapolis, Ind. – University at Albany's **Emil Bove**, a co-captain on this year's men's lacrosse team, has been awarded a NCAA postgraduate scholarship. Bove, who received his undergraduate degree in May with a 4.00 cumulative grade point average in a dual major of public policy and economics, was one of 29 men who participated in a spring sport at NCAA Division I, II and III levels to receive a scholarship of \$6,900.

To qualify for a NCAA postgraduate scholarship, a student-athlete must have an overall GPA of 3.200 (on a 4.000 scale) or its equivalent and must have performed with distinction as a member of a varsity team in the sport in which the student-athlete was nominated. The student-athlete must have behaved both on and off the field, in a manner that has brought credit to the student-athlete, institution and intercollegiate athletics.

A native of Seneca Falls, N.Y., Bove was recently named to the Verizon Academic All-America Men's At-Large national first team, as selected by CoSIDA (College Sports Information Directors of America). A Phi Beta Kappa student, Bove was awarded an ECAC Merit Medal as the school's top senior male student-athlete in the 2002-03 academic year. He also received the University's Outstanding Senior Award, Chancellor's Award for Student Excellence and Athletes Leadership Award.

Bove, as a senior defenseman, led the Great Danes to the 2003 America East Conference championship and the program's first-ever NCAA tournament appearance. Bove, who was third on team with 45 ground balls and led a defensive unit that allowed 9.75 goals per game, was a member of the America East all-tournament team. Albany tied a school record for single-season victories at 10-6 overall.

JONES, LAROCHE & GUDMUNDSEN ON SPORTS NETWORK PRESEASON TEAM Philadelphia, Pa. – University at Albany tailback Gary Jones (Ravena-Coeymans-Selkirk) and offensive tackles Geir Gudmundsen and Mike Laroche (Queensbury) have been named to The Sports Network Division I-AA Mid-Major Preseason All-America Football Team.

Jones, a 5-foot-10, 215-pound running back, rushed for a school-record 1,509 yards, scored 23 touchdowns and accounted for 1,949 all-purpose yards as a junior. Jones, who established nine school single-season marks and two conference records as the Northeast Conference offensive player of the year, was chosen to the Associated Press, Sports Network and Football Gazette All-America teams. He is expected to begin this season on the Walter Payton Award "Watch List." The Payton Award recognizes the most outstanding college football player on the Division I-AA level.
