WOMEN'S BASKETBALL NAMES TRI-CAPTAINS FOR 2001-02 SEASON

Albany, N.Y. – University at Albany women's basketball coach Mari Warner announced today that **Cara Caffell**, **Marie Connors** and **Jess McGinlay** will serve as tri-captains for the 2001-02 season.

Caffell, a 6-foot-3 senior from Beamsville, Ontario, averaged 5.5 points and 5.1 rebounds and totaled a team-leading 34 blocks in 27 starts last season. She ranks fourth on the school's all-time blocks list with 73.

Connors, a 6-foot-1 senior from Hannon, Ontario, averaged 5.6 points and 5.1 rebounds in 2000-01 at the power forward position. She started 19 games and appeared in every contest.

McGinlay returns as the squad's leading scorer after posting a 10.1 points per game average. The Burke, Va., native tallied four 20-plus point games despite coming off the bench.

Albany posted a 5-22 record last year and enters its inaugural season in the America East Conference. The Great Danes open the regular season Nov. 16 on the road against Bucknell.

ALISSA GIBBS NAMED AMERICA EAST PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Boston, Mass. – University at Albany's **Alissa Gibbs** (Shenendehowa H.S.) has been chosen as the Spalding America East Conference Player of the Week in women's volleyball.

Gibbs, a junior outside hitter, averaged 7.0 kills per game in two matches last weekend, including Albany's first-ever America East victory. She totaled 27 kills and 11 digs in leading the Great Danes past Stony Brook for the first time in 17 meetings between the schools.

Gibbs followed with career-highs in kills (36) and service aces (6) against Hartford in a 3-2 loss. She ranks third in the conference in kills at 4.71 per game, and is averaging 2.23 digs.

UALBANY HOLDS POSITION IN LATEST I-AA FOOTBALL POLLS

Albany, N.Y. – UAlbany is ranked fourth in The Sports Network I-AA Mid-Major Top 10 Poll and eighth in the Football Gazette NCAA I-AA Mid-Major Top 20 Poll. Both national college football rankings were released on Monday, Oct. 29.

Albany (6-1, NEC 4-1) posted 24-14 Northeast Conference victory at St. Francis, Pa. last Saturday. Dayton (8-0) and Sacred Heart (7-0), two of five Division I-AA unbeaten teams, remain one-two in both polls.

The Great Danes travel to Monmouth (6-1, NEC 4-0) in a key conference match-up on Saturday, Nov. 3. Game time is 1:00 p.m. The Hawks are ranked sixth by Football Gazette and seventh by The Sports Network.

Loretto, Pa.—Brian Manigault and Jon George each rushed for one touchdown in the first half, as Albany posted a 24-14 Northeast Conference victory over St. Francis, Pa. on Saturday in snowy conditions at the Pine Bowl.

Albany (6-1, NEC 4-1) built a 21-0 lead early in the second quarter. Tight end **Greg Sigler** caught a nine-yard scoring pass from **Ryan Roeder** to complete a 13-play drive to open the scoring. Following a St. Francis fumble, Manigault, a senior tailback, reached paydirt on a 7-yard run for a 14-0 advantage.

George capped an 11-play march on his team's next possession with a one-yard run over left guard for a three-touchdown lead.

However, St. Francis (0-8, NEC 0-5) would get back into the contest. Freshman quarterback **Kevin McCray**, who passed for 173 yards and rushed for 42 more, threw a 5-yard touchdown pass to **Michael Hall** with 24 seconds left before halftime.

The Red Flash, who own Division I-AA's longest losing streak at 21 straight, closed the gap to 21-14 midway through the third period on McCray's six-yard option run.

St. Francis was driving for the tying touchdown early in the fourth quarter, but Albany linebacker **Tim Campe** wiped out the threat with an interception at the 18-yard line on a fourth down play.

