The Executive Committee met pursuant to

The Minutes of the last Meeting were read & approved.

W Tompkins reported that the use of Van
Vechten Hall had been obtained for the
approaching Public Exercise, for the sum
of fifteen dollars, which was approved.

Recommendations were read in
favour of the following persons, to be
appointed Principals of the Normal
School.

For John H. Stoddard, a graduate of the
School & now President of the College at
Bethany (Pennsylvania) from
Edmond Hazen, Hon. Jas C. Curtis, late State
Senator, John D. Watkins of Liberty Sullivan
County, George A Dudley of Ellenville, Ulster Co.,
Charles Edward Lester of New York, Jr H. Van
Wageningen, Hon. Jas H. Bush of Sullivan Co. &
others.

For George Spencer of Ulster from the
Hon. Joshua C. Spencer and others
W. S. W. Robertson of Troy also

applied for a place in the School.
For G. W. Minn of Lewisburg, a
recommendation from Saml G. C. Swezey
a graduate of 1830.

The names of W. Woodworth of Cortland
Academy & of the Rev. Dr. Baynard R
Hall of Chertough Academy, were also
mentioned.

All the above were directed to lie on the table.

The Secy. presented a communication from Mr Amos M. Kellogg, accepting his appointment & he further reported that Mr Kellogg had entered on the duties of his office on the 24th of May 1852.

A letter from Silas J. Bowen, in which he resigned his situation at the conclusion of the Academic year was read & on motion, said resignation was directed to lie on the table.

On motion D Hamley & D Bech were appointed a Committee to examine the Library, Apparatus & other property of the School, & they were also authorized to purchase the book-cases of Mr Perkins, now in the building, should they consider the same advisable.
