DEFEAT ALBANY, 11-6 Albany, N.Y. – Mary Beth Miller scored three first-half goals and added two assists in leading Boston University to an 11-6 America East Conference victory over Albany on Friday afternoon at Varsity Field. The Terriers clinched a berth in next week's conference postseason tournament.

Boston U. (7-9, AE 4-1) led 2-1 early in the opening period, but then tallied four consecutive goals over an eight-minute stretch. **Kaitlyn Cuneo** scored unassisted on a spin move from the left side, before Miller connected on back-to-back goals, including a free-position shot. **Lindsay Lewis**, who had two goals and two assists, finished off the run by cutting to the top of the crease.

Albany (5-10, AE 2-3) closed within four goals on three occasions after that outburst, including 7-3 at halftime. Senior midfielder **Alexis DiDomenico** converted a fastbreak pass from **Kate Fontana** for her second goal of the game, and the Great Danes cut the deficit to 10-6 with 6:39 remaining.

Albany, N.Y. – Junior **Derek DeGrazio** drove in four runs, including a fourth inning three-run double, in UAlbany's 8-1 victory over Central Connecticut State in non-conference play on Thursday afternoon at Varsity Field.

UALBANY SOFTBALL SWEEPS VERMONT IN AMERICA EAST TWINBILL

Burlington, Vt. – Senior pitcher **Andee Lindgren** tossed a two-hit shutout in the opener and drove in five runs to lead UAlbany to a 14-5 win in the nightcap over Vermont in America East Conference softball action on Thursday, April 28 at Archie Post Field. The Great Danes won the opener 7-0 to claim the season-series against the Catamounts.

UAlbany (28-15, AE 14-1) scored seven runs in the first inning of the nightcap as Lindgren, who finished 5-for-6 at the plate with two doubles and six RBI for the day, cleared the bases on a three-run double and later scored on a passed ball. UALBANY ATHLETES RECEIVE CHANCELLOR'S SCHOLAR-ATHLETE AWARDS

Albany, N.Y. – State University of New York Chancellor Robert L. King announced today that five University at Albany student-athletes are recipients of the Chancellor's Scholar-Athlete Award. UAlbany athletes honored are **Victor Camacho** (football), **Rhonda Corcoran** (women's field hockey), **Jill Friedman** (women's golf), **Kevin Rae** (men's lacrosse) and **Paul Roche** (men's track & field).

The Chancellor's Scholar-Athlete Award recognizes a combination of academic excellence and outstanding athletic achievement. The winners were selected by the athletic directors at SUNY's Division I institutions. The awards program, co-sponsored by USA Today, takes place this evening at the State University Plaza in Albany.

Camacho, a senior from New York City, has a 3.77 cumulative grade point average in business administration with a finance concentration. He had a team-high 94 tackles from his inside linebacker position in leading UAlbany to a share of its second consecutive Northeast Conference championship in 2003. An All-NEC selection, Camacho was named to the CoSIDA Academic All-America national first team, and was the NEC's Scholar-Athlete of the Year in football.

Corcoran, a senior from Camden, N.Y., has a 3.80 GPA in psychology. She served as a co-captain on the UAlbany field hockey team, and was a starter in 18 of 19 games played as a defender. She was chosen to the National Field Hockey Coaches Association National All-Academic Team.

Friedman, a junior golfer from Liverpool, N.Y., posted a 3.64 GPA in business administration. She tied for 11th at last weekend's Northeast Championships, and is averaging 85.4 strokes per round during the fall-spring schedule. The Great Danes will compete at the first-ever America East Conference championships on May 3-4.

Rae, a junior goalkeeper on the men's lacrosse team from Yorktown Heights, N.Y., is majoring in business administration/finance and owns a 3.28 GPA. He ranks 12th among the NCAA Division I leaders with a .600 save percentage, plus leads the America East in saves at 14.5 per game. Rae, who tied a season-best with 19 saves against Syracuse last Saturday, has twice been chosen as the conference's player of the week this spring.

Roche, a senior from Niskayuna, N.Y., has a 3.07 GPA in economics with minors in psychology and business administration. He won the long jump with a leap of 23-feet, 2.5-inches at the 2004 America East Conference Indoor Track & Field Championships. Roche was also second in the 55-meter hurdles, as the Great Danes captured their second consecutive conference indoor team title.

