Mr. Wright also presented a report as to the amount required to furnish the building, which report was committed for revision and to be reported complete at the next meeting of the committee.

On motion of Mr. Draper the following resolution was adopted.

Resolved, That an application be made to the Commissioners of the Land Office for their approval of the sale of the real estate now occupied by the Monroe School at public auction, to be delivered on the first day of <sup>1885</sup> January, or so soon thereafter as it can be vacated by the school.

In accordance with this resolution Mr. Draper and Mr. Murray were directed as a committee to prepare papers for submission to the Commissioners of the Land Office and to employ an auctioneer, and on the approval of the commissioners to sell said real estate on the terms to appear.

The Committee then adjourned to meet at the call of the committee on the sale of the real estate.
