The meeting was held in the office of the Commissioner of Education, Chairman Draper in the chair and all members present.

The minutes of the previous meeting were approved as read.

President Milne presented the name of Myron T. Dana, Principal of the Normal College at Fredonia, as a candidate for the degree of Doctor of Pedogogy. After complimentary remarks had been made, it was moved, seconded and carried that the degree be conferred upon him.

President Milne announced that Professor White had tendered his resignation, after fifteen years of service in this College, to become interested in a private school. On motion the resignation was accepted. It was then moved that Professor John M. Sayles be appointed Principal of the High School, at a salary of \$1800 a year, to fill the place made vacant by Professor White's resignation. The motion was carried.

President Milne stated that Mr. John H. Cook had also resigned, and on motion his resignation was accepted.

President Milne recommended Mr. Winfred C. Decker to fill the place made vacant by the promotion of Professor Sayles, to take charge of the Grammar Department and aid in teaching German, at a salary of \$1400 a year. On motion the recommendation was adopted and the appointment made.

Dr. Milne recommended that Mr. Harry Birchenough, a graduate of Cornell and of this College, be appointed to teach advanced mathematics at a salary of \$1200 a year. On motion the appointment was made.

Dr. Milne recommended that Miss Louise Ward Clement be appointed as assistant in English and History, at a salary of \$600. On motion this appointment was made.

On recommendation of President Milne it was moved, seconded and carried that Miss Charlotte Loeb's salary be increased from \$10 a week to \$600 a year; that the Salary of Miss Caroline Ruth Horne be increased from \$750 to \$850 a year; and that of Miss McCutcheon be increased from \$800 to \$900 a year.

President Milne stated that during the past year the sum of \$75 had been paid to Miss Elizabeth V. Gardner for conducting classes in bookkeeping and Commercial Law. On motion this expenditure was approved.

On motion it was resolved that the Treasurer be authorized to replace the carpet which had been worn out in the Presbyterian Church at a cost not to exceed \$500.


