ALBANY FALLS TO FIFTH IN FOOTBALL GAZETTE DIVISION I-AA POLL

Brookfield, III. -- Albany slipped to No. 5 in this week's *Football Gazette* Division I-AA non-scholarship Top 20 Poll as announced today. The Great Danes, who were second in the last two rankings, suffered a 30-20 setback on Saturday. Robert Morris, ranked fourth one week ago, moved into the top spot by virtue of their victory over Albany.

Albany (6-2) is 11th in scoring offense at 36.5 points per game, and 29th in total offense (418.1 yards/game) among the NCAA Division I-AA leaders through games played Oct. 30. In addition, the Great Danes are tied for sixth in turnover margin (+10).

Albany completes its first Division I-AA schedule with a Northeast Conference game against Sacred Heart on Saturday, Nov. 6. Kickoff is 1:00 p.m. at University Field. -agate-

Robert Morris 30, Albany 20

Albany, N.Y. -- Senior tailback **Donald Dorsey** rushed for 199 yards and two touchdowns as Robert Morris moved closer to a fourth straight Northeast Conference championship with a 30-20 victory over Albany in a battle of conference unbeatens on Saturday at University Field.

Robert Morris (6-2, NEC 5-0) posted its fifth straight win, and can wrap up the NEC title with victories in its final two games. The Colonials won the championship in 1997, and shared the crown in '96 and '98.

Dorsey, who rushed for 144 yards in the first half, gave his club a 10-0 lead on a 67-yard run with 11:22 left in the second quarter. Quarterback **Tim Levcik**, who connected on 18 of 29 attempts for 214 yards, threw a 15-yard scoring pass to reserve tailback **Sam Dorsett** for a 17-point cushion midway through the period.

Albany (6-2, NEC 5-1) closed to the gap to 17-7 with 2:38 left before halftime. Quarterback **Eric Williams** hit split end **Chris Phillis** with a 9-yard touchdown pass on a fourthdown play.

In the third quarter, Robert Morris took control, as free safety **Ray Thomas** intercepted a pass on Albany's opening possession. Following the turnover, Dorsey capped a six-play scoring drive with a 13-yard run.

"Dorsey is an excellent big-play running back," Albany coach Bob Ford said. "He made people miss out there."

Place-kicker **Jeff Carlo**, who booted three field goals on the day to set a single-game record, kicked a 30-yarder for a commanding 30-7 lead with 6:39 left in the contest.

In a furious comeback attempt, Albany reserve quarterback **Michael Oliva** fired a 69-yard TD pass to tight end **Steve Checksfield**, and then recovered the subsequent on-side kick that resulted in a 4-yard touchdown run by **Greg Garrett**. Oliva threw for 167 yards and rushed for 30 on the day.

The Great Danes would finally run out of time in the final seconds, when **Jason Hempstead** intercepted a Williams' pass the Colonials' 4-yard line.

"Our squad showed fighting spirit," Ford said. "But there were times we did not appear to be a well-coached team. They were well prepared, executed their game plan, and had fine clock management at the end."

Garrett, a senior tailback, rushed 17 times for 78 yards, and established the school's career records for touchdowns (31) and points (192) with his fourth-quarter TD run.

The Great Danes, who improved to 6-1 overall and 5-0 in the conference, will meet Robert Morris in a battle of unbeaten NEC teams next Saturday at University Field.

St. Francis (1-7, 1-4) took an early 14-13 lead, when **Jeremy Swords** threw a 45-yard touchdown pass to **Cedric Hudson** with 1:52 left in the first quarter. "Swords is an excellent quarterback and they hurt us with the big play early," said Albany coach **Bob Ford**. "In the second half, we settled down and played solid defense."

The Great Danes were in firm control in the final two quarters. Williams reached paydirt on a two-yard option run and threw a 17-yard touchdown pass to tight end **Mark Sutter** in the third period.

"You have to keep your cool and not let them sense any panic," Williams said. "We realized we could move the ball; we just needed to stay relaxed. We are now in position to win the conference and it's a great feeling with next week being homecoming."

Senior tailback **Greg Garrett**, who did not play in the second half, rushed 14 times for 79 yards and one touchdown and also caught a 36-yard scoring pass. In the process, he tied career school records for touchdowns (30) and points (186).

Staten Island, N.Y. – Quarterbacks Eric Williams and Michael Oliva combined for four touchdown passes as Albany posted a school-record 13th consecutive road win with a 37-21 Northeast Conference victory over Wagner on Saturday afternoon at Wagner Stadium.

Albany (4-1, NEC 4-0) kept hold of first place in the conference standings, while Wagner fell to 3-2 overall and 3-2 in conference play.

The Great Danes took a 10-0 lead midway through the second quarter on a 20-yard field goal by Bryan Bagstad (Shenendehowa HS). Wagner looked to cut into that deficit late in the first half, but tailback Rick Sarille was hit near the goalline by Albany linebacker Mike Grever and Damin Waring recovered the fumble in the endzone.

Sarille, the conference's leading rusher, who carried 32 times for 154 yards, scored a 52yard scamper with 8:05 left in the third quarter to get his team on the scoreboard. He also recorded his eighth consecutive 100-yard rushing game. The Seahawks recovered a fumbled punt attempt on Albany's next possession, but Grever erased the scoring opportunity when he blocked a 39-yard field goal attempt by Garrett O'Rourke.

Williams, who threw for 143 yards and matched a career-high with three TD passes, hooked up with Chris Phillis (Saratoga Springs HS) two plays later on a 63-yard scoring bomb. Bagstad's kick gave Albany a 17-7 lead with 3:42 remaining in the quarter.

The Great Danes reached paydirt twice early in the final period to blow the game open. Williams found Phillis again on an 11-yard TD pass, with 11:35 remaining. Grever, a senior linebacker, picked off his second pass of the day, and raced 46 yards to the Wagner 5-yard line. Reserve quarterback Michael Oliva then hit tight end Steve Checksfield with a five-yard scoring pass and a 30-7 lead.

"He was phenomenal," said Albany coach Bob Ford about Grever. "He certainly was a big boost. Mike is a role model on how to play the game; he goes hard all the time, a 100-***MORE***

percenter on every play."

"I knew I was going to block the field goal," said Grever who had nine tackles, including two for losses. "No one touched me on the previous point-after-attempt so I knew I could get it. It was probably my best game this season. I think I am getting better each week."

Wagner scored twice in the last nine minutes on a 14-yard pass from Lou Simone to Justin Mattes and a 55-yard throw by Aaron Smith (Mohonasen HS) to Mike Cerminaro. In between, Albany fullback Ben Kelcey rambled 42 yards for a touchdown.

Entering the contest, Wagner's defense was only allowing 12 points and 171 yards per game.
