

Head Coach Craig McVey

Craig McVey enters his eighth year at the helm of the UAlbany men's and women's cross country programs. He is also beginning his 13th year as the institution's associate head track and field coach, where he works with the program's distance runners and pole vaulters. In addition to having school records set at every distance, McVey has seen the men place as high as second and the women finish as high as third at the America East Conference Cross Country Championships under his guidance. The distance runners and pole vaulters he has coached have helped the track and field teams combine to win 15 America East titles and two IC4A championships.

Over the past seven seasons, Great Dane harriers have earned a total of 26 All-East honors. Brian Yurkewecz and R.J. Sniffen garnered All-East regional laurels last year. Ricardo Estremera was the second Great Dane in four years to win the individual title at the 2007 IC4A University Championship. Robbie Freeman also accomplished the feat in 2004. As the associate head track and field coach, he has seen

pole vaulter Luke Schoen garner All-America honors three times over the past two seasons, while Estremera earned the laurel in the steeplechase at the 2009 NCAA outdoor meet. Steeplechaser Ryan Gaedje was a 2005 Junior National All-American. Andy Allstadt and Freeman won consecutive 5,000-meter America East titles under the four-time regional coach of the year, and Allstadt was the recipient of UAlbany's Presidential Scholar-Athlete Award and received an NCAA Postgraduate Scholarship. Alyssa Lotmore, the indoor America East champion in the 3,000- and 5,000-meter running events, earned the same scholarship in 2007. In addition, both school records in the steeplechase have been broken during his tenure.

McVey's coaching career in cross country and track and field began at Kansas State in 1983, where his athletes captured 18 Big Eight Conference titles and ranked as the top NCAA top combined men's and women's program. He became head men's and women's cross country and track coach at Hartwick College five years later, where his teams eclipsed 83 school records and produced NCAA All-Americans as well as 22 New York Collegiate individual champions. Prior to his arrival at UAlbany, McVey coached at Saint Rose during the 1996-97 academic year. The women's cross country team won the NYCAC Conference title and the men finished second. In addition, Golden Knight runners claimed both individual titles at the conference championship meet.

A native of Manhattan, Kan., McVey received a bachelor's degree in physical education from Kansas State in 1979 and earned his master's degree from the institution in 1985. As an undergraduate student, McVey was a member of two Big Eight Conference indoor track and field championship teams, a Big Eight cross country championship team and KSU squads which were ranked annually among the NCAA's top dual-meet teams. He currently resides in Guilderland with his wife, Bette, and their children, Luke (20), Kirsten (16), Maggie (15) and Tyler (9).



Roberto Vives Director of Track & Field / Cross Country

Roberto Vives enters his 25th season as the director of UAlbany's track & field and cross country programs. In that period, Vives has coached 141 All-America athletes and 14 individual NCAA champions. Eight of his athletes have been inducted into the school's Athletic Hall of Fame. In addition, the track and field teams have won 15 America East Conference and two IC4A championships.

Vives has led UAlbany to 40 conference championships and four New York State titles. In addition to his responsibilities at UAlbany, he was an administrator and coach at the U.S. Olympic Festival between 1993 and 1995, and he also served as CTC President and the USA Track & Field East Men's Development Chair.

Under his tutelage, Joe Greene (400-meter hurdles) and Marc Pallozzi (javelin throw) became the first two Great Dane track and field athletes in UAlbany history to score points at an NCAA Division I meet with their performances at the 2007 NCAA Track and Field Championships. Luke Schoen became UAlbany's third All-American when he placed fifth in the pole vault at the NCAAs in 2008, and three individuals earned four All-America certificates this past year.

Vives began coaching at the age of 14 when he founded the Bronx International Athletic Club (BIAC). The BIAC grew to include 200 members and helped produce six Olympians. He was also an assistant coach during his senior year at Cardinal Hayes High School. He later returned to Cardinal Hayes in 1979 as head coach of track and field. He spent three years at his alma mater prior to his appointment as boys' track and field coach at Bronx High School of Science, a position he held until moving to UAlbany in the fall of 1985.

