Campus Progress Report No. 126

Today we inspected and accepted, subject to punch list, lawn plantings pertaining to Academic Group II and a second inspection of the Colonial Quadrangle, plus a first inspection of the State Quadrangle lawns. Owing to the rather rainy Spring and the cool weather, the lawns were in good shape. Only two areas at the State Quadrangle and one area at the Colonial Quadrangle were deemed inappropriate and are subject to additional attention before we will accept them.

With the completion of these lawns, practically all of the campus is now under sod aside from the area where the Indian Quadrangle will be built. I feel that dust storms from now on will be at a minimum. Of course the building of the State Police Academy to our east might occasion some dust storms while it is under progress, but since it is down wind from us, according to prevailing breezes, they should not trouble us very much.

With respect to the planting of trees and shrubs, little can be placed on the Academic podium this Spring because of the nature of the varieties which are to be planted there. However, a strong attempt is being made to plant most of the Pines which are destined to go along the north side of the Academic podium. Holes are now being dug for these plantings; top soil is on site, and as soon as the trees can be moved in, they will be planted.