JILL DEDMAN NAMED UALBANY WOMEN'S FIELD HOCKEY ASSISTANT COACH

Albany, N.Y. -- University at Albany head women's field hockey coach Phil Sykes announced today the hiring of former Boston College standout and national team member Jill Dedman as assistant coach.

Dedman, a native of Orange, Conn., played for the U.S. National Field Hockey Team from June 2001 to September 2003 as a goalkeeper. She competed at several major international events, including the 2002 World Cup in Perth, Australia. During her time with the national team, Dedman worked with the under-23 national team goalkeepers and coached members of the National Futures program.

As a collegiate player, Dedman was a two-time Big East Conference Goalkeeper of the Year, including her senior season, when she recorded a 1.40 goals against average, six shutouts and 141 saves. ANDEE LINDGREN NAMED AMERICA EAST SOFTBALL PITCHER OF THE WEEK Boston, Mass. -- University at Albany's Andee Lindgren has been selected as the America East Conference Pitcher of the Week in softball as announced on Monday afternoon by the conference office.

Lindgren, a senior from La Habra, Calif., leads UAlbany in both pitching and hitting with a 1.13 ERA and .424 batting average, respectively. #6 SYRACUSE DOWNS UALBANY, 18-8, IN MEN'S LACROSSE ACTION

Syracuse, N.Y. – **Michael Powell** tied a career high with five goals and added one assist in leading No. 6 Syracuse to an 18-8 victory over UAlbany on Saturday afternoon before 4,926 fans at the Carrier Dome.

Syracuse (9-2) raced to a 7-1 lead midway through the second quarter. Powell, a three-time first-team All-American, scored three times in that stretch. He gave his team a 4-0 advantage with 1:40 left in the opening period when he broke up defenseman **Roy Vaccaro's** pass to goalkeeper **Kevin Rae** and found and empty net while falling to the turf. Powell, the nation's second-leading scorer, also added a backhanded goal from the right side with 12:33 left in the second period.

Albany (8-4) reeled off three consecutive goals to close within 7-4 with 5:23 left before the intermission. Senior attack **Michael Solazzo**, who had a pair of goals, netted a 14-yard blast, before **Brendan Russell** connected on a bounce shot off a drive in the middle.

The Orangemen, who were coming off a 14-10 loss to Rutgers one week ago, then took control with seven of the game's next eight goals. Leading 8-4 at halftime, Syracuse tallied three unanswered goals in a one minute-and-19-second span early in the third quarter. Defenseman **Scott Ditzell** found the cage in transition following one of goalkeeper **Jay Pfeifer's** 14 saves. **Brian Crockett**, who had two goals and two assists, then scored back to back, with the first goal resulting after an Albany turnover at midfield. Later Powell's fifth goal of the game gave his team a 14-5 lead, as he beat two defenders and nailed a spinning shot inside the left post.

"Syracuse is very athletic and plays good individual defense," said UAlbany coach **Scott Marr**, whose team had its four game win streak stopped, but will still play Binghamton for the America East Conference regular-season title at home next Saturday. THOMSON SETS RECORD WITH EIGHT GOALS IN 21-13 VICTORY OVER HARTFORD

West Hartford, Conn. – Freshman attack **Merrick Thomson** (Albany Academy) set the school's single-game record with eight goals and added three assists in leading Albany to a 21-13 America East Conference victory over Hartford on Wednesday evening at Al-Marzook Field. The Great Danes moved into sole possession of second place in the league standings and clinched a berth in the upcoming conference postseason tournament.

Albany (8-3, AE 4-1) led 11-9 midway through the third quarter, but then reeled off seven consecutive goals to take control. Thomson set up **Luke Daquino** with the manadvantage to begin the run with 6:51 left in the stanza. He then scored both unassisted and on an extra-man opportunity 56 seconds apart.

LACROSSE'S KEVIN RAE NAMED AMERICA EAST CO-PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Boston, Mass. – University at Albany's **Kevin Rae** has been chosen as the America East Conference Co-Player of the Week in men's lacrosse as announced on Monday afternoon by the conference office. Rae received the award for the second time this season. In addition, **Frank Resetarits** was named the conference's rookie of the week.

Rae, a junior goalkeeper from Yorktown Heights, N.Y., made a season-high 19 saves, including eight in the fourth quarter, in last Saturday's 9-6 America East victory over Vermont. UALBANY WINS THIRD STRAIGHT WITH 9-6 VICTORY OVER VERMONT

Albany, N.Y. – Freshman attack **Frank Resetarits** had two goals and two assists and **Kevin Rae** made a season-high 19 saves in leading Albany to its third straight win with a 9-6 America East Conference victory over Vermont on Saturday afternoon at University Field. The Great Danes moved into a tie for second place in the conference standings.

