00:00:55.469 --> 00:01:01.379 you received an email from me explaining that after Spring Break, on March 23rd 00:01:01.379 --> 00:01:08.760 all UAlbany classes will be delivered remotely. This morning you received

00:01:08.760 --> 00:01:14.909 notice that we suspended classes today, Thursday. This was done as a precaution

00:01:14.909 --> 00:01:21.930 after we learned of a confirmed case of COVID 19 in our campus community. This

00:01:21.930 --> 00:01:26.189 individual will remain isolated from the campus population until they have been

00:01:26.189 --> 00:01:31.680 cleared by public health officials. Please know that we are working very

00:01:31.680 --> 00:01:36.900 closely with Albany County Department of Health to reach out to any student,

00:01:36.900 --> 00:01:43.290 faculty, or staff member who may have come in contact with this individual. As

00:01:43.290 --> 00:01:51.049 we also move forward we are coordinating very closely with SUNY admin. Also as a

00:01:51.049 --> 00:01:56.399 precaution we closed the business building today for cleaning and the

00:01:56.399 --> 00:02:02.549 building will be re-cleaned, if you will, this evening just to be safe. We expect

00:02:02.549 --> 00:02:07.560 that building to be open tomorrow morning for regular operations. It is

00:02:07.560 --> 00:02:13.920 critical that we reiterate as of now that our three campuses will remain

00:02:13.920 --> 00:02:20.670 open. The closure of the university can only take place at the direction of the

January or late January we have been tracking the students, faculty, and staff

January we have not had any faculty or staff returning from China and we had

00:05:30.750 --> 00:05:38.610 two students returning from China from our study abroad program. Because of the

00:05:38.610 --> 00:05:44.970 the way things have been unfolding with this very dynamic situation we decided

00:05:44.970 --> 00:05:52.590 to be strategic and start up a work group for COVID 19 in order to collect

00:05:52.590 --> 00:06:00.360 data and have information available to the President and to the campus at large.

As the situation started to really become much more, becoming more fluid and

00:06:09.990 --> 00:06:18.570 more dynamic we needed to then move up to a structure where we had the task

00:06:18.570 --> 00:06:24.840 force and this is the original work group that now has under it five sub

00:06:24.840 --> 00:06:30.990 groups. And I'll just go through those subgroups quickly so the first sub group

00:06:30.990 --> 00:06:37.040 or first overarching is the COVID 19 task force which is on the next slide and

00:06:37.040 --> 00:06:41.400 this task force is responsible for overall coordination

00:06:41.400 --> 00:06:48.210 of the task force, all communications are coming to the task force and flowing

00:06:48.210 --> 00:06:56.490 back down to the subgroups as well as up to the president's office, and our group

00:06:56.490 --> 00:07:03.300 is liaison with the Department of Health the County Health Office as well as SUNY

00:07:03.300 --> 00:07:11.430 and CDC. Of the subgroups, the first is the campus campus incident management

00:07:11.430 --> 00:07:16.440 team and this group is actually a standing committee of the campus and has

00:07:16.440 --> 00:07:22.500 representatives from divisions across the campus. They meet quarterly. Currently

00:07:22.500 --> 00:07:28.199 they are now focusing on COVID 19 and they are responsible for a detailed

00:07:28.199 --> 00:07:35.610 pandemic and campus closure plans for these divisions that are listed here. The

00:07:35.610 --> 00:07:40.949 next group is the study abroad academic support workgroup and they are tasked

00:07:40.949 --> 00:07:45.990 with finding ways for returning student, study abroad students, to complete the

00:07:45.990 --> 00:07:50.220 semester and complete their academic programs assist with withdrawal and

00:07:50.220 --> 00:07:56.490 reentry issues and any kind of financial impacts for these students. The next

00:07:56.490 --> 00:08:05.520 group is the impacted campus student support work group and they are

00:08:05.520 --> 00:08:09.990 responsible for identifying ways to support the current on-campus students

