UALBANY DROPS RUBBER MATCH OF THREE-GAME SET WITH BOSTON U.

Albany, N.Y. – **Cassidi Hardy** carried a perfect game into the seventh inning as she led Boston University past UAlbany, 4-1, in the rubber match of a three-game America East Conference softball series on Sunday afternoon at Albany Field.

Boston U. (25-25, AE 10-8) took a 1-0 lead in the third inning when UAlbany starter Casey Halloran (Columbia) hit Brooke Hudson with one out. After advancing to second on a sacrifice bunt, Hudson scored on a Tyler Benson single to center field. The Terriers would push out to a 2-0 advantage in the fourth frame when Liz Alley doubled to bring around Brandi Shields, who reached on a walk and stole second base.

The Terriers plated two more runs in the top of the seventh for a 4-0 lead, when the team strung together three hits during a two-out rally. With Hudson aboard at first, **Shayne Lotito** tripled to right field. Lotito, who leads the team with a .360 batting average, then scored on a single by Benson.

Hardy silenced the bats of UAlbany (29-9-1, AE 10-5) through six innings before **Maegan Larsen** belted a home run to lead off the bottom of the seventh. Larsen's team-leading seventh round-tripper of the season sailed over the left-field fence to break up the perfect game in one swing.

Halloran, who hurled three complete games in the weekend series, fell to 22-6 on the season. She struck out five in the loss, including her 182nd of year to become UAlbany's single-season strikeout leader. The junior surpassed **Andee Lindgren**, who struck out 179 batters in 2004. UALBANY SEEDED THIRD FOR AMERICA EAST MEN'S LACROSSE TOURNAMENT

Boston, Mass. – University of Maryland, Baltimore County (UMBC) has earned the top seed for this week's America East Conference Men's Lacrosse Championship. The Retrievers, who are ranked No. 13 nationally, won the regular-season title and will host the entire postseason tournament.

UAlbany (7-6, AE 3-2) is seeded third and will meet No. 2 Stony Brook (8-6, 4-1) in the semifinal round on Friday, May 5 at UMBC Stadium Complex. Game time is 5:00 p.m. UMBC (8-4, 5-0) faces Binghamton (7-6, 2-3) in the second semifinal at 8:00 p.m. The championship is scheduled for Sunday, May 7 at 12 noon. The America East champion receives an automatic berth in the NCAA field.

The Great Danes have captured three consecutive America East tournament championships. UAlbany upended Stony Brook in last year's title contest, plus defeated Binghamton (2004) and Hartford (2003) in the previous championships.

Frank Resetarits, one of the top scorers in the nation with 40 goals and 17 assists, leads a UAlbany attack that is ranked seventh nationally at 11.69 goals per game. Merrick Thomson (Albany Academy) has 27 goals and 11 assists. A junior attackman, Thomson is fifth on the school's all-time scoring list with 171 points. Goalkeeper Brett Queener (.561 save percentage) is the key figure on an improving defensive unit.

MEN'S LACROSSE UPENDS BINGHAMTON, 20-9, IN FINAL REGULAR-SEASON GAME

Albany, N.Y. – Frank Resetarits scored five goals and Merrick Thomson added four in leading UAlbany to a 20-9 America East Conference win over Binghamton in the regular-season finale for both teams on Saturday evening at John Fallon Field. The Great Danes earned the No. 3 seed for next week's America East postseason tournament with the victory. UAlbany meets Stony Brook in the semifinal round.

Binghamton (7-7, AE 2-3) jumped out to a 3-0 lead with just four minutes elapsed in the contest. Jake Boyce scored off the opening face-off before Rob Williams converted an underhanded shot. Nate Kerstein completed that outburst when he connected from the left side in a manadvantage situation.

UAlbany (7-6, AE 3-2) regrouped by connecting on nine of its next 14 shots to take a 9-3 halftime lead. Resetarits, a junior who added a three assists for a career-high eight points, drew his team even at three apiece when he scored from the top of the crease with 1:53 left in the first quarter.

The Great Danes, who were coming off a 14-13 overtime loss to nationally-ranked Syracuse eight days ago, dominated the second period with six unanswered goals. Jim Stankard's man-up goal put his team on top for good. Matthew Green and Jordan Levine then scored nine seconds apart for a 6-3 advantage. Resetarits netted a shot in transition after Levine dodged two defenders to finish off that run with 2:49 left before the intermission.

Thomson, a junior attacker, fueled a four-goal stretch that pushed the margin to 13-3 in the opening five minutes of the third period. In that string of goals, goalkeeper Brett Queener carried the ball on a fastbreak that ended with Resetarits setting up Thomson in stride. Thomson finished off another crossing pass from Resetarits before Levine followed 14 seconds later after gaining possession on the subsequent face-off.

"We are starting to peak at the right time," said Resetarits, who like Martocchia reached the 150-mark for his career during the game. "We've gone through a lot of adversity this year. By taking Syracuse to overtime and winning tonight, we have the ability to beat anyone if we stick together.

Levine, a sophomore midfielder, also had a career-high in points with three goals and two assists. Senior Chris Martocchia, who was making his final home appearance, scored twice for the Great Danes, who tied a season-high in goals scored.

Williams finished with two goals and one assist for the Bearcats, who had beaten two top-20 opponents this season. Kevin Joy and Jeff Santucci added two goals apiece.

