who do you help/ advocate for?

Who else do you advocate for?

/Parents

Who ultimately is going to dictate what you can and can not do?

School Administration/ System

Let's do a little power analysis. (start drawing clocks) who has the most power?
Who has the least
Who's the middle person?

What happens if you do something the administration doesn't like? (you get fired)
Who are you accountable to? (admin).

This is the clock of accountablity. and this is the 11th hour power analysis

Accountability - a justification, analysis or explanation for an action

Account - to furnish ...' '

Arcaic definition: to bring about capture, death or destruction of something

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Why are you accountable to the admin.? (admin has more power)

What is power?

POWER: Ability to determine and enforce social outcomes for oneself and others either directly through control of resources and other means of coercion, or indirectly through proximity, access, and influence.

Who has the power on the wheel of oppression?

oppression: systematic idiological and subjugation and domination of one group in society by another.

Enforcement:

What's the # of individuals in Stud/Par. grp vs. the admin. Grp.?

What happens when a large grp realizes its trapped in a small space?

Look out for that 2nd def. of Account.

CHANGING THE POWERE DYNAMIC

Look at role as Advocate:

(One) one that pleads the cause of another.

(two) one that defends, supports or maintains a cause or proposal.

Def #1 is dynamic between admin. an guid. couns.

Def. #2 is what we strive for.

What we want is to be accountable to students and parents.

How do we determine what their needs are?

OR

Who ultimetly should determine the needs of students/ parents?

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What tools do we have to change this dynamic and the structure?

Receptive:

(one) open and responsive to ideas and impressions or suggestions.

ie. trusting an understanding anothers cultural and historical perspective.

(two) Able or inclined to recieve.

ie. You are all able however if you are not inclined you'll perpetuate the cycle

Influence: to have an effect on the condition or development; to affect or alter by indirect or **intangible** means

Empower: to give official authority or legal power
