COACHING STAFF



Dennis Short Head Coach

Dennis Short begins his fourth season at the helm of the UAlbany women's lacrosse program. Short, who was appointed on June 21, 2001, guided the Great Danes to a fourth-place league finish and a berth in the 2004 America East Conference Tournament. It marked UAlbany's second appearance in three years in the conference postseason.

Short has coached eight all-conference players, including three of the school's all-time scoring leaders. Five Great Danes have earned all-

rookie accolades under his guidance.

Short, who previously was an assistant at Ohio State University, is the first full-time coach in school history. He inherited a program that produced 76 victories over 10 seasons as a varsity sport.

Short coached both the offense and goalkeepers at Ohio State, and helped the program rise from the club level to Division I during his six-year tenure. The Buckeyes, who posted a combined 43-41 record in that period, were ranked among the nation's top 10 in scoring offense in 1999 and 2000. Members of the OSU team received All-America recognition for the third straight year in 2001.

A native of Chalfont, Pa., Short was an assistant at Ursinus College in Collegeville, Pa. from 1993-95. In his final season with the program, the nationally-ranked Bears reached the NCAA Division III quarterfinals.

Short, 33, is a past president of the United States Women's Lacrosse Association's Midwest District, and formerly served as the Midwest Region Division I chairperson on the Intercollegiate Women's Lacrosse Coaches Association's Growth Committee. In 1997, he coached the Midwest District squad at the USWLA National Tournament, and two years later was director of the U.S. Women's Division National Tournament.

Short received his B.A. in history with a minor in English from Ursinus in 1993, and has a secondary education teaching certificate in social studies from the state of Pennsylvania. As a collegian, he played midfield and attack for the Ursinus Lacrosse Club, leading the squad in goals and assists for two seasons. His wife, Chrissy, is UAlbany's head women's tennis coach.





Lindsey Hart Assistant Coach

Lindsey Hart begins her first season as an assistant coach at UAlbany.

Prior to her arrival in the Capital Region, Hart spent the 2004 season as an assistant at Ohio University. She has also coached lacrosse at Ohio University's camps along with the East West Sports and Next Level Lacrosse camps

Hart brings a wealth of playing experience to her position. As a fouryear member of Ohio's squad, she earned first-team All-American Lacrosse Conference honors twice and was named to the regional All-

America squad in 2001 and 2002. The most prolific offensive player in school history, Hart amassed 180 goals and 236 points during her career with the Bobcats.

Hart played on the Canadian National U-19 Women's Lacrosse Team that won a bronze medal at the World Cup in 1999. Additionally, she was a member of the 2001 Canadian National Women's Lacrosse team, and is preparing for the 2005 World Championships.

À native of Vineland, Ontario, Hart received a bachelor's degree in biology from Ohio in 2003.



Patrick Donohue Assistant Coach

Patrick Donohue starts his first season as an assistant coach with the Great Danes. Before his arrival at UAlbany, Donohue was the head coach for the inaugural season of the Stallions Boys' Lacrosse Club in Granville, Ohio.

Donohue coached at the East-West Lacrosse Camp in Colorado and the Four Star Lacrosse Camp.

A 2004 graduate of Ohio State University, Donohue played four years on the Buckeye attack. His team captured the 2003 Great Western Lacrosse League Championship and

earned a berth in the NCAA Tournament. He received his bachelor's degree in human ecology.

Donohue, a native of West Babylon, N.Y., is the older brother of current UAlbany women's lacrosse player Nikki Donohue.



Jen Fluck Assistant Coach

Jen Fluck, a standout women's lacrosse and field hockey player at East Stroudsburg University, joins the UAlbany coaching staff this season.

Prior to her arrival at UAlbany, Fluck helped introduce girls lacrosse to the Lancaster, Pa. area. She served as the head coach at Conestoga Valley High School and compiled a 54-15-2 record in five seasons.

Fluck, who played defensive wing for East Stroudburg's lacrosse squad, was a two-time first-team All-American and All-Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference honoree.

Fluck graduated with a bachelor's degree in health and physical education from East Stroudsburg in 1998. She currently plays for the Philadelphia Women's Indoor Field Hockey Team which is a member of the North American Premier League.









SEASON PREVIEW

Young is the first thing that comes to mind when UAlbany head coach **Dennis Short** looks at his roster that has 18 players listed as either freshmen or sophomores. The key to the upcoming season will be taking his young team and building the players' confidence level so they are ready to compete.

"We have to approach every game with that swagger," Short said. "They have to have the self confidence that they deserve to be on the field with every team we play. We need to develop a team identity and a sense of pride."

One of those youthful players who made an immediate impact as a freshman is starting goalkeeper **Jen Daly**. Daly, who was voted to the America East Conference All-Rookie Team, set a school record with 190 saves last season.

"Jen was great as a freshman," said Short, "but that was just scratching the surface as far as how much of an impact she can have on this team. She has made strides in the off-season to become a dominant goalie."

Sophomore **Barbara Czaplinski**, who started in goal for the UAlbany field hockey team, will be the team's second goalie.

Defensively for the Great Danes, junior All-America East honoree **Kristen Mathias** steps into a leadership role as one of the team's co-captains. Mathias started every game in 2004 and finished second on the squad with 17 caused turnovers.

"Kristen is our single best one-on-one defender," Short commented. "She has great technique and outstanding anticipation. The combination of her and Jen (Daly) will help control everyone else."

