
# Future Homemakers of America



This year, Future Homemakers of America (FHA) did not do too well. The club needed more members who were involved and interested. Hopefully, next year FHA will expand and improve.


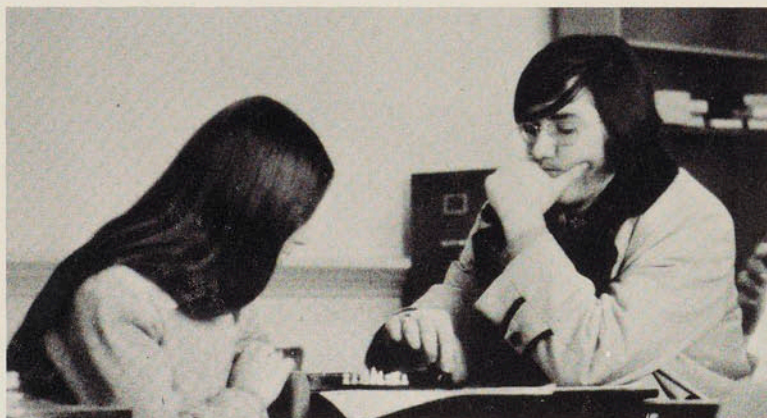

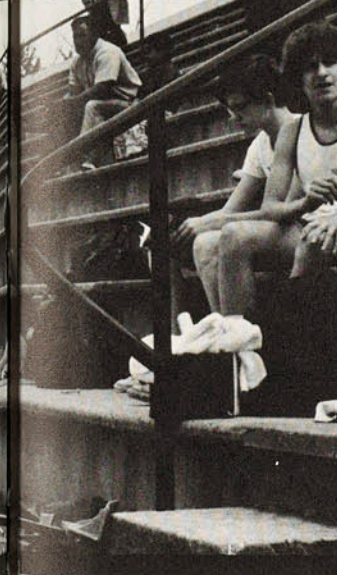
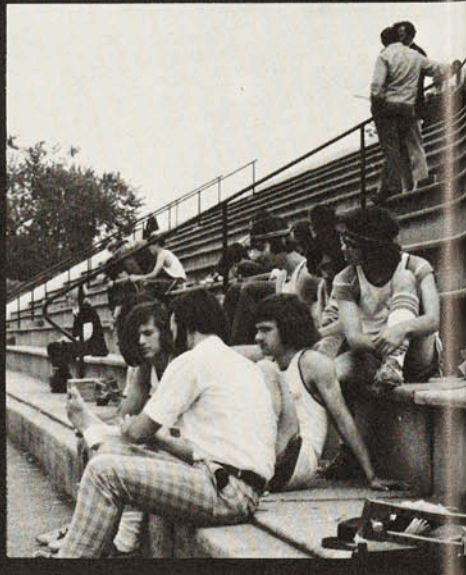
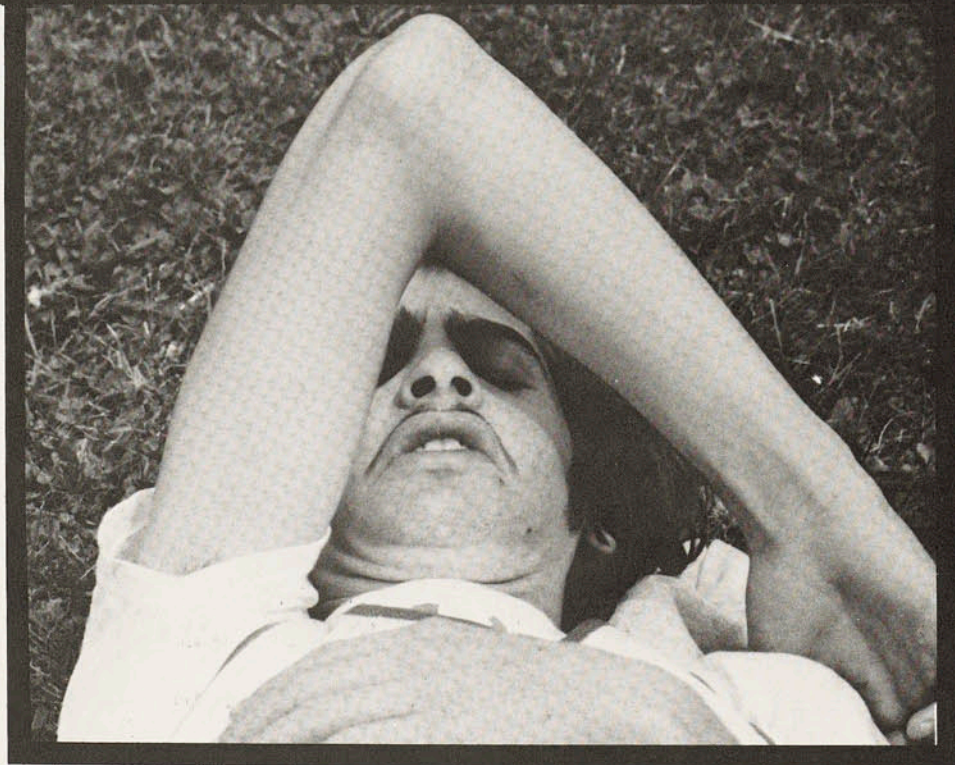
## Track and Cross Country