00:08:09.990 --> 00:08:15.690 who may be impacted by COVID 19, and this includes emotional and counseling

00:08:15.690 --> 00:08:22.080 support for the students and other supports for these students. The next

00:08:22.080 --> 00:08:28.229 group is the academic work group and they are working with faculty to move

00:08:28.229 --> 00:08:35.070 courses to remote learning platforms and you will hear after my presentation much

00:08:35.070 --> 00:08:40.650 more in-depth presentation from Dean Malatesta. And they are also developing

00:08:40.650 --> 00:08:46.200 resources for the faculty to support this transfer from in classroom to

00:08:46.200 --> 00:08:52.170 remote instruction. Advising will also be going online.

00:09:11.519 --> 00:09:19.230 points. The communications to date we've had multiple communications to students,

00:09:19.230 --> 00:09:24.449 faculty, staff, and their parents all of these communications are now archived on

00:09:24.449 --> 00:09:31.170 the information page which you can find on our front page of the website for the

UAlbany website and just to show you what this looks like on the next slide.

00:09:59.220 --> 00:10:02.459 sorry.
Yes, University Health Services they have

00:10:02.459 --> 00:10:12.060 their own web page as well with many links, many pages, for information more on

00:10:12.060 --> 00:10:17.610 COVID 19 and to answer any health questions or any questions that students

00:10:17.610 --> 00:10:23.130 may have as well as faculty. The risk management team is now fielding

00:10:23.130 --> 00:10:29.670 questions around COVID-19, the director of our campus medical services, she is in

00:10:29.670 --> 00:10:34.949 daily contact with Albany County Department of Health. Many of you joined

00:10:34.949 --> 00:10:42.120 us on the March 4th town hall meeting and we had excellent participation, great

00:10:42.120 --> 00:10:48.660 turnout, and we're actually considering having another Town Hall later in the

00:10:48.660 --> 00:10:54.300 coming weeks so but virtually. And this would probably be after Spring Break has

00:10:54.300 --> 00:11:01.860 is over. And we are currently having daily phone meetings with SUNY central

00:11:01.860 --> 00:11:04.490 administration.

00:11:06.410 --> 00:11:13.980 So far what we've found is that communication is key and making sure

00:11:13.980 --> 00:11:19.140 that communication is consistent. What we really need, love to have your help with

00:11:19.140 --> 00:11:26.510 this, is to encourage your faculty, staff, and students to read their emails.

We have most of our messaging through email, we also are using social media but

00:11:32.940 --> 00:11:36.660 because of the nature of social media it's not really providing, it's not a

00:11:36.660 --> 00:11:41.970 platform to provide, so much information and details. So really the best place to

00:11:41.970 --> 00:11:46.920 get information is through the emails. Those emails again are archived on the

00:11:46.920 --> 00:11:52.050 information page, so if you feel like you might have missed an email, please go to

00:11:52.050 --> 00:11:57.510 the information page. Because of growing concerns over students returning after

00:11:57.510 --> 00:12:02.790 the spring break, we are we are moving now to teaching and learning remotely as

00:12:02.790 --> 00:12:09.500 President Rodríguez mentioned, and will be detailed further by dean Malatesta.

Our campus really has very limited facilities to isolate students during

00:12:15.810 --> 00:12:22.650 the academic semester. Isolation requires a single bedroom with a private bath and

00:12:22.650 --> 00:12:27.600 we just don't have those type of facilities for housing students and so

00:12:27.600 --> 00:12:34.230 again limited facilities for isolation. And also transportation for students who

00:12:34.230 --> 00:12:42.300 may be affected, or are in isolation it'll be very difficult to transport

00:12:42.300 --> 00:12:47.190 them unless they are using private transportation so car, but not public

00:12:47.190 --> 00:13:00.270 transportation, train, plane, bus. Also the primary campus functions

00:13:00.270 --> 00:13:05.160 are finalizing their plans to address severe staffing shortages if staff

00:13:05.160 --> 00:13:12.440 become ill and primary campus functions including food services, animal services,

00:13:12.440 --> 00:13:19.650 the UPD, and really they're dropping all of their

00:13:19.650 --> 00:13:26.550 non-essential functions and just going to their primary campus functions.

