# UALBANY'S GARY JONES NAMED NEC OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Somerset, N.J. – University at Albany's **Gary Jones** (Ravena-Coeymans-Selkirk H.S.) has been chosen as the Northeast Conference Offensive Player of the Week for his performance in last Saturday's 42-7 victory over Sacred Heart.

Jones, a senior tailback, keyed a record-breaking running attack by carrying 24 times for a season-high 162 yards and one touchdown. Albany's 404 rushing yards established a new NEC single-game mark, as Jones cracked the 100-yard plateau for the ninth time in his last 11 games dating back to last season.

Jones, the 2002 NEC Offensive Player of the Year, moved into fourth place on the school's career rushing touchdowns chart (25) with a 21-yard scamper in the first quarter to give the Great Danes a 14-0 edge. He also climbed to eighth on the school list in career rushing yards (1,884), ninth in all-purpose yards (2,363) and into a tie for fourth in scoring with 156 points.

### **UALBANY FOOTBALL MOVES UP IN BOTH MID-MAJOR NATIONAL POLLS**

Albany, N.Y. – Following last Saturday's victory over previously unbeaten Sacred Heart, the University at Albany moved up in both The Sports Network and Football Gazette Division I-AA Mid-Major national football polls. UAlbany climbed three spots to fifth in The Sports Network top 10, and one place to fourth in the Football Gazette poll.

The Great Danes, who are ranked 11th nationally among the Division I-AA leaders in rushing, ran for 404 net yards in taking down Sacred Heart, ranked No. 2 in the national polls last week. Albany's rushing total was the program's highest single-game effort since Oct. 31, 1992.

Albany (2-2) meets St. Peter's in a non-conference game on Saturday, Oct. 4 at University Field. Kickoff is 1:00 p.m. on Hall of Fame Day. Legendary basketball coach Richard "Doc" Sauers and four former athletes will be enshrined into the University's Athletic Hall of Fame later that evening.

### Albany 42, Sacred Heart 7

Albany, N.Y. – Senior tailback **Gary Jones** ran for a season-high 162 yards and one touchdown and Albany set a Northeast Conference team rushing record in leading the Great Danes to a 42-7 victory over previously unbeaten Sacred Heart on Saturday afternoon at University Field.

Albany (2-2, NEC 2-0) took advantage of David Wahlen's short punt following a bad snap on its first offensive series. Starting quarterback **Anthony Sciarra**, faked into the line on an option play, and raced around right end on a 49-yard touchdown run.

The Great Danes, who piled up 404 net rushing yards, the team's highest total as a Division I-AA program, used a nine-play march to post a 14-0 lead with 1:15 left in the first quarter. Jones, who has run for 100 or more yards in nine of his last 11 games, took an option pitch on fourth-and-two and sprinted 21 yards up the right sideline to the end zone.

Sacred Heart (3-1, NEC 2-1) sliced the deficit to 14-7 in the second quarter. Cornerback **Pete Athans** picked off a Sciarra pass to set up the short drive, before quarterback **Joe Kroells** crossed the goal line on a 13-yard scramble from the pocket.

The Great Danes, who have won eight of their last nine league games, would also score off a turnover with 2:07 remaining before halftime. Kroells bobbled the center exchange and Albany linebacker **Victor Camacho** recovered the fumble at SHU 17. Five plays later fullback **Eddie Unverzagt** scored from two yards out on a toss sweep for a 21-7 advantage.

Albany reached the end zone on its opening two possessions of the second half, a pair of eight-play, 73-yard drives, to put the game away. Quarterback **Uli Delgado**, who rotated with Sciarra, hooked up with split end **Mike Lavelle** on an inside-screen pass for a 37-yard touchdown. Reserve tailback **Rohann Vidal**, who ran for 55 yards on six attempts, then found paydirt on a 7-yard dash through the middle for a 35-7 advantage with 5:40 left in the period.

