DIRECTIONS TO UALBANY ATHLETIC COMPLEX

From the north: Take the Northway (I-87) south to Exit 1E onto I-90 East (Albany/Boston), then Exit 2 (Washington Ave.) which leads right into UAlbany.

From the south: Take the Thruway (I-87) north to Exit 24. After the tollbooths, go onto I-90 East twards Boston to Exit 2 (Washington Ave.) which leads right into UAlbany.

From the east: Take I-90 west (towards Buffalo) to Exit 2 (Fuller Road). Turn left onto Fuller Road then next left at Washington Ave. UAlbany will be on your right.

From the west: Take the Thruway (I-90) east to Exit 24. After the tollbooths, go onto I-90 east towards Boston to Exit 2 (Washington Ave.) which leads right into UAlbany.

From all directions: Upon entering campus, follow University Drive (heading south/bearing right) one mile to Recreation and Convocation Center parking lot.

As an athlete, Vives competed in the high hurdles, high jump, relays and the decathlon. He placed fifth in the 110-meter high hurdles at the 1984 Puerto Rican Olympic Trials and was the Amateur Athletic Union (AAU) Junior Metropolitan high hurdle champion in 1978. Vives, who is a certified Taekwondo Karate Instructor and holds a second-degree black belt, was the 110-meter Development Chair. Vives has been named the U.S. Track Coaches hurdles masters champion at the 1991 & 1999 Empire State Games.

Vives returned to Cardinal Hayes in 1979 as head coach of the head of the America East Conference Staff of the Year on track & field. He spent three years at his alma mater prior to his three occasions. He also serves on the executive committee of appointment as boys' track & field coach at Bronx High School of Science, a position he held until moving to UAlbany in the fall of

Vives and his wife, Valerie, are the parents of Andres (20) and

in 2004.

Vives has led UAlbany to 26 conference championships and four New York State titles. He was an administrator and coach at the U.S. Olympic Festival in 1993, 1994 and 1995. Coach Vives also served as CTC President and as the USAT&F East Men's Association Regional Coach of the Year four times and has been the USTCA NCAA Division I Committee.

Vives began his coaching career at the age of 14 when he 1985. founded the Bronx International Athletic Club (BIAC) in the South Bronx, N.Y. The BIAC grew to include 200 members and helped Ashley (18) and reside in Clifton Park.

Associate Head Coach **Craig McVey**

Craig McVey enters his eighth year on the UAlbany staff as an associate head coach. Since he joined the staff, UAlbany athletes have established 13 different school records in the jumps and pole vault, with a number of those marks being broken on multiple occasions. His athletes have also posted numerous indoor and outdoor IC4A, ECAC and NCAA Regional qualifying marks, while also acheiving All-East honors.


During last season's campaign, McVey's athletes won a combined six of eight America East Conference Championship horizontal jump title. The men's indoor triple jump corp sparked a UAlbany surge to the indoor conference title, scoring a school record 26 points in the triple jump. Saving the best for last, the same crew repeated outdoors with a school-best mark of 28 points in that event, including another championship title.

McVey also serves as head distance and cross country coach. His athletes have become forces to reckon with from the 3,000meter to the 10,000m, posting all-conference, IC4A/ECAC and NCAA Regional marks. Last year, senior Meghan Howell repeatedly broke the school record in the 3,000m steeplechase, literally every time she raced, earning a berth at the NCAA Regional Championship. Senior distance runner Rob Caracciolo became UAlbany's first Olympian as he represented his mother's native land of Equatorial Guinea in the 2004 Athen's Games in the 1,500m.

The UAlbany distance crew has bean on a tear under McVev's guidance. Both men's and women's cross country squads have contributed equally, with athletes acheiving sixteen All-East team honors in the past three seasons. The teams were led in 2003 by Alyssa Lotmore's 4th place ECAC finish and Robbie Freeman's first ever IC4A Individual University Championship. Freeman won the event at Van Cortlandt Park with a time of 25:17, good enough for the second spot on UAlbany's all-time list.