00:13:26.550 --> 00:13:32.790 SED and DOE have really relaxed their regulations so this allows us to move

00:13:32.790 --> 00:13:40.560

our current courses to remote learning and teaching and we have some reprieve

00:13:40.560 --> 00:13:44.670 for the financial aid implications and that we could help our students during

00:13:44.670 --> 00:13:49.590 this time. For social gatherings of more than 50 people, local health departments

00:13:49.590 --> 00:13:56.690 really need to be consulted and help to guide you for any of these

00:13:56.690 --> 00:14:03.930 decisions about cancelling but also my office and the COVID 19 task force can

00:14:03.930 --> 00:14:15.540 help with guiding you. No work-related travel is allowed it in CDC level two or

00:14:15.540 --> 00:14:22.020 three countries, and also there is recommendation by the local health

00:14:22.020 --> 00:14:28.650 department for international non-CDC level two and three country travel to

00:14:28.650 --> 00:14:35.270 those countries. But everyone should really take note that earlier this week

00:14:35.270 --> 00:14:40.350 many of the countries in Europe did not even have a level, they were not level

00:14:40.350 --> 00:14:50.220 one, two, or three. But now, Thursday most of Europe is level two or three. So again

00:14:50.220 --> 00:14:56.010 the situation is really dynamic and changing quickly. We're trying to

00:14:56.010 --> 00:14:59.640 identify students, faculty, and staff who

have traveled to restricted areas

00:14:59.640 --> 00:15:04.350 because they have to be self isolating for 14 days upon return to the

00:15:04.350 --> 00:15:10.650 country. And another challenge is the shortage of masks, hand sanitizer, and

00:15:10.650 --> 00:15:17.730 other supplies that are really needed. There are challenges in terms of the

00:15:17.730 --> 00:15:23.820 impact of COVID 19 on summer and fall enrollments, where there are concerns

00:15:23.820 --> 00:15:30.300 about this and we are keeping an eye on enrollments. And one of the the

00:15:30.300 --> 00:15:34.830 big challenges in the coming weeks is getting the faculty, staff, and the

00:15:34.830 --> 00:15:40.310 students up and running in terms of learning and teaching remotely. And

00:15:40.310 --> 00:15:46.740 that's a perfect way to transition now to Dean Malatesta's presentation and

00:15:46.740 --> 00:16:02.640 I'll hold questions until after Dean Malatesta's presentation.

We are getting the slides up now. I have been asked to work with the campus community on

Academic Continuity as we begin this unique challenge in bringing our courses into a

00:16:13.920 --> 00:16:17.610 new environment. So on the next slide you start talking a little bit about the 00:16:17.610 --> 00:16:22.590 scope of this project. One of the first things we looked at is how many

00:16:22.590 --> 00:16:32.520 courses are we talking about, what do you need to do, we noted right away that

00:16:32.520 --> 00:16:39.240 there are about 2,500 courses that are enrolled at this point and we know that

00:16:39.240 --> 00:16:47.700 there are about 58,000 seats in those in those courses. Heavily lecture courses.

