The minutes of the previous Meeting were approved as read.

Dr. Draper suggested that the Building Committee have placed in the new building, the Bronze Tablet removed from the old building, with an appropriate explanation if necessary, and that the Soldiers Tablet be also properly placed. Suggestions were adopted.

Dr. Milne stated that more than 25 pupils had reported for work in the 7th and 8th grades, and that instruction in these was going on.

Dr. Milne recommended that Richard Kirtland be appointed Professor in English, at a salary of \$1800.00 a year. On motion he was so appointed.

Dr. Milne recommended that Adna Risley be appointed Professor in English History at \$2500.00. On motion she was so appointed.

Dr. Milne also recommended that Miss Areline Denison be appointed teacher of the 8th grade, at a salary of \$80.00 a month; she to take the place of Miss Cook, to whom leave of absence was granted for six months. On motion this appointment was made.

It was moved, seconded, and carried, that the Building Committee be authorized to instruct and to secure, and erect, suitable Flag Staff and Flag, on the College Grounds.
