Albany 52, Stonehill 0

Albany, N.Y. -- Quarterbacks Eric Williams and Michael Oliva each threw one touchdown pass, and Troy Rhett returned a punt 54 yards for another score to lead Albany to a 52-0 Eastern Football Conference victory over Stonehill on Hall of Fame Day at University Field.

Albany (7-1, EFC 5-1) scored 21 consecutive points during a four-minute stretch of the first quarter to take command. Fullback James Miner capped a 56-yard drive with a one-yard run over left guard for a 7-0 lead. After a short punt gave the Great Danes good field position, Williams hit split end Dimy Cedor with a 32-yard touchdown pass. Rhett, a senior cornerback, completed the scoring spree, when he raced 54 yards to paydirt on a punt return for a 21-0 advantage with 5:20 remaining in the period.

Rhett set up Albany's fourth touchdown in the second period with a 43-yard interception return to the Stonehill 19. Five plays later, Oliva tossed a 4-yard scoring pass to flanker Greg Butryn.

Albany's reserves accounted for the game's final 24 points, as the Danes posted their highest point total at home since 1986. Mike Browne, a junior fullback, scored on a 32-yard scamper midway through the third quarter. In the fourth stanza, Deron Regev booted a 22-yard field goal, and tailback Brian Manigault and quarterback Marcus Rotondi reached the end zone on runs of 5 and 42 yards, respectively.

The Great Dane defense, which has kept the opposition's offense off the scoreboard for 10 straight quarters, limited Stonehill to 136 total yards, forced four turnovers, and recorded five quarterback sacks. Sophomore John Darak completed 11-of-31 attempts for 72 yards, and was intercepted three times. Running back Tyrone Jefferson had 70 yards on 20 carries for Stonehill (2-6, EFC 2-5).

Albany, a winner in 18 of its last 19 contests, finished with 349 yards in total offense. Williams hit on 8-of-13 passes for 142 yards, while Oliva connected on all four of his attempts for 43 more.

Albany moved one step closer to a showdown with Southern Connecticut State for the EFC's Atlantic Division title. If the Great Danes beat Pace at home next weekend, the two teams will play for the divisional crown on Nov. 14.



Albany, N.Y. -- Eric Williams passed for 168 yards and one touchdown, and defensive tackle Scotty DeBellis scored on a 37-yard fumble return to lead Albany to a 35-0 Eastern Football Conference victory over winless Massachusetts-Lowell on Homecoming at University Field.

Albany (6-1, EFC 4-1) struggled through the first quarter, and survived two missed field goals by Charlie MacInnis before getting its offense in gear. Williams, who connected on 10-of-18 passes, rolled to his right off play-action, and fired a 12-yard touchdown pass to tight end Steve Checksfield with 9:23 left in the second period. The 80-yard march was highlighted by a 52-yard completion from Williams to Checksfield.

The Great Danes took a 13-0 halftime lead, when running back Ben Kelcey reached paydirt on a 7-yard run to cap a 69-yard drive. Deron Regev's point-after attempt was blocked.

In the third quarter, Albany used a 10-play drive to increase its advantage to 21-0. Junior tailback Greg Garrett, who ran 10 times for 86 yards, scored his first rushing TD this season on a 14-yard jaunt through the middle. Garrett then caught a two-point conversion pass from Williams.

The Danes' defense got involved in the scoring on Mass.-Lowell's next series, when defensive end Matt Caliandro drilled quarterback Scot Ruggles in the UML backfield on an option play. DeBellis, a junior, picked up the fumbled ball, and raced 37 yards down the right sideline for a 28-0 lead with 1:21 left in the stanza.

Albany's last TD was set up by a fumbled punt return. Reserve quarterback Michael Oliva hooked up with flanker Greg Butryn on a 30-yard scoring pass with 8:52 remaining in the contest.

"It was a win, but I was not happy," said Albany coach Bob Ford, whose team was penalized 14 times for 126 yards. "We showed poor discipline, and did not establish ourselves as an offensive football team. I was impressed with the way Lowell battled us throughout the game."

Freshman running back Eddie Torrico rushed 30 times for 198 yards to lead Mass.-Lowell (0-7, EFC 0-4). However, the River Hawks lost three fumbles, and their two quarterbacks were sacked on five occasions. Ruggles finished 5-of-12 through the air for 56 yards.

Albany, which has won 17 of its last 18 contests, and is off to a 6-1 start for the third consecutive season, moved into a virtual tie for first place in the EFC's Atlantic Division standings with Southern Connecticut State (6-1, EFC 5-1) and C.W. Post (5-2, EFC 4-1). Southern Conn. defeated Stonehill, 49-7, while C.W. Post was upset by Pace, 14-13, this afternoon.

Albany, N.Y. -- Andrea Viger (Granville Central H.S.) won the women's individual title, while Brendan Howell's third-place finish helped Albany capture its second consecutive men's crown at the New England Collegiate Conference championships on Saturday at the University at Albany's campus course.