"We are hitting our stride at tournament time," UAlbany coach Scott Marr offered. "This is a great way to go into the postseason. We have a couple of seniors that want to go out as winners." -agate-

UALBANY WOMEN'S 4x800 RELAY BREAKS RECORD AT PENN RELAYS

Philadelphia, Pa. – University at Albany's **Jenna Ortman** ran a personal-best split in the first leg of the women's 4x800-meter relay which set a school record in 8:53.49. The Great Danes shattered the previous mark by nearly 14 seconds in finishing 14th in the event at the 112th Penn Relays, held Saturday at Franklin Field.

Ortman, who opened with a 2:11.0 split, teamed with her twin sister **Jessica**, plus twin sisters **Adanna** and **Anisha Andrews**. Adanna covered the second leg in 2:13.7, while Anisha followed with a personal-best 2:17.1 split. Jessica Ortman added an anchor-leg split of 2:11.2. The foursome, who became the first two sets of twins to comprise a relay at the Penn Relays, also established a school record in the distance medley relay on Thursday.

The UAlbany men's 4x400 relay, which ran a school record 3:10.50 on Friday, turned in a fourth-place showing in the IC4A 4x400 competition on Saturday. The relay ran 3:10.80, the second-fastest performance in school history, despite losing leadoff runner **Jerry Wilson** to a hamstring injury. **Junior Burnett** and **Stephen Evans** led off in the first two legs, while freshman **Joe Belokopitsky**, who took Wilson's place in the relay, ran the third leg. **Joe Greene** anchored the relay for the second straight day in 46.5 seconds.

Marc Pallozzi (Lansingburgh) finished sixth in the championship men's javelin throw. Pallozzi, who owns UAlbany's record in the event, was the first Great Dane accepted into the championship division at Penn Relays. The junior hurled the javelin 210-feet, 10-inches to meet the NCAA Regional qualifying mark for the third time this season.

Freddie Wills also recorded a top-ten finish, turning in an eighth-place showing in the men's triple jump. The freshman jumped 46-feet, 10-inches, posting one of his top performances as a collegian.

ALYSSA LOTMORE BREAKS SCHOOL RECORD IN TOP-TEN FINISH AT PENN RELAYS

Philadelphia, Pa. – University at Albany's **Alyssa Lotmore** (Bishop Maginn) finished ninth and broke her own school record in the 5,000-meter run, competing in the women's championship race at the 112th Penn Relays, held at Franklin Field. Lotmore qualified for the NCAA East Regional with the performance.

Lotmore, a junior, posted a personal-best time of 16:46.68. She eclipsed her previous UAlbany standard by more than five seconds. Auburn's **Angela Homan** captured the women's 5,000m title, crossing the line in 16:11.02.

In the men's competition, **Joe Greene** anchored the men's 4x400-meter relay to a school-record time of 3:10.50 to finish in fourth place. Greene's 46.4-second split helped his team shave nearly two seconds off the previous mark. **Jerry Wilson**, **Junior Burnett** and **Stephan Evans** were also members of this IC4A-qualifying relay.

In addition, Greene ran one of the top five 400m-hurdles times in school history. Greene, a freshman, covered the event in a personal-best 51.87 seconds, only 27-hundredths of a second behind the school record set in 1990 by Wilfredo Rodriguez. Greene, who met the NCAA Regional qualifying standard for the second time this season, finished 12th overall in the event.

Burnett, who was the first Great Dane accepted into the championship 100m dash, crossed the line in a personal-best 10.71 seconds. Burnett posted a 15th-place overall showing in the event's preliminary round and finished just three-hundredths of a second shy of the UAlbany standard.

The men's shuttle hurdle team raced to a fifth-place finish in 1:00.41. Senior **Jesse Bennett** led off with a 14.7-second split in helping UAlbany to a time that is only two seconds off school-record pace. Freshmen **Jean Juste**, **Anthony Assent** and **Nick Assini** joined Bennett on the relay.

The Ortman and Andrews twins, who set a school record in the women's distance medley relay on Thursday, will team up in the 4x800m relay at 1:40 p.m. on Saturday, as UAlbany concludes its action at the Penn Relays on Saturday. -agate-

Albany, N.Y. - Casey Halloran (Columbia) established the UAlbany career wins record as she pitched her way past Vermont, 4-1, in the opening game of a doubleheader in America East Conference softball on Wednesday, April 26 at Archie Post Field. An insurance run was added in the seventh as Leslie Busch, who finished 3-for-3 at the plate, led off with a riple. Shortstop Maegan Larsen followed with a single to center field to plate Busch and provide her club with a two-run advantage.

UAlbany starter Laura Gremillion allowed two runs in the fifth inning to allow Vermont to tie the game at three apiece. Halloran then came on in relief by not allowing a hit over 2.1 innings of work. She improved to 21-4 on the mound to set another school mark. Halloran set the record for single-season victories, breaking a standard that was first put on the books in 1986.

Boston, Mass. – **Jessica Ortman** was named the America East Conference Women's Co-Track Athlete of the Week, as announced by the conference office on Tuesday afternoon. **Ritshell Verdier** and **Freddie Wills** were honored as the women's and men's field athlete of the week, respectively.

Ortman, who is being honored by the conference for the third straight week she has competed, set a school record in the 3,000m steeplechase at the UAlbany Spring Classic last weekend.