Fullback **Jon George**, who picked up 60 rushing yards on five carries, completed the scoring in the fourth quarter, when he rumbled through the Pioneers' secondary on a 39-yard run. Albany's defense, which held the visitors to 165 total yards, including 68 on the ground, set up the final touchdown, as defensive linemen **John Bolt** and **David Parks** teamed on a fourth-down sack near midfield.

"Our offensive line had a great day, and Jon (George) and Gary (Jones) were in another zone," said Albany coach Bob Ford, whose squad scored the most points by an opponent against Sacred Heart since 1999. "They have a young defensive front seven after having graduated some great players and we able to take advantage. I think any time you rush for that kind of yardage, your defense had to get the ball back for you and they did that today."

Sacred Heart quarterbacks **Robert Ammel** and Kroells combined to complete 11 of 21 passes for 97 yards, while senior tailback **Jason Bonadies** was the top rusher with 21 carries for 50 yards. The Pioneers, who had won 33 of their last 37 games entering the contest, saw their seven-game winning streak come to an end.

"Everyone on our team had a good game running the football," said Jones, who climbed to seventh on the school's all-time rushing list. "We started off well, gained momentum on that first drive, and then the defense continued to give us great field position. We knew we could run the ball; we just concentrated better on offense."

### **UALBANY TO PARTICIPATE IN "LACROSSE FOR LEUKEMIA" INVITATIONAL**


Albany, N.Y. – Defending America East Conference champion University at Albany, plus Final Four participants Johns Hopkins and Syracuse will be among 14 teams competing in the Sixth Annual Price Modern "Lacrosse for Leukemia" Fall Invitational Tournament on Saturday, Oct. 4. The round-robin event will be held, from 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m., at McDonogh School in Owings Mills, Md.

Other schools in the field are Loyola, Md., Towson, UMBC, North Carolina, Georgetown, Air Force, Colgate, Butler, Quinnipiac, Drexel and Washington College, the nation's fourth-ranked team in Division III last year.

All proceeds from the tournament will benefit the Maryland Chapter of The Leukemia and Lymphoma Society, whose mission is to cure leukemia, lymphoma, Hodgkin's disease, and myeloma and improve the quality of life of patients and their families. Last year's event raised more than \$100,000 for research and patient services.

"This is a great opportunity to be involved with a charitable event and play against the upper echelon of college lacrosse," said Albany coach **Scott Marr**, who led the Great Danes to the school's first-ever NCAA appearance at the Division I level last spring. "This is a good test for the new kids, a chance to play competitively, and facing Syracuse is a good barometer for our program."

UAlbany will play two 25-minute halves in the tournament's pre-determined format against Colgate, Washington College and eight-time national champion Syracuse. The Great Danes, who are coming off a 10-6 campaign, return their top four scorers, including America East player of the year **Luke Daquino** (22 goals, 35 assists), and goalkeeper **Kevin Rae**, the America East championship MVP.

## UNIVERSITY AT ALBANY ENSHRINES FIVE INTO ATHLETIC HALL OF FAME

Albany, N.Y. – Four former athletes and a legendary coach will be enshrined into the University at Albany Athletic Hall of Fame on Saturday, October 4 at the 20th annual HOF Dinner and Induction Ceremony. A reception for the Athletic Hall of Fame inductees begins at 5:00 p.m., with the dinner and ceremony to follow in the Recreation and Convocation Center (RACC) on campus. The event is preceded by UAlbany's home football game with St. Peter's at 1:00 p.m. Men's soccer and women's volleyball also have home contests on that date.

The new inductees and their sports: Scott Carroll '93, cross country/track; Patty Munhall-Blacklock '87, volleyball; Richard "Doc" Sauers, men's basketball coach; Chris Tironi '89, wrestling; and Scott Turrin '94, football.

With this year's class, there are 99 former athletes, coaches, and administrators who have been inducted into the University's Athletic Hall of Fame.

Scott Carroll (1992-94) -- Carroll was the first athlete in UAlbany history to earn All-America honors in three sports, cross country, indoor track and outdoor track. In 1993-94, he qualified for the NCAA championships in each sport, and won the Division III national title in the 3,000-meter steeplechase.

