DELTA PHI EPSILON was founded at New York University Law School on March 17, 1917, by Minna Goldsmith Mahler, Ida Bienstock Landau, Sylvia Stierman Cohen, Eva Effron Robin, and Dorothy Cohen Schwartzman.

Government Government is vested in the Executive Council, which is composed of members elected at each biennial convention. The fraternity is divided geographically into several areas, each having a province director. Chairmen for special activities and interests are appointed, the convention is held biennially for the election of officers, consideration of policy, and all matters of national im-

portance. The Central Office is supervised by the executive director, with her staff and several field consultants.

Traditions and Insignia Each year, on March 17, undergraduates and alumnae celebrate Founders' Day, and on this day each chapter must undertake some special charitable activity.

The Delta Phi Epsilon Cup is awarded biennially to the undergraduate chapter attaining the highest ranking based on scholarship and achievement, both in collegiate and community activities, and cooperation with the Executive Council. The Triangle Plaque is awarded to the chapter with the second best rating. The Scrapbook Gavel is a permanent award presented to the chapter having the finest scrapbook of chapter activities. The Progress Plaque is awarded to the chapter having made the greatest progress in the two years prior to the biennial convention. The Ethel B. Gerson Community Service Cup is presented to the chapter outstanding in community and campus activities. Community Service and Scholarship Certificates are given to the-most deserving chapters. The areas of rush, pledge education, house management, alumnae service, and inter-sorority cooperation are also recognized.

The badge is an equilateral gold triangle bordered with 21 pearls, supporting a raised triangle of black enamel, on which the Greek letters $\Delta\Phi E$ are embossed in gold, with a gold ribbon inscribed with the motto beneath the base. The pledge pin is a plain equilateral triangle of purple enamel, bearing the Greek letters $\Delta\Phi E$ in gold. The recognition pin is small and dull in color with the Greek letters $\Delta\Phi E$ arranged vertically. The flower is the iris; the jewel is the pearl; and the colors are royal purple and pure gold.

Publications The *Delta Phi Epsilon Triad*, the official magazine, is published twice a year. Membership in the fraternity includes a life subscription. Other publications are the *Manual*, which includes the history, traditions, and procedures; the *Song Book; Rush Guide; Pledge Guide*; and Alumnae Newsletter.

Funds and Philanthropies The Edith Barash Stern Fund, established in 1944 for the support of a war orphan, has, from 1959 to 1984, raised funds for the Foundation for Mental Health and the Juvenile Diabetes Foundation. A new recipient will be chosen at the 1985 convention. Since 1955 the official Delta Phi Epsilon Philanthropic Project has been the support of the Cystic Fibrosis Research Foundation. In 1985, the fraternity added Anorexia Nervosa and Related Disorders Foundation as a philanthropy.

The Delta Phi Epsilon Scholarship Foundation, created in recognition of the Fraternity's 50th anniversary, provides grants and loans to members and their families.