This is one of the things that we needed to know as we started to think about how

00:16:51.090 --> 00:16:56.250 we were going to go after working with courses remotely, what requirements

00:16:56.250 --> 00:17:04.470 that we needed. So about fifty eight thousand courses and we have

00:17:04.470 --> 00:17:08.280 just about just over a thousand faculty that are impacted, this is our entire

00:17:08.280 --> 00:17:12.840 campus community that we're looking at. It's a huge number of courses, huge

00:17:12.840 --> 00:17:16.560 numbers seats, so again for faculty and students we wanted to take into account

00:17:16.560 --> 00:17:20.820 what we needed to look at as we began to tackle the problem how we're going to

00:17:20.820 --> 00:17:24.740 move these things forward. So on the next slide we talk about the leadership

00:17:24.740 --> 00:17:31.140 component, and the Provost office, as Provost Kim said, it will be leading and

00:17:31.140 --> 00:17:36.120 coordinating the academic continuity component of what we're doing and I've

00:17:36.120 --> 00:17:39.570 been charged to work very closely with the schools and the colleges. The schools

00:17:39.570 --> 00:17:44.370 and the colleges are developing academic continuity implementation plans.

00:17:44.370 --> 00:17:47.730 They are already moving forward, they've done a wonderful job setting up

00:17:47.730 --> 00:17:51.830 leadership teams, a number of courses have already been rolled into remote

00:17:51.830 --> 00:17:57.090 teaching options. They're coordinating communications both within school and

00:17:57.090 --> 00:18:00.570 college and then of course with with the University as well. We're trying to

00:18:00.570 --> 00:18:04.710 maintain a consistent message to our students and to our faculty about how

00:18:04.710 --> 00:18:09.029 we're going to be moving forward. So one of the things we want to talk about is

00:18:09.029 --> 00:18:14.220 the temporary remote learning experience. Not everything we do is going to be nor

00:18:14.220 --> 00:18:18.630 does it need to be in an online environment. There will be options for

00:18:18.630 --> 00:18:23.039 some courses where faculty are working with students in conference call

00:18:23.039 --> 00:18:28.799 situations. We can have students working independent study capacities, working

00:18:28.799 --> 00:18:33.990 via email, things like that. The vast majority of faculty will likely move

00:18:33.990 --> 00:18:38.220 into Blackboard and into Zoom. So we would like to encourage you to use the

00:18:38.220 --> 00:18:41.700 learning management system that is supported by the University. That way ITS

00:18:41.700 --> 00:18:45.690 can best support what it is that we need to do going forward. So we are

00:18:45.690 --> 00:18:51.570 focusing on using our learning tools. Blackboard is a basic area where you can,

00:18:51.570 --> 00:18:56.039 everyone has access to it, every course has a Blackboard shell

00:18:56.039 --> 00:19:00.840 already attached to it. So we're building instruction manuals now about how to open

00:19:00.840 --> 00:19:05.580 them and access them so that you can upload Powerpoints, lectures, assessments,

00:19:05.580 --> 00:19:11.130 things of that nature. Zoom is an interactive, web-based medium

00:19:11.130 --> 00:19:15.860 where you can use video to connect with students and connect with different

00:19:15.860 --> 00:19:21.270 aspects of your course in a live and synchronous manner. We do ask when you're

00:19:21.270 --> 00:19:27.570 offering courses in a synchronous manner so live online streaming materials for

00:19:27.570 --> 00:19:31.799 lectures, please utilize your current time zones, so if you're currently

00:19:31.799 --> 00:19:34.230 teaching at 10:15 on Tuesdays and Thursdays

00:19:34.230 --> 00:19:40.200 offer your synchronous lecture at 10:15 on Tuesdays and Thursdays. You can

00:19:40.200 --> 00:19:44.940 imagine it could get a little crazy if we all started picking new times.

00:19:44.940 --> 00:19:48.809 As we're thinking about the different ways that you're going to move into alternate

00:19:48.809 --> 00:19:53.730 delivery of your courses, please remember that flexibility and accommodation for

00:19:53.730 --> 00:19:57.270 both faculty and students needs to be paramount at

00:19:57.270 --> 00:20:00.390 this point. There are students we understand that will have some

00:20:00.390 --> 00:20:03.660 accessibility issues, we're working hard to make sure that we're accounting

00:20:03.660 --> 00:20:08.760 students to the best of our ability. Again both for students and faculty and

00:20:08.760 --> 00:20:11.910 so we just want remind everybody that now is the best time to remain as

