Nov. 9. 1864.

The chairman being absent from the city the Committee met at the call of the Secretary.

The Principal stated that Mr. Peter Marean has notified him of his wish to resign his position in the school, and recommended the appointment of Capt. Albert N. Dunitz, a former teacher, and whose term of service in the army had lately expired.

Mr. Dunitz was appointed at a salary of one thousand dollars.

The Committee then adjourned.

Nov. 22. 1864.