Albany (7-3, AE 3-1) used a five-goal first quarter to build a 6-1 halftime lead. Junior attack **Luke Daquino**, who had one goal and two assists, and Resetarits combined on their team's first two scores. **Chris Martocchia** and **Michael Solazzo** added unassisted goals, before Resetarits found an empty net with the man-advantage following a failed clear.

The Great Danes, who have won six of their last seven contests, pushed out a 6-0 lead early in the second quarter, when freshman attack **Merrick Thomson** (Albany Academy) scored off Daquino's crossing pass in a two-man advantage situation. Albany would maintain a 7-2 lead heading into the fourth quarter.

Vermont (4-7, AE 1-2) would pull within three goals on three separate occasions in the final period. **Denning Coates** and **R.J. Harrison** scored 19 seconds apart to close the gap to 7-4 with less than one minute elapsed in the stanza. Albany's Thomson, who had two goals and one assist, then connected on an extra-man opportunity from the right side of the crease with 6:48 left.

After the teams traded goals over the next four minutes, Vermont's **Sean Layton** rifled a spinning, 18-yard blast into the net to cut the deficit to 9-6 with 2:08 remaining. The Catamounts, who won the shots-on-goal battle, 40-27, had two extra-man chances in the stretch, but Rae turned aside eight shots in the final quarter to keep the lead safe.

Vermont goalkeeper **Mike Gabel** had 12 saves, as his team used an effective double-team defense to control the flow of the game in the second half. Harrison, a senior midfielder, finished with one goal and one assist.

Albany (4-8, AE 1-1) took a 7-6 lead with 54 seconds elapsed in the final period on a free-position shot by freshman attack **Krissy Rajczak** (Scotia-Glenville), who had two goals and two assists.

UALBANY RALLIES IN FOURTH QUARTER FOR 12-9 VICTORY OVER YALE

Albany, N.Y. – Junior attacker **Luke Daquino** scored two of his season-high three goals in the fourth quarter, as Albany rallied for a 12-9 non-league victory over Yale on Wednesday evening at University Field. The Great Danes played under the lights at home for the first time in the program's 35-year history.

Yale's **Ned Britt** finished with two goals, both in the first half, and had two assists, while Schecter scored once and assisted on two others. **Chris Martocchia** had two goals and one assist for the Great Danes, who have won five of their last six outings.

ANDEE LINDGREN NAMED AMERICA EAST SOFTBALL PLAYER OF THE WEEK Boston, Mass. -- University at Albany's Andee Lindgren has been selected as the America East Conference Player of the Week in softball as announced on Monday afternoon by the conference office.

Lindgren, a senior from La Habra, Calif., leads UAlbany in both pitching and hitting with a 1.23 ERA and .414 batting average, respectively. She owns a 10-2 record in 15 appearances this season on the mound, plus has hurled 10 complete games and one shutout. Lindgren, who earned America East pitcher of the week honors on March 23, has allowed only 15 earned runs this year and has amassed 96 strikeouts. The Falcons were also a semifinalist at the prestigious Nike Cup tournament and a Super Y-League national qualifier. Elmo, who is currently playing with the East Fishkill Rebels, was on the Hudson Valley Scholastic team at the New York State Empire Games for the past three years, leading the team to a bronze medal in 2002 and silver in 2003. UALBANY BEGINS SPRING FOOTBALL PRACTICE ON MONDAY, APRIL 12

Albany, N.Y. – University at Albany head coach Bob Ford's fifth spring practice at the Division I-AA level might be his most challenging for his program. Ford must replace 11 starters -- six on offense and five on defense -- from a 7-4 squad that shared its second consecutive Northeast Conference championship.

The list of graduates includes the school's all-time rusher and two-time NEC offensive player of the year Gary Jones, All-America offensive tackle Mike Laroche, All-NEC defensive tackle David Parks, linebacker Victor Camacho, the team's leading tackler, and kicker/punter Stan Zylinski.

