HE PROVIDED A COPY TO THE ALBANY DIVISION AND IT WILL BE MAINTAINED IN ALBANY'S FILES. SELFRIDGE READILY ADMITTED THAT TO DATE, THERE HAS BEEN NO THREATS OF VIOLENCE OR OF DEMONSTRATIONS DIRECTED TO HIM IN ALBANY CONCERNING THE TOUR OF THE ABOVE TEAM. HE STATED HE WOULD IMMEDIATELY ADVISE THE ALBANY OFFICE SHOULD HE RECEIVE SUCH A THREAT. HE ALSO ADVISED THAT HE HAS BEEN IN PERSONAL CONTACT WITH CHIEF OF POLICE BURKE OF THE ALBANY POLICE DEPARTMENT AND MAYOR ERASTUS CORNING'S OFFICE CONCERNING THIS MATTER. A REVIEW OF THE ABOVE ORGANIZATIONS NOTE THAT MOST APPEARED TO BE LEGITIMATE CIVIL RIGHTS OR CHURCH ORGANIZATIONS. HOWEVER, SUCH ORGANIZATIONS AS THE COMMUNIST WORKER'S PARTY AND THE REVOLUTIONARY SOCIALISTS LEAGUE ARE MENTIONED.

BLOCK NO. 1 The following information was received from Agent James ROSE of the FBI. This information comes from a Highly Confidential Source and it should be treated as a strictly on a need to know basis in order to protect the source and prevent over reaction to the information. According to the source, from one coalition of organizations who are a part of SART, several hundred demonstrators will be travelling to the City of Albany on 5 or 6 busses and that members of the Progressive Labor Party (PLP) and the International Committee Against Racism (ICAR) have the avowed purpose of stopping the game from taking place. The members of the Communist Workers Party (CWP) which has about 50 members coming from New York has claimed that they will attempt to stop the game even if it means using physical force. The tactics employed by the CWP will be to get its members into the stadium with the crowd and to smuggle in sticks etc. prior to the game. According to the source there is also an inner more elite group within the CWP who normally act as bodyguards for party officials and who will attempt to gain entry to the game and sit with the spectators. This group will be armed and according to the source, they will use firearms against any members of law enforcement who use firearms against the persons taking over the field. These CWP members with firearms also will, according to the source, use firearms against any members of the KKK.

FOR DEMONSTRATION SCHEDULED FOR
SEPTEMBER 22, 1981

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BLEEKER STADIUM (INSIDE)

All days off are cancelled. Officers assigned to the Day Tour in the various commands will assume regular policing duties until ordered otherwise or until relieved.

Officers assigned to the demonstration will report to their respective commands at 12 Noon with one exception and that is as follows: members of the Neighborhood Units who will be in Blue Uniform will report to Division One. The Uniform of the Day, weather permitting, for officers assigned to the demonstration will be uniform long-sleeve shirt without tie, issue helmet (no uniform hats will be worn) and nightsticks. Bullet-proof vests (worn under shirt) will be mandatory, and no shields will be worn. Helmets will display appropriate rank insignia and shield number.

Chief of Police, Thomas H. Burke is Commanding Officer. Deputy Chief William VanAmburgh is the Officer in Charge at the scene (Swinburne Park and Bleeker Stadium). Captain John Lynch will be Officer in Charge of a detail outside the stadium, consisting of one Lieutenant, four Sergeants and forty Police Officers.

Captain William Dollard will be Officer in Charge of a detail inside Bleeker Stadium, consisting of one Lieutenant, four Sergeants and forty Police Officers.

These details will be split into squads each under the immediate command of a Sergeant, who in turn deliver any orders from the Captain or Lieutenant. Officers are not to initiate any action without orders from a superior.

Captain George Houting will coordinate all traffic activities, barricades, tow trucks, closing streets, etc..

Captain Joseph Dean will be assigned to a black and white unit and will be in overall command of all routine police activities in the City.

Detective/Lieutenant Edmund Flint will assume command of the Detective Office.

Riot Gear, such as shotguns, gas, long batons, etc., will be available and will be issued if and when needed.

Specific assignments follow for individual officers and men. Commanding Officers are to ensure that all personnel are aware of their respective assignments.

All radio activity for the demonstration will be conducted on Frequency One. All normal police activities, on Frequency Two. Every radio at the scene will be issued a Unit Number and be called and acknowledge as such. There will be no designation such as "mobile" or "portable". Each unit will be called and respond as an individual number.

