

COMMITTEE ON ETHICS IN RESEARCH AND SCHOLARSHIP (CERS)

Reviews policy and implementation of policy for responses to allegations of misconduct in research and scholarship; receives and reviews yearly reports from the Vice President for Research on the occurrence of cases pertaining to violations of academic integrity principles in research and scholarship and their disposition; supplies at least one member to serve on the Inquiry and Investigation Committees charged with evaluating allegations of violations of academic integrity in research and scholarship; reports to the Senate via the Senate Executive Committee. (Membership of CERS is limited to the full professor rank.)

Each member will commit to serving a term of three years.
