There are no additional costs. Both courses, EPSY 522 and EPSY 524, are presently offered in the School of Education. The proposed change is simply to switch which of these courses already being offered will fulfill the human growth and development coursework requirement.

Present human growth and development requirement: EPSY 522 Adolescent Development Proposed change to meet the requirement: EPSY 524 Lifespan Human Development

This proposed change is to expand the number of states in which the program's curriculum will meet licensure requirements. New York State licensure requirements state that the area of human growth and development needs to be covered within the curriculum. Specific coursework is not defined in the New York State licensure requirements, and this requirement has previously been met by EPSY 522. However, other states require coursework that covers human lifespan development, which EPSY 524 meets. Note, EPSY 524 still fulfills the licensure requirements of New York State, and simply expands on the already covered area of human growth and development.

All other present coursework will remain the same.