Viger, a junior who placed fourth and tenth in her previous two NECC championship appearances, covered the 5,000-meter course in 18:52.2, and was more than seven seconds better than Southern Connecticut State's Lauren Saul (18:59.7). Southern Conn. State repeated as the women's champion with four runners in the top 10, while Albany was fourth.

"My training peaked at the right time," said Viger, whose twin sister, Erica, placed 33rd overall. "From the start, I was thinking this was my race. When I got to the two-mile mark, I felt good and was able to push to the finish."

James Johnson, who was ninth in last year's NECC championship, surprised the 152-runner field in the men's competition. He was timed in 24:59.9 over 8,000 meters to easily beat teammate Virgel Hammonds for individual honors. However, the Great Danes claimed the team title by grabbing the next four places. Brendan Howell took third in 25:36.8, while Jamie Rodriguez was fourth ahead of last year's winner Ben Wright (Averill Park H.S.). Albany finished with 30 points, while runner-up Mass.-Lowell scored 36.

Three Albany runners, from local high schools, were among the top-25 finishers. Todd Weiss (Shaker) was 12th, while Guilderland's Rob Naughter and Andy Rickert were 16th and 21st, respectively.

Albany Hosts NECC Cross Country Championships

The University at Albany will host the New England Collegiate Conference men's and women's cross country championships on Saturday morning as part of the University's Homecoming and Family Weekend.

The women's 5,000-meter competition begins at 10:45, while the men's 8,000-meter event follows at 11:30. NECC schools include Albany, Binghamton, Bridgeport, Franklin Pierce, Massachusetts-Lowell, New Hampshire College, New Haven, Sacred Heart, Southern Connecticut State and Stony Brook.

Ben Wright, a junior from Averill Park, N.Y., led the Great Danes to the men's title in 1997 with a first-place finish in 25:38. Mass.-Lowell's Brad Klinedinst, a runner-up to Wright last year, is also scheduled to compete.

Southern Connecticut State captured the 1997 NECC women's championship, and is led by defending individual titleist Sara Titus. Albany's Andrea Viger (Granville Central) placed fourth in last year's meet.

UNIVERSITY AT ALBANY ENSHRINES FOUR INTO ATHLETIC HALL OF FAME

ALBANY, N.Y. -- The University at Albany will enshrine four former athletes into its Athletic Hall of Fame on Saturday, October 31 at the 15th annual HOF Brunch and Induction Ceremony. The event will be held at 10:30 a.m. in the Recreation and Convocation Center (RACC) Athletic Hall of Fame Room on campus. Albany's football game with Stonehill follows at 1:00 p.m.

The new inductees and their sports: **Nick Ascienzo** '73, baseball; **Frank Sarcone** '88, football; **Frank Selca** '79, soccer; and **David Theleman** '86, baseball.

With this year's class, there are 78 former athletes, coaches, and administrators who have been inducted into the University's Hall of Fame.

Nick Ascienzo (1969-73) -- One of the top pitchers in the Albany baseball program's history, Ascienzo earned All-SUNY Athletic Conference and All-Capital District recognition.

In 1972, Ascienzo posted a 4-0 record with a 0.84 earned run average, and was named to the All-SUNYAC team. His spring included three shutouts, and a stretch of 23 consecutive scoreless innings. He also recorded a 0.58 ERA in 31 innings on the mound in 1971, and was 3-3 with a 3.12 ERA as a freshman.

Ascienzo, who played baseball for four years, and was a two-time captain, overcame adversity during his career when he suffered an arm injury prior to his senior season. He became an all-conference first baseman, and batted .300 in leading the Great Danes to the 1973 SUNYAC title.

A native of Kingston, N.Y. (Kingston H.S.), Ascienzo was a defender on the Albany soccer team as a freshman and sophomore, and was the school's freshman athlete of the year in 1969-70. He received a B.A. in mathematics education, and won the Adna W. Risley Award.

Ascienzo is a math instructor at Red Hook (N.Y.) High School, where he has been the head girls' softball coach since 1989. He serves as treasurer of the local New York State Teachers Association, and also operates an International Dairy Queen franchise. A resident of Lake Katrine, Ascienzo currently serves as co-chair of the Mid-Hudson Athletic League high school softball association.

Frank Sarcone (1984-87) -- An intelligent, toughnosed inside linebacker from the mid-1980s, Sarcone is the school's all-time tackles leader.

During his Albany career, Sarcone recorded 344 tackles, 14.5 hits for losses, four sacks, recovered five fumbles, forced five fumbles, broke up six passes and had three interceptions.

As a sophomore, Sarcone led the Great Danes to the ECAC-North Division III crown and a 9-2 record. He had 13 tackles in his team's come-from-behind 33-21 victory against Plymouth State in the championship. Sarcone led an Albany defense which shut out three opponents during a season-ending five-game win streak.