"We lost some quality people to graduation, and that group of seniors will always hold a special place in my heart," states Ford, who has a 201-141-1 career record in 35 seasons at the collegiate level. "Every spring you have to fill positions, but also evaluate the younger players. On offense, the quarterback situation is just one of several positions that we need to take a hard look at. The defense is solid on paper, but we will experiment with personnel, especially on the line. All the kicking positions are up for grabs."

The Great Danes begin full-scale preparations for the 2004 season on Monday, April 12 with the first of 15 NCAA-allowed spring practices. The schedule runs through May 5.

OFFENSE: Albany's multiple, option scheme must replace its entire offensive backfield, including Associated Press All-America tailback Gary Jones. Fortunately, the Great Danes have a pair of All-NEC linemen returning.

Left tackle **Geir Gudmundsen** (6-6, 315), who has made 33 consecutive starts, was named to two All-America teams. **Brandon Shaw** (6-0, 295) is a highly valued performer with his ability to play at center and left guard. Both players were instrumental in helping the offense rank fourth nationally in rushing at 292.3 yards per game.

Uli Delgado (Gloversville H.S.) and **Nicholas Bazan** will battle for the starting quarterback job during the spring. "We need to throw the ball better than we did a year ago and be improved in the decision-making process," Ford says. Delgado, who started five games, passed for 284 yards and ran for 95 more. Bazan missed all but one game last year with a broken collarbone.

Rohann Vidal and **David Fantell** are expected to be the leading candidates at tailback. Vidal, a three-year letterman, rushed for 370 yards and five touchdowns as a junior. The fullback spot will be decided between a pair of redshirt freshmen in **Wayne Carrabus** and **Dan Beigel**.

ALBANY SPRING FOOTBALL 2-2-2

Split end **Jason Miller** led the Great Danes with 15 receptions for 321 yards and two touchdowns, plus along with flanker **Joel Howarth** became a solid blocking tandem in the run game. Young receivers like **Ronnie DeAraujo** (6-2, 185) will also press for playing time. **Tom Burkart** (Averill Park) looks like the man to beat at tight end at 6-foot-4 and 230 pounds.

DEFENSE: The Great Danes' defense probably turned in its best season as a Division I-AA unit in 2003, and were among the national leaders in scoring and rushing against.

Brian Becker (Saratoga Springs), the team's most improved player, emerged as a top-notch linebacker. Becker (5-11, 225) was second on the team in tackles with 63, plus added two sacks and two interceptions. **Will Boone** had 40 tackles despite missing three games with an injury. Redshirt freshman **Colin Disch** (6-1, 203) has moved to the inside.

A healthy **Kurt Campbell** (6-1, 225) gives the defense an all-conference type roverback. Campbell, plagued by injuries as a collegian, has combined for 86 tackles and 16 pass break-ups during his career. **Tom Cuozzo** (31 tackles) filled in admirably for Campbell last year and will move to outside linebacker. **Chris Stellato** (31 tackles) can also play both positions. **Trevor DuPont**, a redshirt freshman, should move up the depth chart.

Three starters have graduated on the defensive line, but tackles **Matt Kryzak** (6-0, 295), of Albany Academy, and **Justin Sands** (6-1, 285) have seen many downs in the trenches. Kryzak made 22 tackles and 3.0 sacks last year, while Sands had 25 tackles, including eight for losses. **Jermaine Lee** (30 tackles, 3.5 sacks) has tremendous ability.

Andre Coleman (14 tackles, 3.0 sacks, could become a dominating player at defensive end. Eddie Unverzagt, a converted fullback, and redshirt freshman Kelsey Jenks will try the end spot during the spring.

The team's deepest positions may be in the secondary. Starting corner-backs **Kamar Elliott** (27 tackles) and **Ryan Chrobak** both return. Chrobak, a former receiver, was fifth on the squad in tackles (47) and added eight pass break-ups. **Lucas Kurtz** (55 tackles, 15 PBUs) has the size, at 6-foot-3 and 210 pounds, to be an imposing free safety.

KICKING GAME: Stan Zylinski did all of the kicking and punting last year. **Joe lannello** and **John Neuberger** (Scotia-Glenville) will work on their skills in the spring, before the incoming freshmen can help out.

Freshman right-hander **Casey Halloran** (Columbia) earned her second straight victory, giving up three earned runs on six hits in the complete-game effort. Halloran walked two and struck out a season-high seven batters.

Albany travels to Stony Brook, N.Y. to face conference-foe Stony Brook on Friday, April 9 in a doubleheader match-up. Game time is set for 12:00 noon.