00:20:11.910 --> 00:20:17.090 flexible as possible in completing the semester. To get us moving forward with

00:20:17.090 --> 00:20:22.110 tools and resources to convert your courses into a distance delivery format

00:20:22.110 --> 00:20:26.670 we have created a keep teaching page which is very much in line with a number

00:20:26.670 --> 00:20:32.160 of other universities across the country. And we have different ways to

00:20:32.160 --> 00:20:35.610 access that, so we have a planning tool through ITLAL, so the Institute for

00:20:35.610 --> 00:20:38.220 Teaching and Learning. It's the instructional continuity

00:20:38.220 --> 00:20:44.340 preparing to adapt, this is an in-depth pedagogically based information for our

00:20:44.340 --> 00:20:48.630 faculty. It is up and running on their website we will get you that link as

00:20:48.630 --> 00:20:54.150 well. ITS has developed keep teaching support page. This gives you access to

00:20:54.150 --> 00:20:58.410 all of the technology that we have available for you to use at this time.

00:20:58.410 --> 00:21:01.680 So this is where you would go to get Zoom, you can get Blackboard training through 00:21:01.680 --> 00:21:06.600 this medium as well. Both of those are exceptional websites for you to

00:21:06.600 --> 00:21:10.380 utilize. The libraries, we spoke with the Dean of libraries this morning, she

00:21:10.380 --> 00:21:14.400 indicated their presentation rooms, computers, there's access and

00:21:14.400 --> 00:21:18.180 availability in the libraries for any faculty that would like to go in and

00:21:18.180 --> 00:21:23.220 utilize that space for instructional purposes. All of all of these are

00:21:23.220 --> 00:21:26.550 developing as resources have become available we're going to make sure that

00:21:26.550 --> 00:21:32.670 we push them out onto these websites for you. And to do that there are a number of

00:21:32.670 --> 00:21:38.340 faculty supports that we are also working very closely with, ITS and ITLAL

However, for these courses we need to take a little bit of a different

00:22:56.440 --> 00:23:02.230 wonderful medium that we have through our libraries that offers video and

00:23:02.230 --> 00:23:06.549 other avenues for seeing labs. We would also encourage faculty to think

00:23:06.549 --> 00:23:11.230 about providing datasets to your students so that they can at least

00:23:11.230 --> 00:23:15.970 conduct the data analysis from home even if they can't collect it themselves at

00:23:15.970 --> 00:23:20.529 this time. We are working extremely closely with the deans and faculty about

00:23:20.529 --> 00:23:26.620 how best to accommodate lab and hands-on courses. A lot of really fantastic ideas

00:23:26.620 --> 00:23:30.070 have come up out of the schools and colleges so we will continue to update

00:23:30.070 --> 00:23:33.820 this information and push that at you as we learn more about how best to work

00:23:33.820 --> 00:23:39.159 with these courses. This is just a screenshot of JoVE which we would

00:23:39.159 --> 00:23:45.129 encourage certainly any of our faculty who are interested in video, using video

00:47:05.090 --> 00:47:11.180 States is probably equal to a CDC level three country in the eyes. The CDC does

00:47:11.180 --> 00:47:15.170 not put a travel advisory out for the United States, its own country, however as

00:47:15.170 --> 00:47:19.040 other countries are probably looking at us, and if you look at our numbers on this

00:47:19.040 --> 00:47:22.550 situation we were probably a level three country, especially certain parts of the

00:47:22.550 --> 00:47:27.860 country. So I would be very wise about where I traveled, but I would be also be

00:47:27.860 --> 00:47:32.240 very wise about going into large gatherings at conferences. The first

00:47:32.240 --> 00:47:36.140 cases in the capital district came from a conference. The first case in the

00:47:36.140 --> 00:47:40.550 Washington DC area that's affecting national legislators came from a

00:47:40.550 --> 00:47:46.790 conference. So I would be very cautious about going into large crowds with and

00:47:46.790 --> 00:47:50.660 remember it's not just one participation in a panel you're shifting all the time,

00:47:50.660 --> 00:47:54.800 so you're interacting with literally thousands of people. That's something I

00:47:54.800 --> 00:47:59.660

keep in mind. I don't know if the president or Dean Holtgrave was to add anything to that.