Joining Mathias will be **Domenica LoRe** and **Katelyn Primomo**. LoRe, who played on the attack as a freshman, earned a medical redshirt last season after suffering a knee injury early in the year. Now projected as a starting defender, LoRe also is important to the offensive transition game. Primomo, a sophomore transfer from Niagara, is a strong takeaway defender.

Junior **Michelle Michalenko** started 11 games last season and will see time on defense. "Michelle is an extremely intelligent defender," Short added. "She communicates very well and will challenge for a starting position."

Freshmen Kristin Cioffi, Angela Moyer and Teresa Strano will compete for playing time with the defensive unit.

Sarah Spillett, Nikki Donohue and Krissy Rajczak are pro-

jected to start on the Great Dane attack. Spillett, a member of the conference's all-rookie team last season, finished third on the team with 28 points (19 goals, 9 assists).

"Sarah is one of the best pure attackers I have ever worked with," Short said. "She can go right- or left-handed. She can create for her teammates or finish a shot. She also poses matchup problems because of her size."

Donohue, who is serving as co-captain for her junior year, scored 27 points on 15 goals and 12 assists last sea-

son. She possesses great vision that allows her to be a playmaker, and is known as the quarterback of the offense. Rajczak started 12 games as a freshman and tallied 16 goals and 10 assists. Short describes her as a triple-threat player, who can create off the dodge and get in position to receive the ball.

Senior **Ashley Heilmann** will also rotate in on the attack after moving over from the defensive side of the field. Heilmann started all 17 games last season and corralled 25 ground balls.

A host of newcomers may also figure into the offensive scheme, including **Stacey Brown** and **Mel Brasor**. Brown, who scored 17 goals as a high school senior, helped her team to the 2004 New York State Final Four Championship. Brasor, an All-Suffolk County honorable mention selection, played on the Rocky Point team that won the Suffolk County title. Freshman **Jane Bush**, who is recovering from a knee injury suffered in the fall, will factor into the attack.

All-America East selection **Kate Fontana** is expected to be one of the keys to the midfield after a 2004 season that saw her set a freshman scoring record with 53 points (39 goals, 14 assists). Fontana also has a strong defensive presence as she led the conference in caused turnovers (2.29 pg) and ranked second in ground balls (3.82 pg).

Sophomore **Kim Reny** is another dynamic player at midfield. She tallied 10 goals and three assists and started in 13 games as a freshman. Short will look to Fontana and Reny to help control the middle third of the field.

"Defensively, you want to keep people out," Short added. "Offensively, you want to attack down the middle. You need to dominate the center of the field to win games."

Freshman **Brittany Scott** is another projected starter at midfield after showing good skills in fall practice. Scott scored 17 goals and guided her team to a No. 12 ranking as a high school senior. Junior **Courtney Hill** is one of the team's top offensive threats after scoring 17 goals as a sophomore.

Sophomore **Caitlin Navor** and junior **Erin Fitzmartin** are defensive midfielders that will join the unit. Navor played in all 17 games last season and collected 24 ground balls. Fitzmartin joined the lacrosse team right before the 2004 season and is expected to play a more prominent role for the Great Danes this year.

Rounding out the midfield corps are freshmen **Jackie Davren** and **Katie DeJoseph**, an honorable mention high school All-American







AMERICA EAST CONFERENCE

The Tradition

America East Conference enters its 17th year of all-sports championship competition with a reputation as one of the most comprehensive NCAA Division I conferences. With a geographic footprint extending from the Mid-Atlantic to the Northeast regions, America East remains committed to broad-based, competitive Division I athletics programs, complementing the academic integrity of the 10 member institutions. University at Albany, Binghamton University, Boston University, University of Hartford, University of Maine, University of Maryland, Baltimore County (UMBC), University of New Hampshire, Northeastern University, Stony Brook University, and University of Vermont each offers a unique blend of academic and athletic tradition. America East also has an associate membership with Quinnipiac University in the sport of men's lacrosse.

Athletic Success

America East's proven record of success in its sports will enable the conference to earn admission to 12 NCAA Championships in 2004-05. Student-athletes in the sports of baseball, men's basketball, women's basketball, field hockey, men's lacrosse, women's lacrosse, men's soccer, women's soccer, softball, men's tennis, women's tennis, and volley-ball receive access to NCAA Championships via the conference's automatic qualifiers. Individual champions at the America East Outdoor Track and Field Championship will receive bids to that NCAA Championship. In addition, several America East athletes in sports such as men's and women's cross country, men's and women's indoor track and field, men's and women's golf, and men's and women's swimming and diving will compete in those NCAA Championships. Overall, America East sponsors championships in 22 sports.

Academic Accolades

America East institutions saw nine of their student-athletes earn Academic All-America honors in 2003-04 alone. This total ranked fifth-highest among all Division I-AA and I-AAA conferences. Included in the group were first-team selections Lana Khvalina of the UMBC women's tennis team, who was named for the second-straight year, and Alon Lubezky of the Hartford men's soccer team, the school's career goal scoring leader. America East annually recognizes its student-athletes' success in the classroom. All varsity team members who compile a grade-point average between 3.0 and 3.49 during their playing season receive conference recognition by being named to the Academic Honor Roll. Those outstanding student-athletes who compile a grade-point average of 3.5 or higher are named to the Commissioner's Honor Roll. Nearly 1,700 student-athletes received honor roll recognition in 2003-04 with America East's 3,500 student-athletes averaging a 2.97 grade-point average. Additionally, the conference annually determines the top scholar-athlete in each of its championship sports. The scholar-athlete must maintain a minimum 3.2 cumulative grade-point average and be a starter or prominent reserve on the team for the duration of the playing season.
