UNIVERSITY AT ALBANY AND NEW YORK GIANTS ARE IN AGREEMENT TO CONTINUE FOOTBALL TRAINING CAMP THROUGH 2000

Albany, N.Y. -- The University at Albany and the New York Football Giants, Inc. have mutually agreed to continue the National Football League organization's summer training camp in the Capital Region for the next three years President Karen R. Hitchcock announced today.

"The University and the New York Giants have agreed to continue the existing five-year contract," said Hitchcock, who provided the leadership in attracting the camp to the area in the spring of 1996. "My thanks to John Mara, Giants' Executive Vice President, and Tim White, Times-Union Publisher, for their diligent work in continuing a partnership that has proven to be extremely successful."

The New York Giants have conducted their training camp at the University at Albany the past two summers, and with this continuing agreement will return each July through 2000.

The University and the Giants signed a five-year summer training camp deal in March 1996 with Governor George E. Pataki's assistance and support from the entire Capital-Saratoga business and government communities.

Prior to their arrival in Albany, the New York Giants trained at Fairleigh Dickinson University in Madison, New Jersey from 1988-95 and Pace University in Pleasantville, New York from 1975-87.

UNIVERSITY AT ALBANY ANNOUNCES FIVE-YEAR AGREEMENT WITH SYRACUSE UNIVERSITY IN MEN'S BASKETBALL

ALBANY, N.Y. -- The University at Albany and Syracuse University have committed to a five-year series in men's basketball, beginning with the 1999-2000 season, as Director of Athletics Dr. Milton E. Richards announced today.

The agreement's terms state that Albany will travel for the first two years to Syracuse for early-season dates in the Carrier Dome. The Orangemen will come to the Capital Region, and play in Pepsi Arena in 2001. The Great Danes will make two more trips to Syracuse in 2002 and 2003. All dates in the five-year deal will be scheduled in November or December. An announcement on specific scheduling will come at a later time.

"We are pleased that our University's first Division I men's team will have an opportunity to play one of the premier programs in college basketball," Richards said. "I am grateful to Pepsi Arena General Manager Bob Belber and Albany County officials for making their facility available for our home date in this series."

The first year of the agreement coincides with Albany's first NCAA Division I campaign. The Great Danes, members of the New England Collegiate Conference, are currently competing at the Division II level. President Karen R. Hitchcock announced last spring the University's decision to upgrade its entire 19-sport intercollegiate athletics program for men and women to Division I.

Syracuse has sponsored a men's basketball program since 1900-01, and joined the Big East Conference in 1979. The Orangemen have made 23 NCAA tournament appearances, and reached the Final Four on three occasions. Head coach Jim Boeheim, who has guided two SU teams to the Division I championship final, is among the winningest coaches in college basketball history with a 501-170 career record over 21 years. The 1996-97 squad finished with an 18-11 record. Syracuse's non-conference slate this season includes Louisville, Colgate, Buffalo, UNC-Greensboro and UNC-Asheville.

Albany coach Scott Hicks, a former Syracuse assistant on Boeheim's staff, is in his first year with the Great Dane program. He replaced Richard "Doc" Sauers, who retired last March with 702 career victories. Hicks, who posted an 87-56 record in five seasons as Le Moyne College's head coach, has four starters returning from last year's 17-10 Albany team.



ALBANY MEN'S AND WOMEN'S HOOP CAPTAINS ANNOUNCED

Albany, N.Y. -- The University at Albany has selected its men's and women's basketball captains for the 1997-98 season. Andre Duncan, Tom McGoldrick and Darrin Jahnel (Schalmont) will serve as tri-captains for first-year head coach Scott Hicks. Kelly Paolino (Schalmont) and Kerry Ochal (Amsterdam) are cocaptains for women's coach Mari Warner.

Duncan, a second-team all-New England Collegiate Conference choice last year, led the Great Danes in scoring (14.3 ppg) and rebounding (6.4 pg). McGoldrick, a 6-foot-5 forward, averaged 14.0 points and 5.8 rebounds. Jahnel, a senior guard, scored at an 11.6 clip, and established a single-season record with 83 three-point field goals. Albany was 17-10 overall last season, and placed fifth in the conference with a 10-8 mark.

