Wrestling: Three Albany wrestlers won titles at the Empire Athletic Association Championships over the weekend. Van Fronhofer (Salem H.S.) won by fall over Cortland State's Josh Roe at 4:11 in the 142-pound championship bout. Anthony Camisa dec. Ithaca's Chris Pierce at 167, and Randy Shaw pinned Ithaca's Ben Weiland at 3:26 in the 177 classification.

All three UA wrestlers qualified for the NCAA Division III championships on March 3-4 at Augustana College in Rock Island, Illinois. Fronhofer, who returned to school this semester after training at the U.S. Olympic Center in Colorado, is making his third NCAA appearance. He lost in the 142 semifinals to national champion Frank Croce (Kean, N.J.) in 1991, and also qualified in 1993. Camisa and Shaw are in the NCAA Tournament for the second straight year. Camisa lost in the first round to Central lowa's Chad Jensen, 3-1, at 158, while Shaw was bounced, 7-5, by 167 national champion Chris Ricklic, of Case Western Reserve. UNIVERSITY AT ALBANY EARNS BID TO 1995 NCAA TOURNAMENT Great Danes Make Second Consecutive Appearance

ALBANY, N.Y. -- The University at Albany men's basketball team has earned a berth in the 1995 NCAA Division III Basketball Tournament. The 64-team was announced on Sunday evening.

Albany (17-7) is seeded fifth in the East Region, and will play at No. 4 seed St. John Fisher (16-9) in the first round on Thursday, March 2. Game time will be announced on Monday. St. John Fisher, which has won 10 of its last 11 starts, defeated the Great Danes, 89-82, on its home floor on February 21.

The Albany-St. John Fisher winner will take on the survivor of the Rochester Institute of Technology-Geneseo State first-round contest. R.I.T. (21-4) is the East Region's No. 1 seed, while Geneseo (18-7) is the eighth seed.

Albany is making its 11th appearance in the NCAA Tournament. The Great Danes, which have made the tourney four times in the 1990's, reached the NCAA's Elite Eight last year before losing to New York University, 67-65, in the East Sectional final.

The Great Danes secured their place in the tournament with a 62-50 victory over Stony Brook in their final regular-season contest. Albany posted a 12-3 record since mid-January in making its run to the national tournament.