While an undergraduate at Kansas State University, McVey was a member of two Big Eight Conference indoor championship teams, a Big Eight Cross Country Championship team and KSU squads which were ranked annually among the NCAA top dual-meet teams.

McVey began his collegiate coaching career at KSU in 1983, serving as



In 1988, McVey became head men's and women's cross country and track coach at Hartwick College. His teams eclipsed 83 school records in six years and produced NCAA All-Americans and 22 New York Collegiate individual champions. McVey assumed the same position at The College of Saint Rose, and in his only year there the men's and women's cross country teams both recorded individual conference championship honors in 1996-97. That year, the women won the NYCAC Conference title and the men finished second.

A native of Manhattan, Kansas, McVey has been recognized as a four-time regional coach of the year. He was director/head coach of the USA East Team which competed in the United States and Canada. He has also served as a games committe member for the NCAA Outdoor Track & Field Championships for three years and is past president of the NYSWCAA Track & Field Governing Committee.

McVey recieved a B.S. in physical education in 1979 and earned his master's degree from KSU in 1985. He and his wife, Bette, reside in Guilderland with their children Luke (15), Kirsten (11), Maggie (10) and Tyler (4).



COACHING STAFF

Assistant Coach Steve Clarke

Steve Clarke enters his third season as an assistant coach with the UAlbany track and field program. Clarke, a native of nearby Guilderland, N.Y., was a three-time Patriot League cross country champion while at Bucknell University. He was one of ten male runners selected to the Patriot League's All-Decade Cross Country Team.

This past summer, Clarke had the opportunity to travel to Athens, Greece to coach former UAlbany student-athlete Rob Caracciolo in the 2004 Summer Olympics.

Clarke finished second at the league championships as a senior in 1994 and qualified for the NCAA Championships in Fayetteville, Arkansas. His time at the meet still stands as the third-best performance in Patriot League history. A two-time captain, Clarke was an All-Patriot League selection on seven occasions in both cross country and track. He captured three individual Patriot League titles and earned All-East honors in outdoor track as a senior.

A Dean's List student, Clarke received his B.A. in biology and economics from Bucknell in 1995. He was awarded a master's degree in exercise physiology from the University of Tennessee in 1998. Most recently, Clarke served as coach and manager for FILA Discovery, an elite distance running club.

Assistant Coach Teresa Covert

First-year assistant coach Teresa Covert, a former co-captain on the UAlbany track & field team, joins the staff as a hurdles/jumps coach. Covert, who is a seven-time America East champion, was the first UAlbany track athlete to qualify for national championships at the Division I level. Covert is also an ECAC champion in the 100-meter hurdles and still holds four UAlbany school records in both indoor and outdoor events.

Assistant Coach Bruce Gavnor

In his fourth year, Gaynor will work with high jump and multi-event participants. Gaynor, who was coached by Roberto Vives from 1985-89, also serves as the program's recruiting coordinator. A former record holder in the 400-meter hurdles, he was a member of the 4x400 relay that won the NYS title and achieved All-America status in 1987. The team also took the top spot at the Penn Relays that year.

In the high jump and multi-events, Gaynor's athletes have won five America East individual honors and set three school records in the last two years.

Prior to coming to Albany, Gaynor served as a head and assistant coach at Averill Park High School for 11 years, where he still teaches history. He graduated from UAlbany with a bachelor's degree in political science and urban planning in 1989, and earned a master's degree in education from the University of Rochester in 1991. Gaynor lives in Troy, N.Y. with his two children, Jackson (9) and Adam (6).

Assistant Coach David Herrington

David Herrington enters his ninth year as an assistant coach at UAlbany. After years of serving as the throwing coach for the Great Danes, Herrington moved to sprinters and hurdlers in 2002.