Vives earned a bachelor's degree from Seton Hall University in health, physical education and recreation in 1978, where he was also a Dean's List student and a member of the track and field team. He went on to earn a master's degree in health education from the City College of New York in 1980, where he also assisted as a men's track and field coach. He currently resides in Selkirk with his wife, Valrene. They have two children, Andres (25) and Ashley (22).



Assistant Coach Jennifer Fazioli

Jennifer Fazioli begins her third season as an assistant cross country and track and field coach. In her current role, she is responsible for conducting practices during all three seasons and assisting with the writing and implementing of training for the middle distance and distance runners in track and field.

Fazioli, who also coaches the 10,000-meter runners and the student-athletes on the non-traditional (develop-

mental) roster during the indoor and outdoor seasons, plays a major role in recruiting for all track and field events. In addition, she serves as the academic liaison for the cross country and track and field programs.

Prior to her arrival at UAlbany, Fazioli was the assistant compliance coordinator at Oregon State University. In that position, her responsibilities included academic and eligibility issues, rules education sessions for coaches and student-athletes, and financial aid.

Fazioli ran at the University of Colorado and was a member of the 2000 NCAA Division I Women's Cross Country championship team. Her team also placed second on three occasions. She earned her bachelor's degree in history from Colorado in 2002 and a master's in labor studies and industrial relations from Penn State University in 2004. Fazioli, Colorado's Scholar Athlete of the Year in 2002, also became the youngest qualifier for the 2004 Olympic Marathon Trials when she posted a time of 2:47.22.

A native of Averill Park, N.Y., Fazioli was a three-time state champion and garnered All-America recognition in high school on two occasions in cross country. She currently resides in Ballston Lake.



Assistant Coach Matt Jones

Matt Jones enters his third season as an assistant coach of the UAlbany cross country and track and field programs. He has been involved in cross country and track and field development for three decades in the Capital Region.

Jones is responsible for assisting head coach Craig McVey with all aspects of the cross country program as well as working with the middle distance runners on their

fall conditioning for the upcoming track and field seasons.

Jones most recently served as Athletic Director/Director of Physical Education for the Shenendehowa School District from 1997-2007. In addition to leading the high school's cross country team to five state championships, Jones was named the New York State Section II Cross Country Coach of the Year seven times and the National Federation Interscholastic Coaches Association Boys' Cross Country Northeast Section Coach of the Year.

A native of Schenectady, N.Y., Jones earned an associate's degree in physical education from Hudson Valley Community College, a bachelor's degree in physical education from SUNY-Cortland, a master's in physical education and curriculum instruction from Castleton State and his School Administrator Supervisor degree from North Adams State College. He was inducted into the HVCC Athletic Hall of Fame in 1995.

Jones, who also currently works as a physical education teacher at Shenendehowa Middle School, resides in Clifton Park with his wife, Cathy. They have three sons, Chris (27), Nick (23) and Ryan (19).







2009 SEASON OUTLOOK


Even though both teams will once again be extremely young, the UAlbany men's and women's cross country programs will look to continue their ascension in the America East Conference. Both teams lost their top performer to graduation, but the progress made by the returners combined with one of the strongest recruiting classes in years should help the programs continue to grow. With over 30 student-athletes on board, head coach Craig McVey, now in his eighth season, is looking forward to overseeing the largest, and arguably the deepest, rosters the programs have ever had.

"We are really intent on moving up (in the conference)," McVey said. "We want the women to make a serious bid to be fourth and maybe hit that top three spot. It will be a tougher order for the guys, but they should improve as well."

Both squads moved up a spot in the team standings at the America East championships last season despite fielding two of the most inexperienced clubs. The men had the youngest group in the nine-team field, as runners two through six at the league meet were all freshmen. The women featured the second-youngest squad among the top five teams, as three of the top five finishers were underclassmen. This year will be no different.

"When you look at our rosters, there will be a sophomore, two juniors and a few freshmen on the women's side and mostly sophomores on the men's side who will be in our top five," McVey explained. "I can't see another squad in the conference having this many young people even in their top nine."