The Great Danes regrouped with a 70-yard drive that took nearly eight minutes off the clock, and resulted in **Bryan Bagstad**'s 24-yard field goal. Roeder, who completed 9 of 12 passes for 122 yards, hit Jay McFarlane with a 3^{rd-} down, 17-yard pass to keep the sequence at midfield.

"I always worry when we are considered the favorite," said Albany coach Bob Ford, whose team played without leading receiver Chris Phillis (back spasms) and lost Manigault to a leg injury in the first half. "Their offensive line did a superb job of giving McCray the time he needed to make plays."

"We had too many penalties, some miscommunications, and were not focused," said split end Matt Crudo, who had three receptions for 43 yards and rushed for 37 on a reverse. "We need to practice well to get ready for the next two weeks."

Dieckfoss' 24:38.40 was the second-fastest time in the 14-year history of the men's championship. Freshman Andy Allstadt placed eighth overall and was the second Albany finisher in 25:19.10. Walton led the Albany women's squad to a fourth-place team showing by running the 5,000-meter course in 18:03.90. Rachel Felton of Boston University won the race with a time of 17:11.80 and guided her squad to the team title. The Terriers tallied five of the top six overall finishers in securing their sixth straight America East title and 11th in 12 years. Nicole Susser (Colonie Central H.S.), Meghan Howell, Megan Roeder and Zerlinda Martinez secured 23rd, 26th, 29th and 30th respectively for the Great Danes.

UALBANY LOSES GROUND IN NATIONAL FOOTBALL POLLS

Albany, N.Y. – UAlbany fell to fourth in The Sports Network I-AA Mid-Major Top 10 Poll and eighth in the Football Gazette NCAA I-AA Mid-Major Top 20 Poll. Both national college football rankings were released today.

Albany (5-1, NEC 3-1) lost to Sacred Heart, 32-17, last Saturday in a battle of unbeaten teams. The Pioneers climbed to second in both polls. Dayton, a 24-23 winner of Drake last week, is first in each national ranking.

The Great Danes, who travel to St. Francis, Pa. on Oct. 27, are ranked 15th nationally among the I-AA leaders in scoring defense at 17.0 points per game. Split end **Chris Phillis** (Saratoga Springs H.S.) is ranked 19th in receptions per game (5.83) and 24th in receiving yards (89.17 pg). Phillis, who tied a school record with his seventh career 100-yard receiving game last week, has 35 receptions for 535 yards and six touchdowns this season.

Albany, N.Y. – Senior quarterback **Justin Holtfreter** passed for 296 yards and two touchdowns to lead Sacred Heart to a 32-17 Northeast Conference victory over Albany in a battle of unbeaten teams on Saturday at University Field.

Albany (5-1, NEC 3-1) went 70 yards to paydirt on its first possession to take a 7-0 lead, as fullback **Charles Gill** capped the drive with a one-yard run. Senior tailback **Brian Manigault**, who rushed for a career-high 167 yards, keyed the scoring sequence.

Sacred Heart (6-0, NEC 5-0) rallied with 15 consecutive points to move ahead for good. Holtfreter, who completed 23 of 36 passes, threw a 30-yard touchdown pass to **DeVeren Johnson** to hand his club a 9-7 lead with 10:05 left in the second quarter.

Following an interception at midfield, Holtfreter directed the Pioneers on a 53-yard drive. **Marvin Royal**, a senior tailback, scored on a 4-yard run for 15-7 advantage after a two-point conversion pass failed. The Great Danes, who were playing their homecoming game, closed within five by the intermission on **Bryan Bagstad's** 37-yard field goal.

"I was surprised by the single coverage; I thought they would bracket me," said Johnson, a 6-foot-6, 223-pound wideout who upped his total to eight touchdown receptions this season. "You always want one-on-one coverage as a receiver. I played a good mental game today."

Albany, N.Y. – University at Albany's Chris Phillis (Saratoga Springs H.S.) has been chosen as the *Football Gazette* NCAA I-AA Mid-Major Offensive Player of the Week for his performance in last Saturday's 28-18 Northeast Conference victory over Stony Brook.