As a senior, Carroll placed 23rd at the NCAA cross country championships in Grinnell, Iowa with a time of 25:27.5. He led the Great Danes to a third-place finish in the team standings, the Collegiate Track Conference title and an undefeated fall season.

During the indoor and outdoor track season, Carroll won six major invitational and/or conference championships races and qualified for the NCAAs in three outdoor events (1,500, 5,000 and steeplechase) and two indoor events (1,500 and 5,000). He took third in the NCAA indoor 1,500 with a time of 3:58.53, as the Great Danes finished 15th as a team.

Carroll's crowning achievement came at the 1994 NCAA outdoor meet, when he won the 3,000-meter steeplechase and placed ninth in the 1,500. His winning performance of 8:54.43 ranked in the top-five in NCAA history at the time, and was also a school and state record. Carroll, who was the only Division III athlete invited to compete in the steeplechase championship race at Penn Relays, was ranked as one of the top Americans by *Track & Field News*. He would later run in the 1997 New York City Marathon.

Carroll, who hails from Albany, N.Y. (Albany H.S.), received his B.S. in business administration/finance and a master's in management information systems from UAlbany. Carroll has owned a software consulting company, Wango Systems, Inc., since 1997. He has wife Christine, have two children, Connor and Jackson.

**Patty Munhall-Blacklock (1983-87)** -- A two-time All-American, Munhall is one of the top performers in the UAlbany women's volleyball program's history. She led the Great Danes to three NCAA Division III tournament appearances and 112 victories during her career.

As a senior, Munhall was chosen to the American Volleyball Coaches Association (AVCA) All-America squad. She fashioned a .414 hitting percentage in leading her team to a 44-3 record, the NCAA regionals, a top-10 national ranking and the New York State Women's Collegiate Athletic Association (NYSWCAA) championship. She was named All-SUNY Athletic Conference and to the NYSWCAA all-star team.

Munhall, who was positioned at outside hitter and setter, ranks among the school's all-time leaders in several categories, including first in career kills (1,538), fourth in career assists (1,861) and sixth in career kill average (3.43 per game). She also totaled 640 digs, 155 services aces and 141 blocks.

In 1984, Munhall accounted for 463 kills in leading her team to the SUNY Athletic Conference crown, third place at the ECAC tournament and ninth at the NCAA championships. She totaled 399 kills and 676 assists as a freshman, as the program earned its first NCAA berth and was fifth in the 1983 state tournament.

Munhall remains closely tied to the game of volleyball. She served as the head coach at The College of Saint Rose from 1987-90 and Hudson Valley Community College from 1990-94. A native of Colonie, N.Y. (Colonie Central H.S.), she later started the Capital District Volleyball Club.

Munhall has an undergraduate degree in psychology, and later earned her master's in education with an emphasis in college student personnel from Saint Rose. She is presently working at Hudson Valley C.C. as an academic advisor for the individual studies department. She and her husband, Doug, have one stepson, Douglas Aaron.

Richard "Doc" Sauers (1955-97) -- One of the winningest coaches in the history of college basketball with 702 victories, Sauers led the UAlbany men's basketball program to eleven NCAA and four NAIA post-season tournament appearances.

Sauers, whose teams averaged more than 17 wins per season, and had just one losing campaign, became the University's head coach in 1955, when the school was known as the State College for Teachers and the team's nickname was the Pedagogues. During his tenure, the institution evolved into a top research center with a broad mission of undergraduate and graduate education. Meanwhile, the basketball program moved from the NCAA's College Division, to Division III, and then to Division II, plus the nickname changed to Great Danes.

UAlbany teams under Sauers were always geared toward the postseason. From 1975 to 1995, the Great Danes qualified for 10 NCAA tournaments. In 1993-94, UAlbany established a school record for victories with a 25-3 mark, and reached the Division III East Sectional final. Albany also qualified for the Eastern College Athletic Conference (ECAC) playoffs seven times and won a pair of championships in 1978 and 1989.

