On behalf of the Committee on Comparative Politics of the Social Science Research Council, I take pleasure in inviting you to attend a conference on Political Parties and Political Development, to be held in Rome, Italy, Monday - Thursday, January 6-9, 1964.

This conference is fifth in a series on the theme of political development. Earlier meetings on this theme have dealt with communications, bureaucracy and education, and with a comparison of aspects of political development in Japan and Turkey. Two volumes containing the papers for the conferences, edited by members of the committee, have been published by the Princeton University Press, and it is anticipated that the papers for the conference on political parties will be published in similar form. The first two volumes are Communications and Political Development (1962), edited by Lucian W. (a) political parties and national integration; (b) political parties and political recruitment and participation; (c) political parties and elite relations; and (d) political parties and policy making.

Invitations are being issued to about 35 scholars, the majority of whom are from European countries. Copies of papers will be sent to you in advance, and no papers will be read in conference sessions since it is intended to devote the available time to discussion of issues raised by the papers.

The Council will be glad to reimburse you for your travel expenses in attending the conference, and for meals and lodging during the sessions, from Sunday evening, January 5 through Thursday night, January 9. Please inform us if you wish an advance for travel expenses. The first session of the conference will open at 9:30 a.m., on Monday, January 6, and the last session will end at 5:00 p.m., on Thursday, January 9. An informal dinner will be held at 7:30 p.m. on Sunday, January 5, for those participants then present in Rome. Single rooms will be reserved for you at a hotel to be announced later.