Sarcone, a team captain on two occasions, was selected the 1986 team MVP when he posted 118 tackles and two interceptions. As the program's most valuable defender in 1987, he totaled a career-best 131 tackles, and had 20 hits in three different games against Hofstra, Norwich and St. Lawrence.

Sarcone, who attended Susan Wagner High School in Staten Island, N.Y., received his B.A. in economics from the University in 1988. A resident of Cos Cob, Conn., Sarcone is married to the former Kerra Anthony, and they have one daughter, Dakota Ryley.

Frank Selca (1974-77) -- An all-state and all-conference player, Selca was a key figure in the Albany soccer program's resurgence during the 1970s. The Great Danes, who posted four consecutive winning seasons and a combined 32 victories during Selca's career, reached the NCAA Division III tournament in 1975, and qualified for the ECAC tournament the following year.

A native of Ulcinj, Yugoslavia, Selca was selected to the All-New York State team as a sophomore and senior, and earned All-SUNY Athletic Conference and honorable mention All-America honors in his final two seasons.

Selca established the school's single-season scoring record with 19 goals and 10 assists in 1975. 

UNIVERSITY AT ALBANY APPOINTS BOB FORD INTERIM DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS

ALBANY, N.Y. -- **Dr. Robert Ford**, head football coach for nearly three decades, has been chosen the University at Albany's Interim Director of Athletics as announced today by Vice President for Student Affairs James P. Doellefeld. Ford takes over for Dr. Milton E. Richards, who tendered his resignation on October 9. He will manage the Department of Athletics and Recreation until a national search for a director of athletics has been completed.

Ford, who is in his 26th varsity season as Albany's head football coach, and resurrected the program in 1970 at the club level, is no stranger to the role of athletics director. He served in that position for five years, beginning in 1977, and administrated a program which sponsored 25 varsity sports for men and women.

"I am delighted Coach Ford has accepted the interim position," Doellefeld said. "As a citizen of the University, he has stepped forward to provide leadership for the intercollegiate athletics program during this transition period. Dr. Ford is highly regarded by his peers as a future president of the American Football Coaches Association. In addition, Dr. Gail Cummings-Danson will remain the department's senior women's administrator, as one aspect of her interim assistant vice president for student affairs portfolio. The University has a vision of excellence in athletics, and remains fully committed to its NCAA Division I upgrade. We hope to have a director of athletics in place by Labor Day 1999."

"We will advance our Division I direction during this transition," Ford said. "Our athletic administrators, coaches and student-athletes have a common purpose, and we will work together to further Albany's athletics tradition."

Ford, 61, was appointed as head football coach on April 27, 1970, and directed the program through three club seasons prior to the first varsity campaign in the fall of 1973. He currently has a 153-100 record as the Great Dane mentor, and his 162 career victories ranks among the top 10 active NCAA Division II head coaches. In 1997, Ford led Albany to the Eastern Football Conference championship, an EFC Atlantic Division title, and an 11-1 record. For his efforts, he was named the *Football Gazette* Division II non-scholarship national Coach of the Year. Ford was also voted the top coach in the EFC and GTE Region I. He is a member of the AFCA's Board of Trustees as third vice-president, and is secretary of the National Football Foundation & College Hall of Fame's Capital District Chapter.

Ford has a doctorate and a B.S. in physical education from Springfield College, and earned his master's degree in educational administration from St. Lawrence University.

UNIVERSITY AT ALBANY DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS MILT RICHARDS ANNOUNCES HIS RESIGNATION

ALBANY, N.Y. -- Dr. Milton E. Richards tendered his resignation today, effective immediately, as the University at Albany's director of athletics and recreation. The announcement was made by Vice President for Student Affairs James P. Doellefeld.

Dr. Richards, who has served in the director's position since July 1993, and has been instrumental in the athletic program's restructuring during this decade, cited an important personal matter as his reason.

"We thank Milt for his vision and energy during the University's transition from Division III to II, and next year to Division I," Doellefeld said. "He will stay with the University in the short term, and will work on special projects with regard to athletics marketing and development. The University remains fully committed to excellence in athletics, the move to Division I in 1999-2000, and the current development of a strong recreation program."

"Dr. Gail Cummings-Danson, interim assistant vice president for student affairs, will have responsibility for athletics while the matter of an interim athletics director is under advisement," Doellefeld added. A national search for a director of athletics will commence shortly.

Richards, 40, worked in Division I athletics for 11 years at Kansas State University and Temple University prior to accepting his position at Albany. In May 1994, he was instrumental in the move to the NCAA Division II level from Division III, and was able to gain membership into the New England Collegiate Conference for the 1995-96 academic year. He also found a home for the football team in the Eastern Football Conference, and for field hockey and football, as Division I programs, in the Northeast Conference in 1999. Richards, whose leadership was a key factor in the May 1997 announcement to upgrade Albany's 19-sport intercollegiate program for men and women to Division I, also aided the University's efforts to bring the New York Giants football training camp to campus.
