The Committee met at the call of the Secretary,
President Mr. Penrudd,

The Secretary read a letter from the Chairman under date of yesterday, saying that he was suffering under severe illness, and that by the advice of his physician he must leave the city for his family in Buffalo, and requesting that the committee would proceed with such arrangements as they should deem proper to fill the place of Miss. Funnelle whose resignation he had understood had been formally received. The Secretary then laid before the committee a written communication from Miss. Funnelle, tendering her resignation as Principal of the Primary Department and asking that may take effect the first or at the latest the second week in November.

The letter of the Chairman above referred to states that Mr. Shellow, Principal of the Normal & Training School of Oswego had informed him that he can supply a teacher of superior qualifications for the position held by Miss. Funnelle.

Whereupon the Secretary was directed to confer with the Principal on the subject and if no reasons are suggested to render such action inexpedient, to visit Oswego for the purpose of conference with Mr. Shellow & the teacher recommended by him to the Chairman, with power to tender her the situation.

The Secretary was directed to make the following entry on the minutes & to communicate it to Miss. Funnelle.

The committee receive with unfeigned regret the resignation of Miss. Funnelle.

of the position which for more than two years she has held as Principal of the Primary department of the Normal School, and they bear the fullest testimony to the ability faithful up and devotion with which she has discharged her duties. She carries with her the best wishes of the Committee for her success in the new field of labor to which she is called.

Nov. 19, 1866.

The committee met at the call of the chair man.

The Secretary stated that after consultation with the Principal as directed at the last meeting of the Committee, he visited Oswego in company with Mr. Fennelle and on the recommendation of Mr. Sheldon Principal of the Oswego Normal & Training School, and after having seen Miss Rebecca Jones both in incitation to take charge of Clap's they engaged her to take charge of the Primary Depart-
ment at such time as it should be con-
nectedary for Miss. Fennelle to leave.

The Committee unanimously approved this approval of the arrangement and directed the Secretary to request Miss Jones to spend several days in the school with Miss. Fennelle.
