The committee met at the call of the chairman.

Dr. Jacob S. Morley having been appointed a member of the committee on the 15th day of January ^{last.} in place of George Dyan, deceased ^{and} appeared & took his seat.

The minutes of the last meeting were read & approved.

A communication from Prof. Kimball, resigning his position as Professor of Mathematics to accept a similar Professorship in the Brocklyn Collegiate & Polytechnic Institute was read. The resignation was accepted.

A communication from Miss Louisa Otis resigning the position as teacher in the school which she has held since April 12, 1852, to accept the appointment as Principal of the Albany Female Academy was read. The resignation was accepted.

The Secretary was directed to express to Prof. Kimball & Miss Otis the high estimate which they ^{the committee} entertain of the faithfulness and ability with which they have uniformly discharged their duties, and to assure them of that they carry with them to their new fields of labor the best wishes of the committee for their highest success & happiness.

On the recommendation of the President it was resolved that Albert N. Austin who has for several years been tutor in mathematics be appointed to the professorship made vacant by the resignation of Prof. Kimball, at a salary of eight hundred ^{dollars} without any extra allowance or compensation, and that William V. Jones, a graduate of the 48th term be appointed tutor in mathematics at a salary of One thousand dollars.

On the recommendation of the President it was
further resolved that Miss Mary M. McClannan
a graduate of the 24th term be appointed to
fill the vacancy occasioned by the resignation
of Miss O'Brien.

The Secretary was authorized to contract
with Jacob M. Wright to act as janitor in
place of William M. Cloy deceased. His
compensation to be fifty dollars a month
in agreeing to do all the work of keeping
the building clean without additional pay,
the contract to continue during the pleasure
of the Committee.

It was also resolved that two hundred and
fifty dollars be appropriated to the purchase
of additional Chemical & Philosophical ap-
paratus, under the direction of the Secretary
Dr. Nozier & Prof. Cooley.

It was also resolved that so long as Dr. Alden
shall continue to perform the extra services
as provided for by resolution of this Board of
July 12, 1869 that an extra allowance of
Two hundred & fifty dollars per term be
paid to him in addition to his salary
of Twenty five hundred dollars.

The Committee then adjourned.
