Philadelphia, Pa. -- Samantha Cohen set a school record in finishing second in the Olympic Development 5,000-meter racewalk, and Luis Soto was second in the men's long jump to highlight the University at Albany's performances at the 104th annual Penn Relays Carnival at Franklin Field.

Cohen chopped over one minute off her own Albany mark with a time of 23:19.88, and was runner-up to champion Jill Zenner (Miami Valley Track Club), who walked 23:09.91. Soto leaped 23-feet, 11-inches in the eastern long jump event, and was just behind Northeastern's Dave Klemic (24-00.25). Soto also tied for 18th in the high jump (6-6).

Ellakisha Williamson (Albany H.S.) ran a season-best 13.62 in the women's 100-hurdles in qualifying, but did not make the finals. However, she helped two relay teams establish school standards. The shuttle hurdle relay, which included Shenendehowa's Janna Johnston, was second in its heat in 57.93 seconds, while the sprint medley shattered a three-year old mark by nine seconds in 4:07.09.

Matt Perry set a fourth record with a ninth-place finish in the Olympic Development 10,000m racewalk, and was clocked in 51:00.71. Ronald Edmundson (46-6) and Harold Valestin (46-4.25) were eighth and ninth, respectively, in the eastern triple jump.

Finally, the Great Danes finished fifth in the men's IC4A 4x100 relay with a time of 41.95, and followed behind first-place East Carolina (40.79). Greg Miller (Albany H.S.) and Jayson Vazquez (Amsterdam) ran the second and third legs on a unit which reached the championship for the first time in school history.

University at Albany's Steve Checksfield has been selected as the New England Collegiate Conference Rookie of the Week (Apr. 6-12) in baseball.

Checksfield batted .471 (8-for-17) in five games with eight runs scored, nine RBIs, three home runs, and one triple. He added three walks and two stolen bases, and had a 1.118 slugging percentage.

Albany's freshman outfielder belted an RBI triple and scored in a six-run eighth inning in Saturday's come-from-behind 8-7 victory over Southern Connecticut State. In the nightcap of the SCSU doubleheader, he drove in what proved to be the winning run in a 3-2 triumph.

Ellakisha Williamson (Albany H.S.) was first in the 100-hurdles with a time of 13.96 seconds, and took a pair of seconds in the 100- and 200-dashes. Janna Johnston (Shenendehowa) leaped 17-6.25 to win the long jump.

Vazquez sprinted 15.01 seconds in his 100-hurdles victory as the Great Danes were second to Connecticut in the team point totals. Halim Wise was first across the line in the 400 (48.29), while Luis Soto was Albany's third individual winner with a mark of 23-7.75 in the long jump. Ben Wright (Averill Park) and Todd Weiss (Shaker) were each third in the 1,500 meters and 3,000-steeplechase, respectively.