00:48:01.610 --> 00:48:08.930 all need to use careful judgment in terms of traveling and going into large

00:51:12.270 --> 00:51:17.940 and C in your mind about if a flight, if I do have to travel and a flight is

what's my what's my fallback position?

00:51:28.890 --> 00:51:32.880 contractual obligations that have a financial component to it, I think you

00:51:32.880 --> 00:51:37.560 should look very seriously at getting out of that financial commitment before

00:51:37.560 --> 00:51:41.310 any deadlines pass by which you couldn't get your deposit back, before you would

00:51:41.310 --> 00:51:45.120 have to pay somebody a certain percentage of their fee to visit. I think

00:51:45.120 --> 00:51:48.750 that that should weigh in to your decision, that and we can't wait for a

00:51:48.750 --> 00:51:52.770 committee to tell us exactly what to do, I would definitely be thinking about

00:51:52.770 --> 00:51:55.880 that if you have external or on-campus events happening.

00:52:22.350 --> 00:52:27.270 for the people who are staffing that to set that expectation not to come to the

00:52:27.270 --> 00:52:29.500 event if they're not feeling well.

00:52:29.500 --> 00:52:32.540 Thank you, so we've touched on the health and safety of our

00:52:32.550 --> 00:52:36.720 employees traveling, we've touched on the health and safety of visitors to our

00:52:36.720 --> 00:52:42.540 campus, and folks in large events. Aaron Major of sociology department asked for

00:52:42.540 --> 00:52:46.590 clarification about which of the working groups might be tasked with dealing with

00:52:46.590 --> 00:52:51.210 the health and safety of employees. So for example, how to staff offices and

00:52:51.210 --> 00:52:55.740 facilities to reduce contact, possible staggering of work schedules, that's

00:52:55.740 --> 00:52:59.070 something the governor mentioned in his announcement the other day, or

00:52:59.070 --> 00:53:04.140 telecommuting options and the protocols and procedures for employees who feel

virus?

00:53:09.660 --> 00:53:15.660 some of the HR pieces on that. So as far as what committee that is the incident

00:53:19.590 --> 00:53:23.260 facilities, these are questions we're actually talking about,

00:53:23.260 --> 00:53:27.970 we had a meeting this morning on this, and and with good productivity out of

These folks are also there we see these

00:53:53.530 --> 00:53:57.670 the side of safety there. Then as far as work from home or whatever I'll turn to Todd.

00:55:03.010 --> 00:55:08.590 conditions, on a case by case basis, we can work on that supervisors should work

00:55:08.590 --> 00:55:12.850 with Human Resources to work out a plan for those individuals because we do not

00:55:12.850 --> 00:55:17.980 want to put anybody you know intentionally in in harm's way so to

00:55:17.980 --> 00:55:23.890 speak. So we're working through that, very good question Aaron thank you.

00:56:17.560 --> 00:56:22.210 that. And those are the first events, to be frank, that other universities, other

00:56:22.210 --> 00:56:27.940 entities that we're seeing right now are terminating and looking to cancel given

00:56:27.940 --> 00:56:31.390 that additional risk. Cornell is a good example of that, they're still holding on-campus

00:56:31.390 --> 00:56:37.120 events but anything that brings in an off campus audience is

00:56:37.120 --> 00:56:41.350 at this point they're not they're not holding those. Size would be obviously

00:56:41.350 --> 00:56:46.600 of how many people, ability again to keep social distancing, are all things that are

taken in consideration. But it does increase the risk when you have an

01:03:56.869 --> 01:04:00.920 state's gonna play a role. So this isn't just a decision that's made up here by 01:04:00.920 --> 01:04:05.450 the President, Provost or the vice president's of the deans. There there is

01:04:05.450 --> 01:04:10.069 an awful lot of direction that that is going to be put in place between now and

01:04:10.069 --> 01:04:15.050 and commencement that is going to drive what a final decision will be on on

01:04:15.050 --> 01:04:17.660 commencement and even beyond.