Sophomore Ada Lauterbach and junior Ally Panos are expected to lead the way for the women's team. In addition to improving her marks throughout the fall, Panos burst onto the scene during the outdoor track and field season when she clocked in at 18:03.82 in the 5,000 at Princeton in mid-April. She also finished 26 places higher at the league championship than she did as a freshman in 2007. Lauterbach, who started as the number three harrier on the women's squad before she was sidelined due to illness, showed steady progress through the spring by qualifying for the ECAC championship in the steeplechase in a time of 10:54.50. Lauterbach also placed fifth at the America East championship, scoring points to help the Great Danes secure their third outdoor track and field league title in the last four years.

"Both of them are going to have a great fall," said McVey. "Ally has done all the work that we ask people to do. To have come in with a 22-minute-and-change 5k in cross country and run 18:03 on the track is just out of sight. Ada has had a great year of training. She will scare other people's top five in the conference. Over time, she is going to be able to challenge for a spot in the top five of the conference."

The women's team brings in seven freshmen, most notably Brianna Service and Mikala Anson. Service was a two-time all-state selection and a four-time all-county and all-league honoree at Arlington High School on Long Island. Anson was an all-state selection and two-time Suburban Council All-Star at Colonie Central who has been timed at 17:55 on a 5k course.

"Brianna has a really great shot of being our number three runner," McVey said. "She has had some great workouts and looks to be totally at home. She will be one of the best freshmen in the conference. Mikala is going through different workouts that she is not accustomed to, such as doing a higher volume of training on grass. So far I have been very pleased with what she has done, and she is going to be a top-five person for us."

Other notable returners include junior Kristin Grab, who finished 37 spots better at last year's America East meet than she did as a freshman, and senior Roxanne Wegman, a transfer from Army where she was an All-Patriot League second-team selection. Along with freshman Melissa Del Rosario, these three should all be fighting for the fifth spot. Junior Zuliana Fontanez, a versatile athlete who is one of the conference's premier middle-distance runners, Esperanza Blanco, Jenn Pierson and Laura Varble also return, while newcomers Emily Finnegan, Miranda McConnell, Nayamka Roberts-Smith and Rachel Wysocki will look to make an impact as well.

Sophomore R.J. Sniffen, an all-state second-team performer on the scholastic level, is the top returner on the men's team. Sniffen was the Great Danes' number two harrier last season, ending the fall with a 20th-place finish at the IC4A championship to garner All-East honors. He continued to improve during the winter and spring seasons and competed at the USA Junior National Track & Field Championships.

"R.J. had a great freshman year and had a great experience after the outdoor conference meet training for USA Junior Nationals," McVey stated. "During the start of the race, he got hammered in the leg and couldn't push off with it normally while trying to run 5,000 meters. He learned a lot about not just preparing for a big race, but how to pull it off mentally and emotionally. He is going to be one of the top sophomores in the conference."

Freshman Alex Leuchanka could be among the top recruited athletes the program has ever had since Andy Allstadt, a four-time all-conference selection from 2001-04. The New York Cross Country Federation champion who also led Shenendehowa to the team title in the fall of 2008 has completed a 5k cross country course in 15:04. He also led Warwick Valley, where he competed for three years through his junior season, to a state title. McVey sees Leuchanka and Sniffen as co-number one runners who will look to use each other to get through races from start to finish.

"Alex has got quite a resume," McVey explained. "I see him as hands-down being the best freshman in the conference. I think Alex as well as R.J. are all-conference candidates. It will just be a matter of how well they work together."

Sophomore Jack Kelley turned heads in his collegiate debut by placing fourth overall and first on the team at the Monmouth Kick-Off Classic, leading UAlbany to the team title. Despite running with an injury, he was still able to drop his 8k time on the Oregon Ridge Park course by 53 seconds in just one month at the America East meet. He should also be in the Great Danes' top five along with redshirt freshmen Ethan Clary and Ryan Florkiewicz. Florkiewicz won the individual title at the state championships as a senior at Warwick Valley in 2007, while Clary graduated as the school-record holder in the 3,000-meter

steeplechase at Schuylerville.


