Minutes of meeting held Saturday, April 24th, 1909, at 2:30 P. M.

The meeting came to order promptly in the office of the Commissioner of Education, all members present and Commissioner Draper in the chair.

The minutes of previous meeting were approved as read.

Mr. Cogswell and Ir. Ward, having been appointed at the last meeting a committee concerning the procuring and housing of coal, made their report, recommending that a scales be purchased from the Fairbanks Company for the sum of \$265.00; that the coal be purchased by weight and not by measurement as heretofore; that the coal-pocket be not enlarged this year because the estimate for doing so amounted to \$4,220, which is a larger sum than we have at our disposal; and that requests for bids be sent to all of the principal dealers in Albany without unnecessary delay. The report was accepted and its recommendations adopted.

Mr. Finegan offered the following resolution which was duly adopted:

RESOLVED that the Commissioner of Education be and he hereby is authorized to sign or execute any petitions or papers in behalf of this Board, which may be necessary to legally authorize the repaving of that portion of Washington Avenue, which adjoins the grounds of the State Normal College.

Mr. Finegan reported progress in the matter of laying out walks and roads on the new College grounds, presenting a plan prepared by the State Architect. Certain changes were agreed upon and Mr. Finegan was instructed to close the contract and have the work done as soon as possible.

After discussion of the matter, Mr. Finegan moved that at the close of the present school year all courses below the High School be discontinued.

The motion was carried.

The matter of establishing departments and making appointments to fill them for the ensuing year was next taken up, and the following conclusions were reached:

That in the Department of Ancient Languages, Dr. Leonard W. Richardson be appointed Professor at his present salary of \$2500;

That in the Department of Modern Languages Mr. Winfred C. Decker be appointed Assistant Professor at a salary of \$1500, and Miss H. Louise McCutcheon also Assistant Professor at a salary of \$1000;

That in the Department of English the President look for and recommend a Professor at a salary not to exceed \$2500, and Mrs. Margaret E. Mooney be appointed Assistant Professor at a salary of \$1100;

That in the Department of Pedagogy, Psychology and Philosphy, Dr. William the Assistant of \$2000.
B. Assinwall be appointed Professor, his salary to be determined later, and that the President look for and recommend an Assistant Professor at a salary not to exceed \$1500; and that Miss anna & Pierre be appointed Assistant in Elementary Education.

That in the Department of Mathematics, Prof. A. N. Husted be continued at his present salary of \$2500, and Mr. Harry Birchenough be appointed Assistant Professor at a salary of \$1500;

That in the Department of Commercial Branches William V. Jones be appointed Professor at his present salary of \$2300;

That in the Department of History the President recommend hereafter someone as Professor at a salary not to exceed \$2500; and that David Hutchison be appointed Assistant Professor at a salary of \$1500; and Miss May U. M. Chilland, hist. and Librarian at \$1000.

That in the Department of Covernment and Economics no full Professor be appointed at present, but that Mr. Adam A. Walker be appointed Assistant Professor at a salary of \$1400;

That in the Department of Natural Sciences Professor E. W. Wetmore be continued at his present salary of \$2500 and that Mr. Clifford A. Woodard be appointed Assistant Professor at a salary of \$1500 and Barnard S. Bronson also