A number of our students, as I think our family and staff know, need to work to

01:04:59.990 --> 01:05:05.630 attend school. So there's there's the element of how comfortable are you

01:05:10.940 --> 01:05:15.830 effect said I'm going home my parents want me home. They're not coming back, at

01:05:15.830 --> 01:05:18.590 least not in the near future. There was a student last night who in effect said that

01:05:18.590 --> 01:05:24.140 I'll be back on the 23rd to work. You know in my mind and I'd certainly defer

01:05:24.140 --> 01:05:28.720 to others. I think it's a case-by-case situation. The challenge that we have in

01:05:28.720 --> 01:05:33.620 several of our student facing units is that the vast majority of our frontline

01:05:33.620 --> 01:05:37.730 staff are students. And so in Student Affairs in particular and I think maybe

01:05:37.730 --> 01:05:41.960 some other areas we are giving consideration to how we can leverage our professional

01:05:41.960 --> 01:05:46.790 staff, who are coming in those in those spaces accordingly.

It may have an impact on service delivery and we're cognizant of that

01:06:01.520 --> 01:06:07.670 indicated, staffing levels become, sort of for lack of a better word, volatile.

01:06:07.670 --> 01:06:12.830 So both with regard to staffing and kind of back to our theme of large events the,

01:06:12.830 --> 01:06:17.240 kind of unanswered question or unasked questions so far is particularly with

01:06:17.240 --> 01:06:22.850 regards to enrollment and recruitment. What are the university's plans around

01:06:22.850 --> 01:06:27.650 our planned open house, upcoming open houses, other visitations, and

01:06:27.650 --> 01:06:32.900 particularly since we are now attempting to involve our schools and colleges and

01:06:32.900 --> 01:06:37.250 our faculty in these events more, so it's much more broadly encompassing than previously.

I'll certainly defer to others Kevin included on this. As much as we can right

01:06:58.099 --> 01:07:00.680 the first option. So as some of you know, if you don't know,

01:07:00.680 --> 01:07:04.880 April 4th is our accepted student open house. That is not unique to us, there are

01:07:04.880 --> 01:07:08.089 other competitor institutions who also have open house

01:07:08.089 --> 01:07:14.089 scheduled for that weekend. We don't know what April 4th will look like for us. We

01:07:14.089 --> 01:07:17.989 have engaged our enrollment management team Ed Englebride, Mike McCune our

01:07:17.989 --> 01:07:21.709 undergraduate admissions director are looking at what a postponement option

01:07:21.709 --> 01:07:23.869 that may modify the program a bit for that delivery.

01:07:23.869 --> 01:07:30.650 We're also concurrently looking at a virtual delivery of open house that

01:07:30.650 --> 01:07:39.289 showcases our academics, our faculty, our cutting-edge research areas. You know the

01:07:39.289 --> 01:07:43.190 visitation experience is one of the primary elements that drive a student's

01:07:43.190 --> 01:07:46.670 decision. So it does put us at a disadvantage if we're not able to

01:07:46.670 --> 01:07:53.150 provide that. We're also trying as much as possible to monitor what other

01:07:53.150 --> 01:07:57.979 competitor institutions are doing. And so we have been in communication as best as

01:07:57.979 --> 01:08:02.809 we can around that. As we know information we will certainly relay it

01:08:02.809 --> 01:08:08.029 to to the deans and to their faculty who have been terrific partners as we stand

01:08:08.029 --> 01:08:12.019 up a more robust engagement of our prospective students.

If I could just jump in though for for faculty and staff, I think there needs to be an expectation