Herrington began coaching in 1969 at Lea College before moving on to form the women's track club at Springfield which later became a varsity team. He was also head cross country and track coach at Hartwick College from 1997-88 and coached at Union College from 1989-92. Herrington has been involved with the Empire State Games since 1976 and is a Level II certificate and USAT&F Lead Instructor.

Herrington is a 1972 graduate of Lea, and also earned a master's degree in education from Springfield in 1974.

Assistant Coach Allison Meier

Allison Meier is in her second season with the UAlbany runners and hurdlers. Meier currently assists with the 400-meter sprinting group along with hurdlers, and also assists with the on-going recruitment of student-athletes.

During her collegiate career, Meier was a two-time participant in the Division III Nationals in the high jump. Meier, who has a personal best of 5-feet, 6-inches in the high jump, is Level I coaching certified from USAT&F.

Meier graduated from Cortland with a B.S. in recreation and leisure studies in 2000 and earned an M.S. in occupational therapy from Samuel Merrit College in 2002

Assistant Coach Richard O'Riley

Richard O'Riley begins his second year on the UAlbany staff as assistant jumps coach. He also serves as Men's Open Chairman for USATF Adirondack Association and is a nationally certified Level I jumps coach. Most recently, he successfully organized the second year of indoor developmental meets held at IJAlbany

A 2000 EOP graduate of University at Albany, O'Riley earned a bachelor's degree in Spanish and Latin-American/Caribbean Studies. In 2003, he earned a master's degree in education from the College of St. Rose. As a member of the UAlbany track and field team, O'Riley was an all-conference perfomer in the hurdles and jumps. He won conference titles in the long and triple jumps in 1997. He has personal-best marks of 23'8.5" (long jump, 2000) and 48'7" (triple jump, 1997). In high school, O'Riley was an all-state performer and set a Section V record in the indoor hurdles. He also has won two bronze medals in Empire State Games competition. O'Riley currently works as a high school spanish teacher in the Capital District.

Assistant Coaches Nathan & Megan Schneeberger

Nathan and Megan Schneeberger begin their third year coaching the UAlbany throwers. Since 2000 when Nathan began assisting Dave Herrington in coaching the throws, UAlbany throwers have re-written the record books breaking school records in men's and women's javelin, men's and women's discus, men's and women's indoor weight, men's and women's hammer, men's and women's discus, and women's shot put (indoor and outdoor). During the indoor season, two throwers competed at the ECAC/IC4A indoor championships, and Joy Williams became the first UAlbany thrower to become "All-East" with a fourth- place finish in the shot put with a school-record throw of 14.44m (47' 4.5"). Eric Opuana became the first UAlbany thrower to win an America East Conference Outdoor championship with a 56m throw in the hammer. Brandon Howlett became the first athlete in school history to compete in the NCAA championships when he finished 4th in the NCAA East Regional.

Both Schneebergers graduated from Hamline University (St. Paul, Minn.) in 2000. Nathan earned his bachelor's degree with a double major in

psychology and history. He was a four-year letterwinner in football, and nominated to the American Football Coaches Association National Goodworks Team in 1999. He was a three time All-Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference performer in track and field.

Nathan is a doctoral candidate in UAlbany's industrial/organizational psychology program and is currently working on his dissertation titled "Predicting Performance in the Throwing Events of Track and Field". Nathan also works as a research associate at Excelsior College.

Megan received her bachelor's degree in anthropology, and is currently a doctoral student in the University's anthropology program. Megan also works for the State of New York Department of Health.

Assistant Coach Nadir Simohamed

Nadir Simohamed begins his first season as the jumps coach at UAlbany. The Algiers, Algeria native arrived in Albany in 1997 after spending six years as both an athlete and coach of the Southwest Texas State University track & field team..

From 2002 to 2004 he guided state and national high school talent Felipe Reyes to a four-time All-America status. In 2002 Reyes won the Empire State Games, followed in 2003 by victories in the National Indoor Championships and the Outdoor State Championships, earning All-America honors in the long jump. 