The Great Danes host Concordia University, of Montreal, Quebec, in an exhibition game on Sunday, November 2. Tip-off is 2:30 p.m. at the Recreation & Convocation Center. Admission is free, and open to the public.

Paolino, a junior point guard, averaged 5.4 points, 2.8 assists and 2.2 steals last season. She led the Great Danes to a 19-9 record and a spot in the NECC championship final, and was chosen to the all-tournament team. Ochal, a 5-foot-9 senior, was a starter in 25 of 28 games played one year ago, and averaged 4.2 points and 4.0 rebounds. Albany opens its 1997-98 schedule at home against Merrimack on Friday, November 14.

GALLAGHER DRISCOLL SELECTED MEN'S ASSISTANT BASKETBALL COACH AND RON CICCHINELLI NAMED AS A WOMEN'S CAGE ASSISTANT

ALBANY, N.Y. -- Gallagher Driscoll has been chosen as a part-time assistant men's basketball coach at the University at Albany as head coach Scott Hicks announced today. Women's head basketball coach Mari Warner also named Ron Cicchinelli as a part-time assistant.

Driscoll, a four-year starter at the College of St. Rose, served as an assistant coach on Hicks' staff at Le Moyne College the past two seasons. He was responsible for recruiting, scouting and conditioning for a program which made two NCAA Division II tournament appearances during his tenure. Previously, Driscoll was the boys' junior varsity head coach and varsity assistant at West Genesee High School in Syracuse for three years.

Driscoll, 27, earned honorable mention All-America honors and was all-New York Collegiate Athletic Conference as a point guard at St. Rose. A three-time captain, he led the Golden Knights to four consecutive 20-plus win campaigns, and a '92 NCAA tournament bid. Driscoll, who received a B.S. in political science, is the school's all-time assists (878) and steals (359) leader. He attended Bishop Ludden High School in Syracuse, where he was a two-time all-state and all-Central New York choice, and led his club to the 1987 Class A state final.

Cicchinelli has coached on the collegiate and high school scene for nearly 20 years. Last year, he was a boys' varsity assistant at Shenendehowa High School, but previously was the head boys' coach at both Troy (1990-95) and Rensselaer (1983-87) high schools. Cicchinelli, one of two coaches in New York state history to win sectional titles in the boys' and girls' division, directed Rensselaer to the Section II Class C and Patroon League championships. As the girls' head coach at Notre Dame-Bishop Gibbons High from 1978-83, he guided the program to three Class A and three Big 10 League crowns.

An Albany men's assistant under Richard "Doc" Sauers for one season in 1988, Cicchinelli has also coached at the Empire State Games. His Adirondack Region boys' team won one gold medal, while his girls' squad captured two silvers.

Cicchinelli, 44, received his B.S. in sociology from Siena College in 1973, and has a master's degree in public administration from Russell Sage College.

Overland Park, Kan. -- The University at Albany made its first appearance this season in the NCAA Division II Northeast Region Football Poll on Monday. The Great Danes, who are 6-1 overall and 5-0 in the Eastern Football Conference, are rated No. 10. New Haven is first in the rankings, while Grand Valley State (Mich.) and Slippery Rock (Pa.) follow in the order.

RICHARD SAUERS NAMED UNIVERSITY AT ALBANY'S WOMEN'S GOLF COACH

ALBANY, N.Y. -- Richard "Doc" Sauers, who retired as head men's basketball coach after more than four decades in the position last March, has been chosen as the University at Albany's head women's golf coach as Director of Athletics Dr. Milton E. Richards announced today.

Sauers, whose sqaud will play its schedule in the fall and spring, is no stranger to collegiate golf. He coached the University's men's team for 19 seasons from 1962-79, before the program was discontinued. During his tenure, the Great Danes had an 80-77-3 dual-match record, and finished ninth at the 1963 NCAA championships.

Sauers, 67, finished his basketball coaching career with a 702-330 record in 41 seasons as Albany's coach. He is one of 11 coaches in the history of the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) to reach the 700-career win mark. Coach Sauers, who posted just one losing campaign, guided the Great Danes to nine NCAA tournament appearances, four NAIA tournament invitations, and two Eastern College Athletic Conference (ECAC) championships in 1978 and 1989. Sauers, the '85 NCAA Division III Coach of the Year, was inducted into the New York State Basketball Hall of Fame in 1992.
