The minutes of the last meeting were read and approved.

A list of the graduates at the close of the term June 22<sup>nd</sup> 1888, was presented and on ~~motion~~ motion was approved. [For list see ~~next~~ page 240.]

The following resolution was presented by Superintendent Draper and unanimously adopted;

Resolved that hereafter the President of the School be authorized to withhold any diploma ordered to be issued by the Committee for any cause which may seem to him sufficient for such action, and that in case of such action he report the same at the next meeting of the committee.

The Secretary reported the following appropriations made by the Legislature \$23,500 in the appropriation bill, \$4,000.

in the supply bill.

The secretary presented to the Committee a Communication from the President recommending that the salary of Professor Burt be increased from \$1500 to \$1800 a year. On motion the recommendation was adopted and the salary was increased to commence from the beginning of the next school year.

On motion it was directed that the title of Professor Jones' professorship be amended by omitting the term adjunct, and by making such other change in the titles of Professor Husted and Professor Jones as the President should deem to be best.

The secretary presented the resignation of Miss Effie M. Frauts as superintendent of the Kindergarten, to take place on the 19<sup>th</sup> of June 1888. On motion this resignation was accepted and the secretary was directed to express to her the thanks of the executive Committee for her faithful and efficient service.

A Communication was presented from

the president nominating for her position Miss Ida M. Isdell, a graduate of the Normal School eighteenth term, and afterwards of the Kindergarten, at a salary of \$600 the first year and \$700 thereafter; and for the position of assistant made vacant by the promotion of Miss Isdell Miss Helen E. Sewell a graduate of the Normal School eighty-fourth term and of the Kindergarten in June 1887, at a salary of \$500 a year. On motion the nomination was approved and the appointments made.

On motion of Dr. Ward the following resolution was adopted. Resolved, that free tuition in the Model School at the discretion of the president be given to the daughter of the late Professor St. John.

On motion of Mr. North the following resolution was adopted. Resolved, that the president be authorized to have the roof of the central part of the building repaired, at a cost not to exceed \$175.

On motion of Mr. Munay the following

resolution was adopted. Resolved that the chairman of the Committee be authorized to procure proposals and award contract for 400 tons of egg and 205 chestnut both Lehigh to be put in the building.

On motion of Dr. Ward the following resolution was adopted. Resolved that the president be authorized to engage the Academy of Music for the afternoon of June 22<sup>nd</sup> to be used for the closing exercises.

On motion of Mr. Murray the following resolution was adopted. Resolved that the Committee on the library be hereby authorized to purchase books for the reference library to an amount not to exceed \$1500.

On motion of Mr. North the following resolution was adopted. Resolved that Dr. Ward and the president investigate the methods of filtering the supply of water for the Normal School building and report their conclusions to the executive Committee at its next meeting.

The president was directed to have

the bails inspected and the necessary repairs made to them and to the building.

The committee then adjourned.