There will be two patrol wagons assigned with three men each. A Chauffer, Police Officer and Identification man. The Officer assigned to each patrol wagon will have "Informations" available and will fill same out if necessary. In the event of an arrest the Identification man assigned to the wagons will photograph the Arresting Officer and prisoner and prisoners will then be conveyed to Traffic Division, booked and then conveyed to Police Court which will be sitting.

A Command Post will be established at Traffic Division consisting of a Communications Officer, Prisoner/Booking Officer, Personnel Officer. All of the above will be Supervisors with Officers assigned and their actual duties are outlined further on. Three Observation posts will be utilized at 400 Central Avenue, Engine-7, 2nd floor, and a private home on 2nd Street. The primary purpose of these OP's is to observe activities of the demonstrators and furnish information to the C.O. and O.I.C. One post, 400 Central Avenue, will have special weapons, rifle with scope etc., assigned. All posts will be manned by one supervisor and two Officers.

There will be two mobile Firearms Response Teams consisting of three Officers and a Supervisor, armed with a rifle and two shotguns will be in reserve and be solely responsible for weapons calls.

Members of the N.E.U. will mingle with the demonstrators for observation and intelligence purposes.

Two Detective Units will ride the perimeters of the scene for observation and intelligence purposes.

Reserve force, based at Traffic Division will be split up into two Riot Squads under a Squad Leader, and Assistant Squad Leader, both Supervisors.

There will be three mobile Emergency Response Manpower Pools (Units) consisting of seven men and a Sergeant to each unit with a total of twenty-four men. These Units will be available for use to respond to major calls in the demonstration area, or to backup the force on patrol in case of a severe disturbance elsewhere in the City. They will also be able to augment, on foot, at the site of the demonstration as needed in this report.

For special purposes Units assigned to the A.H.N.P.U. are to be kept two man. One A.H.N.P.U. Reserve Unit, on F.Q. 1 will patrol the area from North Lake Avenue to Ontario Street for observation and intelligence to keep the C.O. and O.I.C. informed of crowd activities.

Deputy Chief Reid will be in a mobile unit available to coordinate activities with the Commanding Officer and O.I.C. and will also be available to respond to the scene of any major call on the perimeters of the demonstration area.

First aid and medical care will be coordinated with the Albany Fire Department and hospitals within the City.

All buses, after passengers have disembarked at Capitol, will be escorted to Commerce Park by Traffic Division detail under the command of Captain George Houting. Buses will ten (10) minutes prior to the conclusion of the Rugby Game be escorted by the same detail to the Stadium area. Exact area to be announced.

PRESS

This Department has received a number of requests from the news media concerning parking arrangements for legitimate, authorized members of the press. As a result, the following arrangements have been made to accommodate their parking needs: Parking spaces will be available for the aforementioned on Clinton Avenue between Ontario Street and the access road to Swinburne Park (both North and South sides).

A Press Liaison officer will be named, and assigned to work out of the Headquarters Classroom. This officer will be kept informed of all activities as soon as possible, situation permitting. Designated individuals only will submit information to the Press Liaison Officer.



area to coordinate the violent activity planned by the
Communist Workers Party and was armed with both fire arms
and other weaponry. On September 21, 1981, said John Spear-
man was apprehended by members of the Albany Police Depa t-
ment while driving a stolen automobile. At the time of his
arrest, Spearman had in his possession a loaded .38 handgun.
At the time of that apprehension, a second individual, also
in the car with Spearman, jumped from the car and escaped.
On that same day, a search warrant was secured by members
of the Albany Police Department for the vehicle occupied

by Spearman and, in the trunk of said vehicle were found two (2) home made night sticks with black electrical tape wrapped around them. The apartment described above is believed to have a view or access to a view overlooking Bleeker Stadium. This source indicated that other members of the Communist Workers Party accompanied Spearman to the Albany area and were also armed and intended to engage in violent activities to disrupt the rugby game and to engage in violence against the Albany Police Department. These members were identified as Michael Young and William Robinson. At approximately 10:30 p.m. the Albany Police Department received a call from one Clara Sattelfield, the head of the Albany NAACP, who indicated that the above named individuals had been in attendance at a meeting attended by that organization to coordinate peaceful protest activity and had disrupted it to the extent that she requested police protection from these individuals as her life had been threatened by them

The source of this information is known by members of this Department to be reliable and information given by this informant in the past has resulted in arrests and convictions. In addition the information given by this informant with respect to Spearman has been corroborated by MAXIM his apprehension and his possession, at that time, of the weaponry specified.