UNIVERSITY AT ALBANY HALL OF FAME CLASS OF 2004

Xiomara Davila Diaz (1996-99) - Davila Diaz was one of UAlbany's top hurdlers and sprinters in the track program's Division II era. She shared the school's 1998-99 Female Athlete of the Year award. She was voted athlete of the meet at both the 1999 ECAC Division II and New England Collegiate Conference indoor championships. Davila Diaz qualified for the 1999 ECAC Division I outdoor meet in both the 100- and 400-meter hurdles. She competed at the 1997 NCAA Division II meet in three events, and was fifth in the 400-hurdles.

Peter Pedro (1986-90) - One of the top fullbacks in UAlbany football history, Pedro ranks fourth among the school's career rushing leaders with 2,612 yards. He averaged 5.4 yards per carry, ranked ninth in both total offense and scoring, and totaled 22 career touchdowns. Pedro led the Great Danes in rushing as a sophomore and junior with 800-plus yards on the ground in both seasons. He was named Pizza Hut honorable mention All-American in 1987. Pedro's top effort came when he rumbled for 186 yards in a 35-19 win against Norwich.

Kimberly Toone (1985-87) - An All-America track athlete in the mid-1990s, Toone was inducted into UAlbany's Athletic Hall of Fame posthumously. She died, at the age of 22, in a tragic automobile accident. Toone qualified for the 1996 NCAA Division II indoor championships in the long jump and 55-meter hurdles. She had captured both the ECAC and Collegiate Track Conference indoor long jump titles. Toone, who did not compete on the high school level, reached the NCAA Division III national indoor and outdoor championships in 1995. She was a three-event CTC outdoor champion in the long jump, 100-meter hurdles and 400-meter hurdles.

Bill Vanos (1990-94) - A two-time track All-American and accomplished cross country competitor on the NCAA Division III level, Vanos is one of the top distance runners in UAlbany history. In 1994, Vanos finished second in the 10,000-meter run at the NCAA outdoor championships and sixth in the 5,000 at the national indoor meet. He captured the CTC 3,000-meter steeplechase title and was third at Penn Relays in the 5,000. Vanos also competed in three NCAA cross country championships and recorded a pair of top-35 finishes as an individual.

UALBANY OLYMPIAN



Former UAlbany track and field athlete Rob Carracciolo '04, represented the small West African nation of Equatorial Guinea in the 2004 Olympic Games held in Athens, Greece.

Carracciolo, who was eligable to run for Equatorial Guinea because his mother was born there, became the first Great Dane to ever

compete in an Olympic event.

Caracciolo, 22, was originally scheduled to run in the 3,000 meter steeplechase, an event he competed in for four years as a Great Dane. Instead, Caracciolo competed in the opening heat of the 1,500 meters, an event he never ran as a collegian.

In his final season as a Great Dane, Caracciolo posted several top ten finishes in the steeplechase, including a first place finish at the UConn Invitational and a third place running at his final college meet, the UAlbany Spring Classic.

The country of Equatorial Guinea, which had been following Caracciolo's track and field career since high school, contacted him through his mother. Without an opportunity to make the United States team, Caracciolo decided to run for the small country, which had only one other Olympic delegate; a women's track athlete.

Caracciolo was accompanied to Athens by UAlbany assistant track and field coach Steve Clarke.

Caracciolo did not advance to to the semifinals of the 1,500 meter race. In the opening heat, he was lined up next to Morocco's Hicham El Guerrouj, who holds the world record in the 1,500 with a time of 3 minutes. 26 seconds.

In the race, Carracciolo established a new national record in the 1,500-meters for Equatorial Guinea.