Craig Weiss and Sean Halpin round out the list of top newcomers for the upcoming season. Weiss, another harrier to come out of Shaker, graduated as a three-time Section II all-star who advanced to states twice. Although primarily a middle-distance runner, McVey is hoping that Halpin's biggest successes at distances such as the 800 and 1,000 will carry over to the cross country courses at the college level. He was an eight-time all-state selection, including three years in cross country, and an All-Westchester County pick each year in all three sports.

In addition to Halpin, juniors Aaron Lozier and John Moore are a pair of middle-distance competitors who will add depth to the team. Lozier smashed the school record in the mile (4:05.16) which stood for 17 years, while Moore broke the program standard in the 1,500 (3:45.88) this past spring and was an NCAA East Regional qualifier.

David Rothman, the only upperclassman who has been competing since he was a freshman, is also back in the mix. Sophomores Jimmy Carroll and Ian Ellis, redshirt freshmen Cory Greczyn and Paul Lagno, and freshman Jared Leslie will also look to contribute.

The Great Danes have had their share of successes. The men have produced two IC4A champions in Robbie Freeman and Ricardo Estremera. Allstadt was a four-time All-America East selection, and numerous members of the women's team have earned the same honor. However, McVey and his team are not satisfied.

"We are not where we want to be," McVey said. "While the work ethic and mentality has always been great, one thing we have talked about as a team is to change the culture of what we are doing as far as expectations go to take that next step. We will need a couple of extra people next year to help us get that done, but I think we are on the edge right now with the people that we have from top to bottom to not just postively impact the culture, but to take it to another place."





CROSS COUNTRY IN THE UALBANY ATHLETIC HALL OF FAME

Bill Vanos (1990-94) - Inducted 2004. A two-time track and field All-American and accomplished cross country competitor on the NCAA Division III level, Vanos is one of the top distance runners in UAlbany history. In 1994, Vanos finished second in the 10,000-meter run at the NCAA outdoor championships and sixth in the 5,000-meter run at the national indoor meet. He captured the Collegiate Track Conference 3,000-meter steeplechase title and was third at Penn Relays in the 5,000-meter run. Vanos also competed in three NCAA cross country championships and recorded a pair of top-35 individual finishes.

Scott Carroll (1992-94) - Inducted 2003. Carroll was the first athlete in UAlbany history to earn All-America honors in three sports: cross country, indoor track and outdoor track. In 1993-94, he qualified for the NCAA championships in each sport and won the Division III national title in the 3,000-meter steeplechase. During the indoor and outdoor track season, Carroll won six major invitational and/or conference championship races. He also qualified for the NCAAs in three outdoor events (1,500-meter run, 5,000-meter run and 3000-meter steeplechase) and two indoor events (1,500-meter run and 5,000-meter run). Carroll took third in the NCAA indoor 1,500-meter run with a time of 3:58.53, as the Great Danes finished 15th as a team. Carroll's crowning achievement came at the 1994 NCAA outdoor meet, when he won the 3,000-meter steeplechase and placed ninth in the 1,500-meter run. His winning performance of 8:54.43 ranked in the top five in NCAA history at the time, and was also a school and state record. Carroll, who was the only Division III athlete invited to compete in the steeplechase championship race at Penn Relays, was ranked as one of the top Americans by Track & Field News. He would later run in the 1997 New York City Marathon.

Tonya Dodge (1994-97) - Inducted 2002. Dodge is the only woman in school history to earn All-America honors in cross country, indoor track and outdoor track. In 1996-97, she was named the University at Albany's Female Athlete of the Year. Finishing her career with nine school records in track and field, she received All-America recognition during the '97 indoor season with a fifth-place finish in the NCAA Division II one-mile run, in a time of 4:54.72. As a senior, she posted the best finish by an eastern runner at the 1996 NCAA Division II cross country championships and was 13th overall in 18:35.1. A first-team All-New England Collegiate Conference selection on two occasions, she captured four individual titles, including the NECC and Collegiate Track Conference championships, and set an East Stroudsburg course record (18:20).