Coach Sauers guided the Great Danes to 20-win campaigns on 10 occasions, and incredibly his clubs reached the 17-victory plateau in 26 different seasons. He was named the 1985 NCAA Division III Coach of the Year after Albany went 22-6 and gained a national tournament berth. In 1994, he was chosen as both the East Region and New York State Coach of the Year for the third time in his career. Sauers was inducted into the New York State Basketball Hall of Fame in 1992. He has also been enshrined by Slippery Rock University and the Capital District Sports Hall of Fame.

Sauers, who retired in March 1997 as basketball coach, finished his career with a 702-330 record in 41 seasons. He stands alongside such legendary mentors as Kentucky's Adolph Rupp and North Carolina's Dean Smith in the 700-win club. Sauers achieved that prestigious mark on Feb. 8, 1997 in an 89-71 victory over Bridgeport.

In his final season, Albany went 17-10 as a member of the New England Collegiate Conference, and rebounded from his lone losing record the previous year. At the time, Sauers was one of two active coaches with more than 40-plus seasons at the same school. He became the 15th person to coach his 1,000th game at the collegiate level in February 1996.

A native of Harrison City, Pa., Sauers is still active today as UAlbany's head women's golf coach, a position he was appointed to in October 1997. He is no stranger to coaching other sports at the school, and was the head men's golf coach from 1962-79, with a winning dual-match record and a ninth-place NCAA finish in 1963. Sauers also served as head baseball coach in the late 1950s.

Sauers and his wife, the former Elaine Sykes of Schenectady, have two children, Cheryl and Stephen, and two grandchildren, Jordan and Cameron. Stephen played for his father in the late 1980s, and is presently an assistant basketball coach at Marist College.

Chris Tironi (1985-87) -- A two-time national heavyweight champion, Tironi is one of the most decorated wrestlers in school history. In 1986-87, he was named the University at Albany's Male Athlete of the Year.

In his senior year, Tironi won his second NCAA Division III championship in the heavyweight classification, as the Great Danes took third as a team. Tironi, who also won the SUNY Athletic Conference title and earned All-America honors, went on to compete at the Division I championships in College Park, Md. He defeated the Pacific-10 Conference winner en route to a ninth-place finish.

Tironi, who attended SUNY-Cobleskill prior to UAlbany, went 17-0 during the regular season of his junior year. He captured the 1986 SUNYAC championship, finished second at the state meet, and then won his first NCAA heavyweight crown in Trenton, N.J. Tironi, who posted a 70-5 career record, completed that season with a trip to the Division I championships.

Following college, Tironi constructed a celebrated wrestling career on the national scene. He competed in two U.S. Olympic Trials, and was the first alternate in 1988 and second alternate in 1992. Tironi, who placed sixth at the Greco-Roman World Championships in the 220-pound category, captured three USA FILA Junior World titles and was the 1990 USA Senior Greco-Roman champion. In addition, he was an Empire State Games open division titleist on several occasions.

A native of Mechanicville, N.Y. (Mechanicville H.S.), Tironi graduated with a B.A. in sociology. He currently is employed by DeCrescente Distributors, and has previously owned a woodworking business. He and his wife, Kim, have three daughters, Sara, Emily and Abigal. Tironi is a member of the SUNY-Cobleskill Athletic Hall of Fame and NCAA Division III Wrestling Hall of Fame.

Scott Turrin (1991-94) -- An All-America offensive tackle on the Division III level, Turrin was a dominant lineman on Bob Ford's football teams in the early 1990s. He was a three-year starter at right tackle and appeared in 30 career games.

In 1994, Turrin was chosen first-team All-American by the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) and to the Football Gazette third team. He also was picked first-team All-East and made the ECAC Upstate New York Division III All-Star Team.

