Program title New Title: Educational Policy and Leadership

We are requesting a change in the title of the academic program in order to have it reflect the current state of the educational field and the role of the program in preparing educational leaders and policy analysts. The program prepares students for a range of leadership and policy careers across the cradle to career educational spectrum, including schools, colleges, universities, non-profit organizations, non-government organizations, and state and national education policy units. It is important to note that this program does not provide a pathway to educational administrative licensure in the State of NY.

However, students have pursued the MS degree as a complement to the licensure program and many of our students come from international locations and return to their countries to provide leadership in both the K12 and higher educational sectors. While we are seeking to shift from educational administration to educational leadership, we wish to retain the term "policy" as this reflects a significant component of the work of the program and continues to be a relevant descriptor.

The broader educational field, including academic programs at other colleges and universities, has also shifted from the use of educational administration to educational leadership to represent the broadening

focus on preparing leaders for a range of educational organizations. Therefore, a name change will make us more competitive and current with our colleagues locally and across the country.

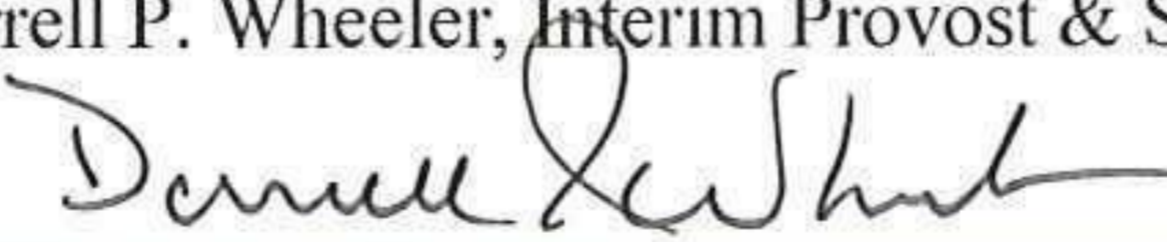

Program title New Title: Educational Policy and Leadership

We are requesting a change in the title of the academic program in order to have it reflect the current state of the educational field and the role of the program in preparing educational leaders and policy analysts. The program prepares students for a range of leadership and policy careers across the cradle to career educational spectrum, including schools, colleges, universities, non-profit organizations, non-government organizations, and state and national education policy units. It is important to note that this program does not provide a pathway to educational administrative licensure in the State of NY. However, students have pursued the PhD degree as a complement to the licensure program and many of our students come from international locations and return to their countries to provide leadership in both the K12 and higher educational sectors. While we are seeking to shift from educational administration to educational leadership, we wish to retain the term "policy" as this reflects a significant component of the work of the program and continues to be a relevant descriptor.

The broader educational field, including academic programs at other colleges and universities, has also shifted from the use of educational administration to educational leadership to represent the broadening focus on preparing leaders for a range of educational organizations. Therefore, a name change will make us more competitive and current with our colleagues locally and across the country.
