The executive committee met
pursuant to adjournment at
the office of the Superintendent of
Public Instruction.

The minutes of the previous
meetings were read and approved.

✓ Mr. Draper made a report as to
the title of the present site of the
Normal School building, inclosing
a March map by Edward
W. Rankin. On motion the
documents were placed on file.

✓ Mr. Murray from the Committee
appointed to collect information
as to sites for a new building
submitted a statement as to
the following properties:

1. That additions may be made to the present ground by purchase on Howard St. at a probable cost of \$10,000 to \$11,000.
2. That a block $148^6 \times 165$ ft lying on Swan St between Lancaster and Jay bringing to the Bunker estate can be secured for about \$39,000.
3. That Mr. R. C. Bruyn offers a block 106×172 ft on the corner of Hudson Avenue and Lark St. at \$21,000.
4. That Mr. George B. Hyatt offers his ground $75\frac{1}{2}$ m. Eagle St by $360\frac{1}{2}$ m. Elm St adjoining the grounds of the former mansions for \$25,000.
5. That Mrs. Austin offers 125×227 m. the ^{S.E.} corner of Elm & Hawk for \$20,000. Also on the S. W. corner $157\frac{1}{2}$ m. Elm St by 220 m. Hawk with brick residence for \$28,000.
6. That Mr. M. V. B. Waggoner offers a block fronting on Hawk St. 198 ft between Orange and Canal Sts & 150 ft deep for \$13,000, or extending 200 ft deep for \$16,000.
7. Owners of property on Washington Ave. make a combined offer as follows: No. 118 & 120, 33×185 ft for \$12,000; $122, 16^6 \times 185$ ft for \$6,000; $124, 16^6 \times 171$ ft for \$6,000; $126 \& 128, 33 \times 171$ ft for \$12,000; total 99 ft on Wash. Ave by $185 \& 171$ ft deep. for \$36,000

8 Mr. Austin Adams offers premises on Willett Street midway between Madison and Hudson Avenues, 145⁶-ft on Winter St and 165 ft deep, at \$30,000.

On motion the consideration of sites was postponed to Saturday evening June 9th; the appointment of an architect was deferred to the same date.

The Executive Committee then adjourned to meet on Saturday evening June 9th at 8 o'clock in the office of Superintendent of Public Instruction.