As a senior tri-captain, Turrin blocked for an offensive unit that led all Division III Upstate New York teams in total yards with a 389.6 average and established eleven individual single-season records. UAlbany's freeze-option attack averaged 25.4 points, and was balanced in rushing (203.4 ypg) and passing (186.2 ypg). Turrin, who received linemen of the week honors six times, was voted as the team's most valuable offensive lineman.

Turrin received his first AFCA/Kodak All-America award as a junior in 1992, when the Great Danes averaged 226.7 rushing yards and 359.1 total yards. He was the offensive line MVP, and blocked for one of the top single-game rushing performances in school history when Albany piled up 473 yards on the ground against Salisbury State. A transfer from Westchester Community College, Furrin started all 10 games in his first season with the program in 1991. He missed the entire '93 campaign following a hernia operation.

A native of Yorktown Heights, N.Y. (Somers H.S.), Turrin earned an undergraduate degree in history, and later received a master's in physical education from Adelphi University. Turrin, who teaches at Rockland Middle School, is in his second year as offensive line coach at John Jay-Cross River High School. His father, Fred and uncle, Armond, both played college football at the College of the Holy Cross.

Albany, N.Y. – Sophomore running back Nick Hartigan rushed for 126 yards and one touchdown in leading Brown to a 21-3 non-conference victory over Albany in the Great Danes' home opener on Saturday afternoon at University Field.

The Bears, who won a season-opening game for the first time since 2000, scored on their first offensive possession following a turnover. Albany quarterback Anthony Sciarra fumbled in an attempted pitch to punter Stan Zylinski on a fourth-down quick kick, and linebacker Dan Doublin fell the botched center exchange. Hartigan then ran for 14 yards to start the drive, before quarterback Kyle Slager threw a 13-yard completion. Sophomore Tristan Murray ran through the middle for a 3-yard touchdown for a 7-0 lead.

Albany (1-2) came back with a seven-play, 72-yard march that ended in Zylinski's 25-yard field goal. Senior tailback Gary Jones, who carried 13 times for a team-high 78 yards, keyed the scoring sequence with a 32-yard dash into Brown territory.

In the second quarter, the Bears upped their advantage to 14-3 with a 13-play drive that lasted more than six minutes. A third-down pass interference penalty near midfield kept the possession alive. Hartigan bulled over the left side from three yards out for the score on a fourth-and-one play.

The Great Danes, who were playing their first-ever Ivy League opponent, looked out of sync on offensive throughout the game. Sciarra, who completed 15 of 27 passes for 102 yards, was sacked four times, including one that ended a possession near the Brown 30. In the fourth quarter, Sciarra's second-and-seven pass was picked off by outside linebacker Anjel Gutierrez on the left sideline and returned 20 yards to the end zone for a 21-3 lead with 6:22 remaining.

"We didn't play as well as we needed in order to beat a team of that caliber," Albany coach Bob Ford said. "Our defense played a pretty good game, but they were on the field an awful lot. We had too many foolish penalties on offense, and then there were the turnovers and other mistakes."

Slager, the nation's fifth-leading passer in Division I-AA last season, connected on 16 of 23 attempts for 188 yards, while split end Jarrett Schreck had six receptions. Meanwhile, the Bears defense held Albany to 268 yards, including 169 on the ground, and forced four turnovers. The Great Danes failed to score a touchdown on their home field for the first time since Oct. 8, 1994.

"It is always bad to lose on your home field, but especially in the first game at home," Jones commented. "We didn't play well offensively and it leaves a bad taste in your mouth. Brown played a heckuva game, but we did not play to our capabilities." -30-

### Albany 28 Central Connecticut State 10

New Britain, Conn. – **Jon George** and **Gary Jones** each rushed for more than 100 yards, and the Albany defense held Central Connecticut State in check in leading the Great Danes to a 28-10 victory in the Northeast Conference opener for both teams on Saturday evening at Arute Field.

Albany (1-1, NEC 1-0) survived four first-half turnovers and a missed field goal to take a 7-0 halftime lead. Central Connecticut State (0-3, NEC 0-1) was stuffed on a fourth-and-five play near midfield, when **David Parks** and **Jermaine Lee** sacked quarterback **Scott Dolch**.