Athletic Success



Individual champions at the America East Outdoor Track and Field Championship will receive bids to that NCAA Championship. In addition, several America East athletes in sports such as men's and women's cross country, men's and women's indoor track and field, men's and women's golf, and men's and women's swimming and diving will compete in those NCAA Championships. Overall, America East sponsors championships in 22 sports.

Academic Accolades

America East institutions saw nine of their student-athletes earn Academic All-America honors in 2003-04 alone. This total ranked fifth-highest among all Division I-AA and I-AAA conferences. Included in the group were first-team selections Lana Khvalina of the UMBC women's tennis team, who was named for the second-straight year, and Alon Lubezky of the Hartford men's soccer team, the school's career goal scoring leader. America East annually recognizes its studentathletes' success in the classroom. All varsity team members who compile a grade-point average between 3.0 and 3.49 during their playing season receive conference recognition by being named to the Academic Honor Roll. Those outstanding student-athletes who compile a grade-point average of 3.5 or higher are named to the Commissioner's Honor Roll. Nearly 1,700 student-athletes received honor roll recognition in 2003-04 with America East's 3,500 student-athletes averaging a 2.97 grade-point average. Additionally, the conference annually determines the top scholar-athlete in each of its championship sports. The scholar-athlete must maintain a minimum 3.2 cumulative grade-point average and be a starter or prominent reserve on the team for the duration of the playing season. From the pool of 22 outstanding scholarathletes, one male and one female America East student-athlete are further honored as the conference's Scholar-Athletes of the Year.

The University at Albany today is an internationally recognized public research university with a broad mission of undergraduate and graduate education, and research. More than 17,000 students are enrolled in nine schools and colleges offering 176 undergraduate, master's and doctoral degree programs.

Outstanding faculty, an innovative curriculum, award-winning advisors and student-centered services create a distinctive learning environment that nurtures student success. After graduation, more than two-thirds of undergraduates go on for advanced degrees, and acceptances to law and medical schools are well above the national average. UAlbany has more than 128,000 living alumni, including: Catherine Bertini, B.A.'71, under-secretary-general for management, United Nations; Marcia Brown, B.A.'40, three-time Caldecott Award-winning children's book author; Tom Clarke, B.A.'73, president of new business ventures, Nike, Inc.; and SOBE beverages founder Norm Snyder, B.S.'83.

UAlbany programs in sociology, public administration and policy, criminal justice, clinical psychology, reading, accounting, social welfare and atmospheric sciences have earned national renown for excellence. More recently, the University has been building new strengths in such areas as nanotechnology, life sciences, and public information systems. The latest rankings of graduate programs by *U.S. News and World Report* place seven programs in the top 25 in the nation.

Undergraduates choose from 53 majors in the arts and sciences, business and accounting, public policy, criminal justice, information science, pre-law and pre-health; approximately 30 percent of undergraduates participate in research with faculty. Innovative degree programs with an international focus and more than 300 study-abroad programs prepare

students for the global economy. Extensive internship opportunities offer real-world experience in New York's capital and the surrounding region.

Both the UAlbany campus and the region are bustling with extracurricular opportunities. Students participate in more than 150 student clubs, honor societies, and other campus-related groups, and choose from a busy calendar of campus events, including spirited Division I athletic competition in 19 sports and a rich array of cultural activities.

The University is just a short drive from spectacular natural and recreational centers in New York, Massachusetts, and Vermont. With 13 colleges in the Capital Region, it's easy to see why Albany is also a "great college town."

UAlbany, working with governmental and business partners, plays a vital role in the economic development of the Capital Region and New York State. The University is a major international center for research and development in the fields of



nanosciences and nanoengineering. An economic impact study in 2004 estimated UAlbany's economic impact as \$1.119 billion annually in New York State - \$1.005 billion of that in the Capital Region.

UAlbany aims to rank among the top public research universities in the nation and is taking strategic steps across its three campuses to achieve this goal. The Campaign for the University at Albany was publicly launched in April 2003 to help provide necessary private support for achieving UAlbany's goals.
