

Monday, June 15, 1896. 4.00 P.M.

The Committee met in the office of the Superintendent of Public Instruction, Mr. Skinner in the chair and present also Messrs. Howe, Van Rensselaer and Ward and Mr. Milne by invitation.

The minutes of the meeting of Feb'y. 1 were read and approved.

The President having called attention to the unsafe condition of the building in case of fire, Mr. Howe moved that Mr. Milne be requested to consult the Chief of the Fire Department of the City and ascertain and report what should be done as to fire-escapes and alterations of present exits so as to render the building safe. The motion was seconded by Mr. Van Rensselaer and carried.

President Milne submitted the appended list of candidates for degrees, they having passed examinations satisfactory to the President and faculty. On motion of Mr. Howe the degrees were granted.

On motion of Mr. Howe it was resolved that the tuition fee in the High School Department be increased from \$20. to \$30. per year.

On motion of Mr. Howe President Milne was authorized to engage, in his discretion, men eminent in the science of pedagogy to lecture from time to time at the College, on condition that no entertainments should be given.

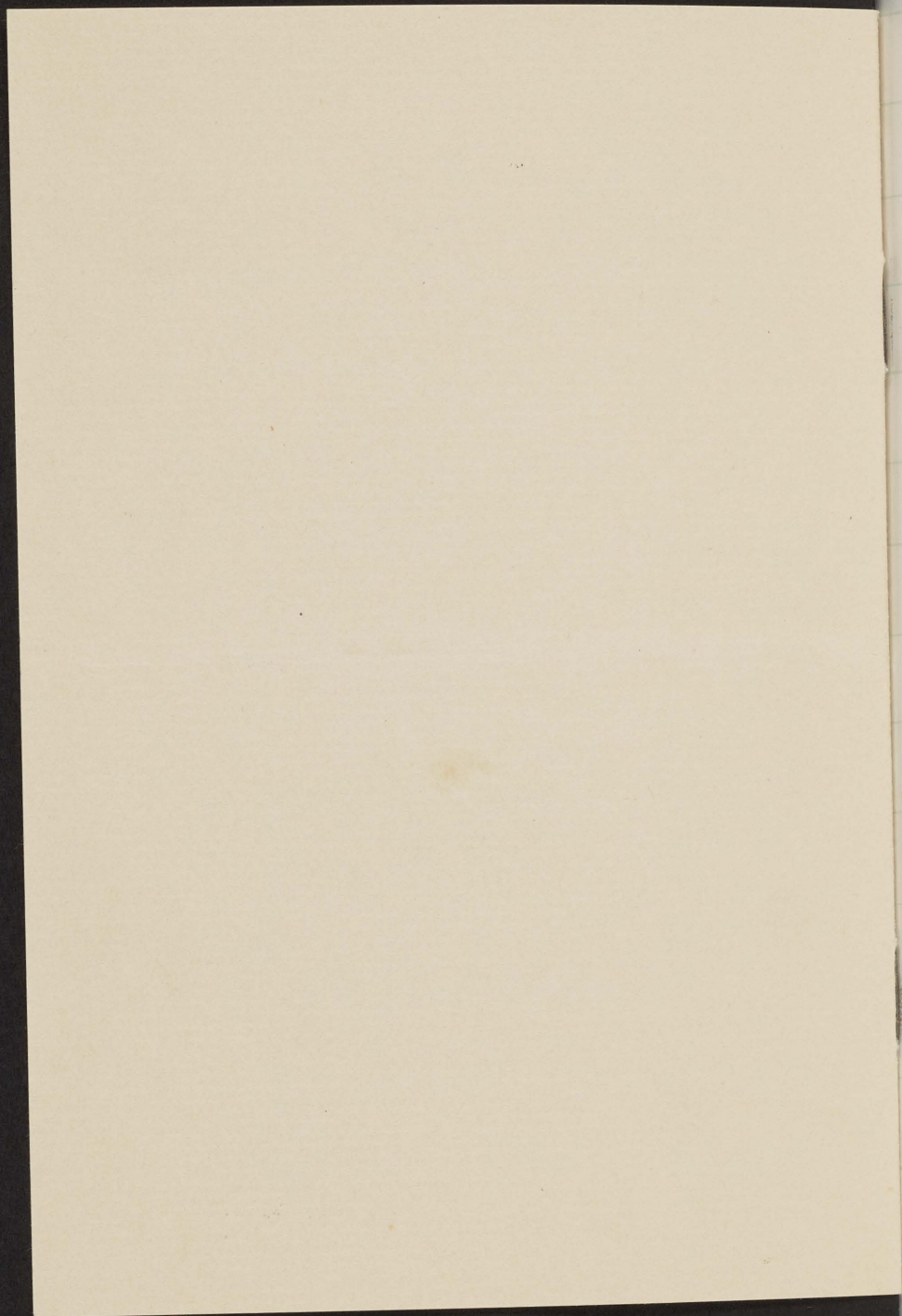

and that the President be authorized to secure the services of Miss Ruth H. Sherrill, a graduate of Smith's College and of our own college, as critic in the High School Department, at a salary of \$750. for the first year. The motion was seconded and carried.

Mr. Ward moved that the salary of President Milne be increased from \$3000. to \$3500. a year. Mr. Van Rensselaer moved to amend that it be increased to \$3600. to be paid in twelve monthly instalments of \$300. each. The amendment was accepted and the motion passed unanimously, with complimentary remarks by Mr. Stew expressing the great satisfaction with which the Committee had watched the success of Mr. Milne's administration.