The Great Danes, who have won four of five conference openers, then went on a seven-play, 50-yard scoring drive. Quarterback **Anthony Sciarra** hit flanker **Matt Crudo** with a key 19-yard, third-down pass on the right sideline. Sciarra faked into the line on the next play, rolled right, and found tight end **John Hillman** wide open with a 4-yard TD pass.

Albany took a 14-0 lead early in the third quarter. CCSU's **Cory Harge** fumbled the opening kickoff, when **Jon Carvin** stripped the ball and **Pat Shairs** made the recovery at the Blue Devils' 17. Jones, who rushed for 112 yards on 20 carries, later scored on a 4-yard run over left guard.

The Blue Devils got back into the contest midway through the period, when **Ryan Nichols** returned a fumble 35 yards to paydirt. However, Albany regained control, when **Rohann Vidal** partially blocked a punt. The Great Danes marched 41 yards to the endzone in six plays, all on the ground, for a 21-7 lead. Vidal, a junior tailback, blasted over the left side on a 4-yard touchdown run.

The Great Danes, who rolled up 302 net rushing yards, put the game away on a nine-play drive. George ran for 24 of his career-high 113 during the march, before Jones tallied his second touchdown on a 5-yard plunge.

"The defense played out of its mind and special teams did some good things too," said Albany coach Bob Ford, whose team limited Central Connecticut State to 74 total yards. "It got frustrating because we were moving the ball. We would have a gain and then make a mistake."

Parks, a senior defensive tackle, led his team's defensive effort with a pair of sacks and a fumble recovery to set up Albany's final touchdown. His unit held CCSU to the lowest total yards by a conference opponent and forced seven three-and-out possessions.

"We had a terrible week of practice prior to the Northeastern game," Parks offered. "This week we practiced better and tonight we seemed to have more energy. There's going to be nights when the offense struggles and we've got to get it done if we want to defend last year's title."

#### UALBANY ANNOUNCES MEN'S & WOMEN'S BASKETBALL SCHEDULES FOR 2003-04

Albany, N.Y. – University at Albany Director of Athletics and Recreation Lee McElroy announced today the school's men's and women's basketball schedules for the 2003-04 season. The Great Danes will compete in the America East Conference for the third straight year.

The America East schedule for the men begins on Jan. 2 against conference-newcomer UMBC at the Recreation and Convocation Center. The season concludes with the America East Conference Tournament on March 5, 6, 7 and 13. Boston University's Walter Brown Arena will host the first round, quarterfinals and semifinals.

The Great Danes' non-conference schedule is highlighted by a trip to Pittsburgh, last year's Big East Conference tournament champion, on Nov. 28. The Panthers, who feature Preseason Wooden All-America candidate Julius Page, finished 28-5 and reached the NCAA Midwest Regional Sweet Sixteen. UAlbany also faces Atlantic 10 Conference opponent Massachusetts on Dec. 28, and meets crosstown-rival Siena in the season opener on Nov. 21 at Pepsi Arena. Albany has a 13-game home schedule that includes a date with defending Northeast Conference champion Wagner on Dec. 30. In addition to the America East teams, Army and Lehigh, of the Patriot League, visit the RACC.

America East Conference Rookie of the Year Jamar Wilson and sophomore Levi Levine are among five letterwinners returning. Wilson, a second-team all-conference selection, finished second in the league in scoring at 18.9 points per game, plus set the school's freshman scoring record. Levine, a 6-foot-6 forward, was among the A-East leaders in scoring (13.2 ppg) and rebounding (6.0 pg). Head coach Will Brown is in his third season.

The Albany women's program opens its schedule on Nov. 21 against Siena at Pepsi Arena, and then begins America East play against New Hampshire on Jan. 7. The conference tournament is slated for March 10-13 at The Chase Family Arena in West Hartford, Conn.

