

IUE-CIO Breaks Through in South: Plant-wide Seniority in Louisville

IUE-CIO has broken through the geographical Iron Curtain GE is trying to erect between the North and the South. In doing so it has assured that if GE still tries to move jobs away from Unionized plants, it is going to have to pay Southern workers the same wages and provide the same conditions.

This significant victory for the Labor movement was won on the 14th of May in Louisville, Kentucky. On that date IUE-CIO Local 761 brought the General Electric Company around to signing IUE-CIO's demands for a Local Supplement.

Local 761 is the fighting local at GE's new giant Appliance Park, which will be the home of all appliance production for GE. Now representing 3,000 production and maintenance employees, GE has scheduled the "park" to have a work force of 16,000 next year.

IUE-CIO's victory on winning plant-wide seniority is one of a series of important victories in the South—an area that UE has not been able to organize.

IUE-CIO won bargaining rights at Louisville last August 12 when it de-

feated UE in an NLRB election by the overwhelming vote of . . .

The Louisville victory wasn't the first GE run-away plant to be organized by IUE-CIO.

Prior to that IUE-CIO organized GE plants in Linton, Ind. and Anniston, Ala. UE was repudiated in both locations.

Other run-away shops won by IUE-CIO are in Selma, Ala., Shawnee, Okla., Paducah, Ky., Memphis, Tenn., Dallas, Texas, Anderson, S. C., and other cities.

Philly Local Ends UE Tie

On Wednesday another Local quit UE and joined IUE-CIO.

At a membership meeting in Philadelphia, employees of Wiedmann Machine Company, voted overwhelmingly to disaffiliate from UE and join IUE-CIO. They formerly belonged to UE Local 155. Now they are chartered as IUE-CIO Local 123.

it doesn't represent a single plant in the entire South. Its last local—in Huntington, W. Va. — joined IUE-CIO on May 5.

In the nine months that IUE-CIO has been in Louisville, it has not only won plant-wide seniority. On top of that IUE-CIO has succeeded in raising piece-work prices on 500 jobs by an average of 15%.

As a result, today GE workers on many piece-work jobs in Louisville receive the same earnings as GE workers in Erie, where UE has represented the people for more than 14 years!

Day rates have been raised, too. Such as on locomotive engineer classification the rate has been raised from \$1.73 to \$1.93½ and the Union is continuing to fight for \$2.00½ as the rate for that job.

That is the way to stop the run-away shops.

By seeing to it that the company will have to pay the same rates in one area as in another will make the company stay where it already is located.

UE has proved too weak to organize run-away plants. Only IUE-CIO has been able to do the job!

The court ruled that the order was unconstitutional.


ACROSS THE ROAD
