



laws for the rich and well to do class of people. It's just another example of the old saying " if you have enough money and know the right people you go free no natter what the crime; but if you're poor you pay whather you're quilty or innocent. "Sustice is just a seven letter word which nears nothing to me or any poor person el lanou. I have absolutely no faith in our so called Justice System. Hersonally I feel my brother and make a greater contribution to society alme and not dead. He has a great mind and can do many things. He has done a lot since in prison toward improving the racing to tuemnorium bus chaitibres for both visitors and immates. He has linght about many changes such as mimors in the hathrooms in the visitor's Park, padded stools, decent exercise equipment and some type regular exercise gragnom for the innates. Aso repair of broken windows in the calls during the winter so that invales oreallibro sugges man exposure and illness. He also paints and I feel with some advertising and/ or displaying of his work; pictures could be sold and profits go toward a Scholar Ship fund, a charity or Shelter for reglected, aliandened or alused children.

of course I will he deeply grieved if his sentence is curried but hut I would he would be made concerned about how it will effect my mother. I don't know if she could cope with stress and shock of it all due to her poor health condition.

I have often wondered why inmates have not been allowed to earn their own stay in Prisons and other State or Federal institutions. There's no reason why a Prison and not be Self-Sustaining.

In Summary, I honestly feel my hoother's Sentence would have been a life sentence Sust as the others involved got if he could have had a fair trial with adequate representation.

Humility is a recognition of our dependence on others and an appreciation of the gift of life. A mon becomes humble when he is aware of the enormous delet he owes to others.
