At this the first meeting since the dis-  
ease of Mr. Austin the following resolution  
was unanimously adopted.

Resolved that it is with unfeigned sorrow  
we are called to record the death of the  
Hon. Charles L. Austin the senior member  
of this committee, in whose death the school  
has lost a warm & devoted friend, and the  
committee a discreet and wise associate  
and that we will ever cherish his memory  
in grateful remembrance.

It was ordered that the Secretary  
communicate a copy of this resolution to  
the family of the deceased.

The Chairman stated that he had received  
the resignations of Miss. Eastman and  
Miss. Ripley teachers in the school, and that  
the matter of supplying the vacancies thus oc-  
curring was the special business on which  
the committee was convened. After exten-  
ded conversation on the subject it was resolved  
that Miss. Kate Stowman be appointed  
in place of Miss. Ripley. The resignation  
of Miss. Eastman was laid on the table  
and the Chairman was requested to ascertain  
from her whether an increase of salary  
would induce her to withdraw it.

The Secretary stated that he had received
