Dear Mr. McNulty:

Thank you for your letter of Nov. 17. Unfortunately I have no complete copy of the Mss and especially of the footnotes, so that I have to wait until you send back to me an edited copy of the Mss to make the few needed insertions in the footnotes. However, my Christmas vacation starts on Dec. 19 and I shall be able to return the Mss within 48 hours if I could have it between Dec. 19 and Jan. 5.

I enclose the original text of the stray dog chapter. I think the marked passages from page 2 to the top of page 7 could be made into a footnote; but, of course you might want to shorten them. I think they should be inserted in as a footnote in the chapter Courts and the Public and the footnote might appear appropriately after the first sentence with introductory remark somewhat as follows: "the pitfalls lurking in ready judicial response to popular promptings might best be illustrated in the following story".

Could you also be nice enough to add the following note as a footnote to the title:
"This article constitutes a chapter of a forthcoming book on Politics and the Administration of Justice. The support of the Rockefeller Foundation for this study is gratefully acknowledged."

As to the Loewenstein review, did I not see it already reviewed (since I wrote to you) in the last issue of 57/58? I don't suppose you would want to bring a second review?.

I hope you won't have too many headaches with the Mss please be free to cut down the dog footnote drastically, reading it over it occurred to me that it might seem a bit overdone.
