

Superintendent of the Model School to suspend and expel scholars was then discussed and it was declared to be the pleasure of the Committee that the Superintendent shall when necessary suspend scholars and at once to notify the principal of the action; but that the power of expulsion should not be exercised by the Superintendent.

Mr. Waterbury was appointed a Committee to advertise the opening of the second term of the Model School.

The Committee then adjourned.

A special meeting of the Executive Committee was held in reference to the death of the Hon. Robert H. Bruyn. Present: Superintendent Gilman, Mr. Murray and Mr. Waterbury. The following minute in memory of the deceased member of the Committee was unanimously adopted and ordered to be entered on the Records of the Executive Committee:

In memory of Hm. Robert H. Fruyn.

The Executive Committee of the State Normal School, in memory of the late Robert H. Fruyn, has record; that for many years Mr. Fruyn was an active, untiring and sagacious member of this Committee. Of long and extended familiarity with public affairs and public men; of book and of those who loved them, a lover; of ripe experience in matters of education — in all things tending to the advantage of this institution, his course was invariable. With a readiness due to his natural gifts, and an effectiveness aided by a life-long training and experience in administrative and executive affairs, his efforts in behalf of this School have been of the greatest advantage to its interests.

He was a man — courteous, genial, entertaining, and instructive; our official intercourse with him was a pleasure and a satisfaction. From our own experience with him

we can comprehend what an irreparable loss has befallen his immediate family - his widow and children to whom we extend our warm and heartfelt sympathy.

In token of respect for his memory, it is directed that the exercises of the State Normal School shall be suspended on the day of his funeral.

Our secretary is directed to enter this minute in full on our records, and to transmit a copy of the same to the family of the deceased.

The Committee then adjourned.