The Great Danes are entered in Florida International's FIU Fun & Sun Classic on Dec. 28-29 in Miami, Fla. Albany takes on FIU, a 2003 WNIT participant, in the first round. Pepperdine, who advanced to the NCAAs with a 22-8 record last year, and Hofstra are also in the field. A 13-game home schedule at the RACC starts with Patriot League foe Navy on Nov. 23.

Head coach Trina Patterson welcomes back three starters, including All-America East center Danielle Hutcheson. The 6-foot-4 junior ranked seventh in scoring (13.9 ppg) and third in rebounding (9.4 pg) among the league leaders. Senior guard Sarah Sweetland (8.5 ppg) and junior forward Maree Jones, who averaged 5.6 points and 7.1 rebounds, also return.

Two doubleheaders are scheduled in February at home. New Hampshire visits the Capital Region for Big Purple Growl, the University's Winter Homecoming, on Feb. 7. America East-rival Hartford is the opponent for the men and women on Feb. 21.

### Northeastern 51, Albany 0

Brookline, Mass. – Quarterback **Shawn Brady** passed for 246 yards, four touchdowns in leading Northeastern to a 51-0 non-conference victory over Albany in the Great Danes' season opener on Saturday afternoon at Parsons Field.

The Huskies, ranked sixth nationally in this week's ESPN/USA Today Division I-AA poll, converted three turnovers into 21 first-quarter points to take control.

Brady, who completed 10-of-14 attempts, directed his team on a 59-yard scoring march following a fumble by Albany quarterback **Uli Delgado**. Brady hit **Quintin Mitchell** with a five-yard pass in the left corner of the end zone to finish off the eight-play sequence.

Safety **Anthony Nolen** picked off a Delgado pass in the left flat on Albany's next possession and returned the errant throw to the 10-yard line. Brady then connected with **Cory Parks** on the very next play for a touchdown.

The Great Danes, who moved the ball well in the opening quarter, drove to the Northeastern 32, but on a third-and-two play backup quarterback **Anthony Sciarra** fumbled and linebacker **Robbiel Moore** recovered. The Huskies, who won last year's Atlantic 10 conference title, then went nine plays to paydirt, with running back **Tim Gale** scoring on a two-yard run for a 21-0 lead.

Northeastern (2-0) tacked on 13 points in the second quarter to build a 34-0 halftime cushion. Brady rolled to his right and fired a 69-yard strike to Parks for one score. Placekicker **Miro Kesic** added field goals 35 and 30 yards.

"The three turnovers really cost us," Albany coach **Bob Ford** said. "It took field position and momentum away from us, and gave them a short field to work with. They have a great defense; I swear they blitz 12 people every play. They took advantage of our two green quarterbacks."

Parks, a sophomore wide receiver, hauled in his third touchdown of the day in the third quarter, when Brady beat the blitz with a 62-yard scoring throw. Parks, who set the school's single game receiving yards record, caught seven passes for 246 yards.

"We had too many turnovers," said Albany captain **Jon George**, who rushed six times for a team-high 41 yards from his fullback spot. "We shut down mentally and physically in the second quarter and didn't give our defense a chance."

Delgado connected on 3-of-12 passes for 30 yards, while Sciarra, who left the game with a hip contusion, hit on 3-of-7 for 41 yards. The Great Danes were shut out for the first time since Oct. 8, 1994, a streak of 90 straight games.

#### ALBANY WINS FIVE-SET THRILLER OVER MANHATTAN

Hempstead, N.Y. – Sophomore outside hitter **Eileen Nicole Rodriguez** recorded the first triple-double in the school's Division I history with 11 kills, 10 aces and 12 digs as Albany defeated Manhattan, 3-2, on Saturday afternoon at the Volleyball Venue as part of the Hofstra/Asics New York Classic. Rodriguez was named most valuable player of the tournament for the Great Danes, who have won three in-a-row.

Albany (4-2) took an early two sets to none lead before Manhattan rallied to force the deciding game five, winning 15-13.
